prise in the court-room. IMMIGRATION FOR AUGUST. During the month of August there arrived in the customs districts of Baltimore Boston, Detroit, Huron, Minnesota, New Orleans, New York, Passamaquoddy, Philadelphia, and San Francisco, 52,593 passengers-of whom 48,076 were immigrants, 7, 17 citizens of the United States returned from abroad, and 2,470 allens not intending to remain in the United States. Of this total number of immigrants, there arrived from England and Wales 6,977; Ireland, 3, 343; Scotland, 1,212; Austria, 758; Belgium, 30; Bohemia, 236; Denmark, 840; France, 517; Germany, 16,010; Hungary, 321; Italy. 676; Netherlands, 340; Norway, 2,052; Russia, 836; Poland 152; Sweden, 2,601; Switzerland, 837, Dominion of Canada, 4,441 and from all other countries, 437.

THE PUBLIC PRINTING. The public printer has delivered the first complete sets of the bound edition of the Congressional Record, including the index. The volumes of the debates make/1,69pages and the index 734 pages, being by far the largest number of pages reached in a single session. The volumes are delivered this year over two months sooner than was ever done before, it generally being from three to four months after adjournment of congress before they were feady. An order has been given Public Printer Rounds for 2,500,000 register-cards for the use of the postoffice department. To fill this order it will require about 104,167 sheets of card-board, which, after being cut to the proper size, if strung end to end alone, would cover 158 miles, or nearly the distance between Washington and Trenton

THE NEW GOLD CERTIFICATES. In anticipation of a very heavy demand for the new gold certificates, the Treasury is printing \$200,000,000 as the first install tion within a very few days. The notes are a trifle larger than the legal-tender notes and not dissimilar in general appear ance, except that the tinting of some of the esters is in gold. The \$20 notes (the smallstassued) have an excellent vignette of the late Resident Garfield: the \$50 notes, one of Sila Wright; the \$100 notes, a vignette of Thomas H. Benton; the \$500 notes, that of President, Lincoln; the \$1,000 note, of Alexander Hamilton; the \$5,000 note, of James Madison, and the \$10,000 note of Thomas Jefferson. There are freesury of-ficials who believe agat the gold certificates will in a short time basing their belief upon the steoposition that the notes will circulate around in lieu of the coin itself, and reasoning othus, they say that the notes will be in such a demand that a large amount of legal tender notes will be turned into the Treasury in exchange for gold. Which will at once be given up for the gold certificates. This will, it is thought, result in reducing the amount of gold held as a reserve for legal tender notes below one hundred millions, when under the law the issuance of gold certificates must cease. THE INDIAN POLICE.

In explanation of his order for the disarmament of the Indian police, Secretary Teller states that the rifles will not be taken from all of them at once or at any particular time, but as fast as it can be done conveniently they will be allowed to carry revolvers; but as these can not be furnished till congress makes appropriation therefor, there will be an interval during which some and probably all of the police will have no weapons. The secretary says that Indian police have no more need of guns than the citizens of Washington have. though he admits that many of the Indians on the reservations are well armed. He doesn't think any Indians are to be trusted with guns, and as fast as it can be done the rifles will be taken away. Except in the case of the captured hostiles, the indians will be indemnified for the rifles they surrender. The immediate occasion for this order relative to the Indian police is that they have been in the habit of selling ammunition and rifley to other Indians, and reporting that they were lost. The value of the rifles is deducted from their pay, but he ammunition is a clear steal. By this process the Indian police are providing others with arms and ammunition, and no more will be issued, and the rifles in possession of the police will be taken up as fast as possible. The secretary has small faith in the loyalty of any Indians, though he says the police have behaved pretty well. except in regard to arms. The police are only employed in preserving order on reservations, and are not enlisted for fixed periods. They enter and leave the service at will, which is an additional reason for not arming them too well. Commissioner Price says that only in the case of one man have the Indian police ever proved disloyal The agents have found them very valuable. and, as nearly all the other Indians are armed with the best breech-loading rifles the police will be at a disadvantage even with revolvers, and especially with no arms

MELVILLE'S RECEPTION.

Chief Engineer Melville, with his companions, had a public reception here on Saturday. Crowds lined the streets. The meeting between the engineer and Danenhower is thus described: Lieutenant Danenhower was the first to discover Melville and he quickly quit his companions and almost ran toward Melville. He paused when a few steps away as if staggered by the sight before him and then ran forward and shook the hand of the engineer. The latter returned the greeting with some degree of warmth and a shade passed over his face. Danenhower then greeted Ninderman and Noros. Another very interesting incident of the occasion is thus narrated: On reaching Twelfth street a Chinaman dressed in the garb of an American rushed out toward Melville's carriage. It was Ton Sing, the Chinese stewart of the Jeannette. stood up in the carriage and reached out his hand over the wheel to the happy Celestial, who was then hailed by Ninderman driver's box, though he had a narrow escape from injury by getting his foot catthet in the wheel of the moving carriage, and rode with his former companions.
