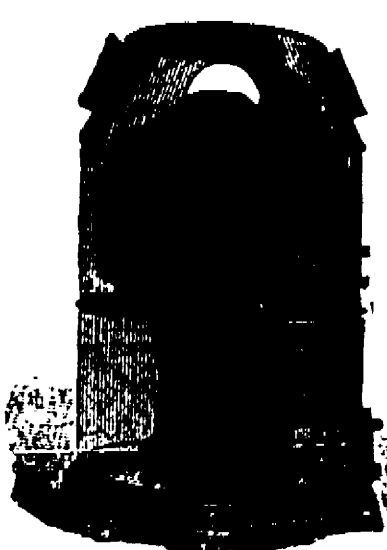

A warrant has been issued for the arrest of John Dillon, one of the most capable of Burnell's lieutenants. The Chinese-American banking scheme negotiated by Count Mikiewicz has ended in a complete failure. Archbishop Fabre of Montreal has issued a mandament asking for the restoration of the pope's temporal power. William Quinan of Gibraltar, Penn., who fought a prize fight several weeks ago with John Heyl, died of his injuries. A number of people were severely injured by an explosion at the Odd-Fellows' building in Boston Tuesday afternoon. Howard Page, a witness in the Standard oil cases, declares that the company receives no rebate south of the Ohio river. The loss by the burning of the packing-house of the Des Moines Packing Company is estimated at \$250,000. Insurance, 190,000. Henry Koch of Lancaster, Penn., awaiting trial on the charge of obtaining money under false pretenses, committed suicide. The annual report of the Indiana female reformatory shows that the institution has cost the State about \$10,000 during the last year. Two miners in Luzerne Borough, Penn., fought a desperate fight over a girl. Ed. Dennison, one of the contestants, will die. Wheat receipts at Minneapolis last week aggregated 1,897,000 bushels and the product of the flour-mills amounted to 24,000 barrels per day.
