LIVING IN MOSCOW.

With Details on Tea-Drinking Mania.

It would be a very incomplete sketch of Moscow that did not treat of the "traktirs" or tea-houses. They abound in every street, lane and alley, rivaling in their numbers the public houses of Western lands. The drinking of "techa" is, indeed, a prominent feature of Russian life. Every one has heard of the precious packages of tea, the best that the Flowery Land can produce, brought across the steppes of Tartary and through the passes of the Ural Mountains to the great fair of Nishni-Novgorod. Enter a traktir at what hour of the day you please, it always seems crowded. A corpulent little saint, with smiling countenance, who is supposed specially to preside over tea-drinking, is perched in one corner. The Russians, as they enter, uncover their heads and bow to this patron of "the cup that cheers but not inebriates."

Profusely perspiring, and, indeed, completely saturated with tea, the habitués talk over and settle matters of business or pleasure, strike bargains or balance accounts. Merchants, brokers and bankers confer and transact business, pleasure seekers arrange their plans, estranged friends make up their quarrels over the steaming tumbler. Who can doubt that tea drinking in Moscow is a great national institution? One of the chief houses of call for merchants in Moscow is the Moskouski Traktir. This is no ordinary establishment. Tall, robust servants, in white trousers and tunics, move to and fro, and assiduously wait upon the guests. The cooking at this establishment is celebrated, but it is for tea drinking that it is chiefly frequented. If you have no one to talk to you can smoke a pipe or cigarette, or listen to the organ. At almost all the restaurants, however humble, music is supplied.

The organ at the Moskouski Traktir was made at Wurtemburg expressly for this establishment, and cost \$3,000. It plays when it is wound up, and is limited to just twenty tunes, so that those who frequent this traktir year after year must find a little sameness in the performance. But, after all, it is in the tea-gardens and similar suburban resorts that the most pleasing scenes of Russian tea-drinking are witnessed. "Beneath the trees, in every direction, happy family groups surround the burnished urn, and in retired nooks the teapots are witnesses to lovers' vows. Petroski Gardens are a very favorite resort. In 1812 Napoleon lodged here for a time in the chateau built by the Empress Elizabeth. The road from Moscow is thronged with carriages and droskies and well-dressed pedestrians.

Guards and police keep order at the gates that admit to the varied attractions within—the promenades and lawns and copses, the rustic cottages, the lake, the fountain and the marble statues. In the evening, avenues of many colored lights and festooned arches conduct to pagodas used as theaters for various entertainments—comic dramas, in which the fun is somewhat broad and grotesque, exhibitions of tumbling and so forth. Grand displays of fireworks terminate the proceedings. The ordinary town peasant usually affects a red shirt and high boots. The moujik, fresh from the country, is mostly clad in a coat of undyed homespun cloth, and in lieu of stockings he winds cloth around his legs. His feet are shod with sandals of oiled lined bark. The lower classes in Moscow are, for the most part, smiling and good-natured, but slow slouching and shabby in their appearance.

They are also very frequently drunk, for, though fond of "techa," they by no means confine themselves to it. In addition to Sundays, there are no less than fifty clearly-defined annual holidays in Moscow, and the holiday-makers are usually incapable all next day. A Russian nurse is a conspicuous object in the public street. If her infant charge is a boy, she is attired in blue; if a girl, in red. Should she be in the service of some rich family, her dress is lavishly trimmed with gold, above which hangs an apron of fine dotted muslin. There is plenty of broad made in Moscow that is black—indeed, good sweet bread is a specialty of the city, and is often sent as a present to friends in St. Petersburg. The water is brought twelve miles in water-courses from the Mytischki springs to the public fountains, but is very seldom laid on to private houses. Accordingly, to supply domestic needs a tribe of water-carriers are out at early dawn. The water-carriers are only one among many classes of itinerant vendors and workers.

A funeral in Moscow, when conducted, as is usually the case, by the orthodox national manner, is a picturesque and interesting spectacle. The procession is headed by long bearded priests in their black robes, carrying shrines and burning tapers in their hands. Next comes the hearse with four horses. On the steps of the hearse are more priests holding images of the Saviour over the coffin. Yet more follow, speaking words of consolation to the friends and relatives of the departed. As the procession moves on, the people in the streets cease from their occupations, uncover their heads, bow and pray for the repose of the deceased. The countless pigeons of Moscow are a feature of the city which ought not to remain unnoticed. They enjoy life freely, and increase and multiply to an enormous extent, for no one thinks of killing them. In the popular mind they are inauspicious emblems of the Holy Spirit.

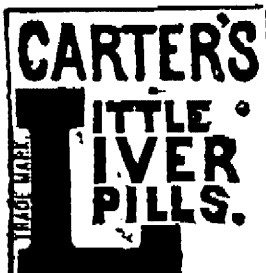

WASHINGTON.

Commissioner Evans states that the final of congress to appropriate the money for the improvement of the Gulf of Mexico will be taken in the next session of congress. It is not probable that the plan will be approved by congress.

Senator Allison, chairman of the senate appropriation committee, says that under no condition will the senate fix a time for adjournment until all the appropriation bills are signed. He does not think there is any possibility that the business before congress will be completed before July 15.

George W. Roosevelt, United States Consul at Bordeaux, while witnessing a balloon ascension near that city Monday in company with his wife was fired upon by a French soldier. The bullet passed through Mr. Roosevelt's hat and scratched him on the head. The soldier with two companions, escaped. It is thought that he mistook Mr. Roosevelt for a superior officer against whom he had a private grudge.

The house committee on public lands has directed a favorable report on the bill appropriating \$250,000 to reimburse persons who settled upon or purchased lands within the grant made to the Northern Kansas railroad company and to whom patents for such lands were issued but against whose right the land decisions were rendered by the United States courts on account of the priority of the grant to the railroad company. The bill provides that the reimbursement shall be at the rate of \$3.50 per acre.

A metallic bomb with fuse attachment and bearing evidence of containing dynamite was stopped in the mails here a few days ago. It had appended to it a letter addressed to O'Donovan Rossa, New York. The bomb was sent to the postoffice department and created considerable consternation among the clerks there. It was first sent to the inspector's office, but he refused to receive it. The chief clerk alarmed at its appearance, had it sent to the war department where some expert gunners succeeded in opening it. It was found to contain sawdust.

Secretary Frelinghuysen has informed Congressmen Curtis, of the house committee on foreign affairs, that he will present to that body in confidence correspondence showing the necessity for the item of \$230,000 recommended to be added to the regular and diplomatic appropriation bill. The money, it is generally understood, is required to insure the control of the United States over the proposed waterways across the isthmus of Panama along the Nicaragua route. Capt. Eads, of jetty fame, is opposing the appropriation, and accuses those who are advocating it of personal dishonesty.

ADJUSTING DIRECT TAXES.
Secretary Folger has sent to the house, with his approval, an opinion given by Controller Lawrence as to the equitable method of adjusting the matter of payments for direct taxes by a part of the states. He recommends that the sums paid by any of the states be refunded to these states, and that those which have heretofore failed to pay be relieved from the obligation. In cases where property has been sold by the government to meet these taxes, that the sums realized at such sales be refunded to the former owners of the property. The secretary adds a similar recommendation in regard to the partial distribution of the surplus revenue under the act of 1890. This money was to remain with the states subject to call. The secretary recommends that the sums heretofore paid to the states under this act be formally passed to their possession, and that those states which did not receive the sum to which they were entitled upon the passage of that act be now paid to them.

FRELINGHUYSEN'S SCHEME.

The house appropriations committee held a meeting Friday at which Secretary Frelinghuysen explained his scheme regarding the Nicaragua Canal. It is, in brief, to buy from the present owners of the Nicaragua Canal the concession of their rights and obtain the renewal of the same by treaty. It is understood that the De Lesseps people are watching for the expiration of the Nicaragua concession in October next, for the purpose of cobbling it up, preventing the United States or any private company getting in and constructing a canal. It is alleged here that they have already captured the Eads scheme by some means, and if they can scoop in the Nicaragua they will thus control the canal business of the isthmus. Charles Colne, the American secretary of the De Lesseps company here, is watching the movement of the committee closely. He has been hearing Mr. Frelinghuysen's statement, agreed to recommend to the house to send the matter to a conference committee, and that the committee would advise upon appropriation as made by the senate, and thus probably be able to push it through the house without discussion.

DESERTIONS FROM THE ARMY.

The senate placed provision in the army appropriation bill which, if permitted to go into effect, will go far toward removing the principal cause of desertion. The amendment provides that enlisted men detailed for extra duty as mechanics, clerks, laborers, or teamsters shall be paid for extra duty at the rate of 50 cents per day for mechanics, clerks, and school-teachers, and 35 cents per day for laborers and teamsters. This pay is in addition to pay proper as soldiers. It is now the custom in the army to order enlisted men to perform mechanical, clerical, and farm labor at frontier posts and allow no additional compensation for labor thus imposed, and the result has been discontent and numerous desertions. Recently an order was forwarded to a frontier post to have enlisted men cut 400 cords of wood during the present summer, and within two weeks from the receipt of the order at the post thirty-five men deserted. The object of the new law is to prevent this policy of forcing soldiers to perform labor not contemplated by the terms of their enlistment, and the imposition has been necessary because congress has uniformly refused for several years past to make appropriations for furnishing proper supplies. The senate amendment appropriates \$250,000 to pay for such extra work in the future, and if it is retained in the bill there will be less desertion hereafter from the ranks of the army.
