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WASHINGTON.

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A bill of printers in Washington has attracted national attention by publishing the names of congressmen in packages of one hundred at government rates. Yet the house committee on labor has reported in favor of increasing wages in the government office 20 per cent.

The Iowa legislature commenced impeachment proceedings against Andrew Brown, but the court took an adjournment to May 10. The accused reported himself as having been bankrupted by his official troubles and was allowed to employ three attorneys at the cost of the state.

President Cleveland has nominated John C. Bailey for postmaster at Cincinnati, and Mrs. Virginia C. Thompson for a similar position at Louisville. He also named as government directors of the United States Pacific Mail Steamship Company, and James W. Savage, of Omaha.

Miss Helen Hull entered suit at Detroit, Mich., Friday against her sister, the wife of the Rev. Mr. Spier, for \$50,000 damages, alleging that two years ago, when Mrs. Spier was the spouse of the deceased, millionaire Mabley, she beat, choked, and attempted to kill her.

The sons of the late William H. Vanderbilt have given \$25,000 to the College of Physicians and Surgeons in New York to build and equip a building to be used exclusively for clinics. The building will cost \$150,000. It will be known as the Vanderbilt clinic, in honor of their father.

A watchman and a policeman fired several shots at John B. Murphy, foreman of the St. Paul yards, at Milwaukee, Thursday night, mistaking him for a burglar. One bullet lodged in a note-book in Mr. Murphy's breast-pocket and another found a resting place on the buckle of one of his suspenders.

The grand jury at New York has brought indictments for the first time against fourteen members of the board of aldermen of 1881 in connection with the granting of the Broadway railroad charter. All the accused were arrested Monday by the police and locked up at headquarters. Recorder Smyth fixed their bail at \$25,000 each.

While experiments were being made at the iron works of Singer, Nimick & Co., in Pittsburgh, Pa., Saturday, the mold containing over 1,000 pounds of molten steel suddenly gave way, scattering the metal in every direction. Fifty spectators were standing near, and many of them were severely burned. Five are supposed to be dangerously injured. The damage to the mill was slight.

At the cathedral in Madrid, Sunday morning, while the bishop was ascending the steps, he was shot three times by a priest whose motive was revenge for being dismissed. The bishop was taken to a private chamber, where last sacraments were administered. The assassin was only saved from lynching by vigorous efforts of the guardmen, who conveyed him to prison in a carriage.

The St. Lawrence river rose at Montreal Sunday to a far greater height than ever known before. The greater part of the wholesale and manufacturing sections of the city are inundated to a depth of from three to eight feet deep, boats and rafts being utilized to get in or out of houses in the western half of the city. Thousands of operatives who are deprived of work and shut up in their houses will have to be provided for by the city authorities until the floods subside and business is resumed. The loss to the citizens will be immense.

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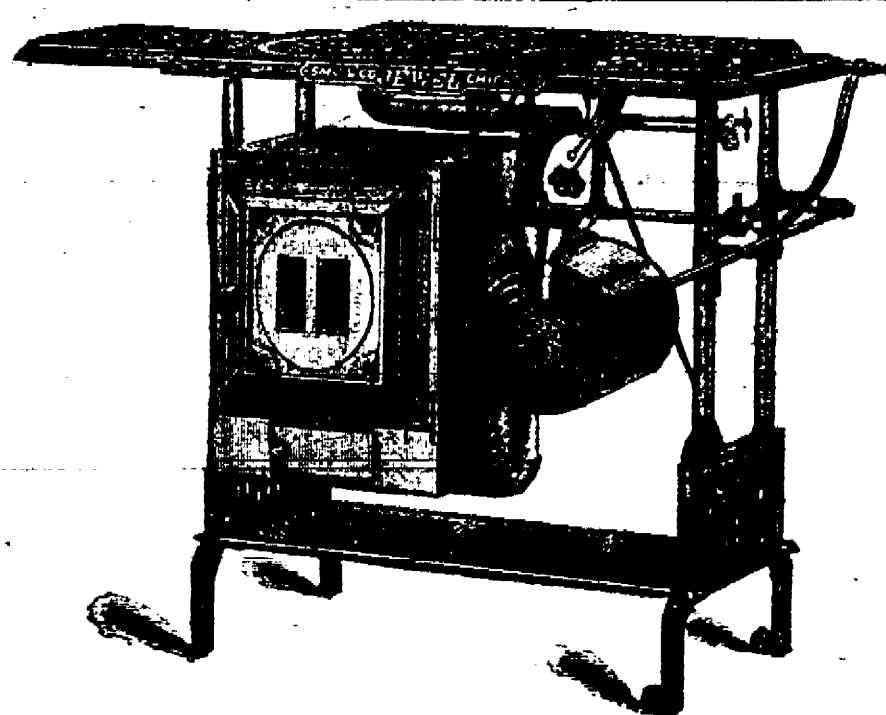
