

> THE WHEAT CROP, The table given below, giving the yield of the United States, is based on some 2,000 reports as to the condition and outturn of wheat in the pilincipal cereal-growing States of the United States. These returns point to an increased yield over that of 1881 of 20 per cent., due to the increase of acreage and the improved yield. Last year the yield of wheat in the Southern States was reported at 40,000,000 bushels. This year it is 48,500,000 hushels. In Illimois, the quality of wheat is much better than the average, and has seldom, if ever, graded more uniformly high throughout Illinois. crop was saved in good condition and either threshed or stacked immediately after har vest. The wheat acreage of Onio, the light of the Western States in geographical order does not differ materially from the area sown last year. On an increased acreage the wheat fields of Michigan promised most abundant results up to July it, when rain of almost unexampled severity set in. A considerable portion of the wheat in the wo lower tier of counties was yet in shock. Indiana, although not the first, continues to be a great wheat-producing State. The returns as to acreage show some reduction as compared with last year. Wisconsin reports are generally favorable, and point to a large yield per acre. Returns from Minneapolis from week to week, which have been fairly complete, indicate an unusually large yield of wheat per acre in Minnesota and Dakota. But for a loss in-acreage, the yield in Minnesota would be still further ahead of previous years. 




