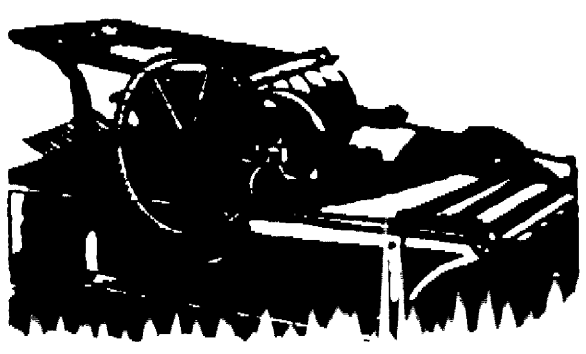

Mr. Horr Misleads His Audience.

We don't know whether Mr. Horr is ignorant of the facts, or whether he wishes to conceal them, but any man familiar with the emigration statistics of the country knows that out of every ten emigrants that come to this country nine of them are from the protective countries of Europe and only one-tenth from free trade England. Out of all the emigrants that have come to this country since 1820, nine-tenths are from other countries than England, and only one-tenth are from free trade England.

If the condition of the English laborer is such that the high wages of this country are an inducement to come, why is it that more emigrants do not come from England and less from protected France and Germany? This emigration argument is one of the stock in trade of protection speakers. There is not one more easily overturned by reference to emigration statistics.

Laborers do not come from free trade England, but hundreds of thousands come from protected Germany and from oppressed Ireland.
