THORE'S CONTEST. Gen. J. Hale Sypher, attorney for Geo. H. Thobe, contestant against Hon. G. Carlisle for a seat in the fiftieth ongress, has filed sixty copies of his brief with the clerk of the bouse, as required by law. The brief asserts that Thobe was elected by 600 majority. Miss Freeman occupied the position of President pro tem for one year, and so remarkable was her influence in this position, such was her aptitude in governing and such her skill and tact in managing the affairs of the college, that at the end of the year she was invited by a unanimous vote of the trustees to become the President of Wellesley College; the only question being whether with her youth and her delicate physique she would be able to bear the great burden





The captain says that besides seven American vessels that he captured this summer he seized five British sealers at various dates from July 2 to Aug. 15, one of which Vissels escuped, and that he took no versel that was less than 'twenty-nine miles front more, and he says that all his captures were turned over to the United States marshal at Sitka, and the four British vessels and four of the American vessels have already been torfeited to the United States by the court at Sitka, and yet the country has been officially informed that the state-department and the department of justice have had no information regarding any seizures made this year, The captain sais explicitly that his instructions from Secretary Faircuild were that all waters east of a line drawn from between the Diomede islands in Behring strais in a southwesterly direction to a point equi-distant between Cooper island and Otter island the most westerly island of the Aleutian chain, were waters of Alaska, and that sealing therein, except by persons in the service of the Alaska Commercial company, was forbidden by law under penalty of seizure and forfetture. So that after the state department had waived our claim to Behring sea more than three miles from land, and the president had directed the release of the three British sealers captured last tice still held on to the vessel caught last year, and the treasury department was putting our claim to half of Behring sea into British sealers anywhere from thirty to seventy miles from the nearest land, and the United States court at Sitka was forfeiting these vessels to the United States. 
