



COST OF THE STAR-BOUTE TRIALS A Washington special to the New York Sun says: The published figures representing the cost of the star-route trials to a certain extent are misleading. To Mr. Bliss \$19,251,60 has been paid. Mr. Bliss has worked between fifteen and eighteen months. Probably \$50,000 would not be above his pay for that period, not including expenses. Nor would this be excessive, for that gentleman has given his whole time to the government. Considering that to a great extent he has abandoned his practice at home, \$3,000 a month or \$100 a day-which is the understood rate of his pay—would not make him whole. The corn crop in all regions south of Pennsylvania and the Ohio river is in a high condition; in every state except West Virginia represented by 100 or higher figures. In many districts of the south the crop is reported the best in twenty years. In the New England states there has been a very sharp decline except in Vermont-from 81 to 75 in Matine, 95 to 62 in New Hampshire. 87 to 60 in Massachusetts, 93 to 70 in Rhode Island, and from 98 to 65 in Connecticut. A decline of 8 points in New York and New Jersey and 4 in Pennsylvania is indicated. The loss in all these states is due to drought, which has been especially severe in New England. There has been abundant rain in all the other states. In the corn-growing states of the Ohio valley the prospects average very nearly as at the last report. The general average of the condition is 83, the same as in August. Last year there was a decline from 77 in August to 60 in September. In 1880 the September average was 91. If early frosts do not injure the crop the product will be material ly larger than last year, but the heavy production of 1879 and 1880 can not be ap proached under the most favorable circum-

The oats crop when harvested was in unusually high condition, yielding heavily in thrashing. The general average was 100, very few states falling below that figure. states and harvested in good condition vania, 86; Maryland, 92; Virginia, 93; Ken

A'cable message from London, dated Sept 11, is as follows: The reported improve ment in European crops is confirmed. The wheat crop in Germany is better than expected. France has a full average. The price of wheat is instantly falling everywhere. Vienna claims that the world's wheat grop is above the average. The average condition of potatoes in August is 101. It has fallen in September to 92. Last year the decline during August was from 92 to 50 and continued in greater ratio fill harvest. The prospect is now favorable for a crop of not less than 150,000,000 bushels from the present outlook. The decline has been leaviest in New England and New York. The prospects are improved in Maryland and Virginia; well maintained in the Ohio valley and lake region, and not materially changed west of the Mississippi. Only Wis-consin and Kansas of the Western states fail to show averages of 100 or higher. -
