Fires, of course, wilse from other causes than those we have stated. Smokers burn up much valuable property which is not in the shape of cigars. Bunches of oiled rags of the most inanimate nature in themselves still perform the most wonderful feats in the destruction of property. Tramps, with their old pipes, will creep into barns and hay mows, and servants will be careless in thousands of ways, but if every person who owns property will give the subject attention, and see that those around him are posted, and see that reasonable rules are always obeyed, many thousands of dollars could be saved annually which are now burned out of existence.

Names of Ocean Steamships.

There is another place where I got a forcible view of England upon the water, and that was in the columns of the leading London dailies which were devoted to advertisements of the myriad of lines of sailing and steamship packets, that with London, Liverpool, etc., for a base, were making ready to move across all seas, in search of all leading ports of the globe. I was struck by the significance of the names of the lines of great ocean steamers, for the ingenuity that had been displayed by their owners in selecting titles for their lines and for their individual boats, revealing at once something of the extent and number of England's lines and steamers. There were advertisements of national lines, where the world had been exhausted to find names of nations; for the ships of that line; clan lines, where the names of all the clans of Scotland were written upon its vessels:# hall lines, where the list of the stately halls of England was fast being approprinted, from Chatsworth down, and continental lines which had an apparent copyright upon the names of the different countries of Europe; city lines, with ships called after the greatest cities of the world, from Rome to New York, and so on indefinitely, as my reader may see for himself by simply reading London and Liverpool steamship advertisements in English papers. —Cor. Boston Commercial Bulletin.
