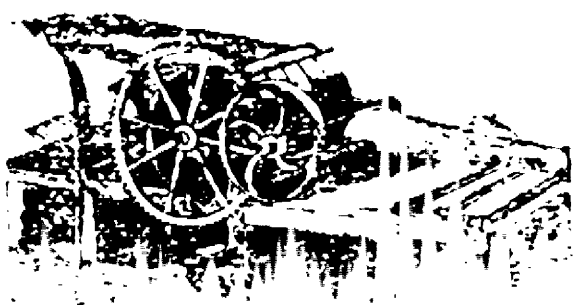

He built one of the first steamboat engines ever built in Michigan and also built the first steam sawmill engine made in the state. He is also believed to have built the first sawmill in the Saginaw valley. He was a relative of Messrs. A. L. & B. O. Williams, of this city.

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WASH. NEWS

Washington, D. C., Dec. 21.—The House of Representatives today passed a bill to amend the act of March 3, 1879, relating to the collection of duties on goods imported from foreign countries.

The bill was introduced by Mr. [Name] and passed by a vote of 215 yeas to 190 nays.

The bill provides that the duties on goods imported from foreign countries shall be collected in accordance with the provisions of the act of March 3, 1879, as amended.
