





The eight heads of depart-ments—Bayard, Endicott Fairchild White ney, Garland, Dickinson, Vilas and Colman-seated themselves opposite the justices of the supreme court, the assemblage standing until all were seated. General Harrison, on the arm of Senator

Hoar, appeared at the door and was introduced by Captain Bassett as "the president-elect of the United States." He walked with his companion to the seat provided at President Cleveland's right, the audience again rising to its feet. The same ceremony was repeated with Vice President-elect Morton. Before taking his seat he was sworn in by Mr. Ingalls, who walked arm-in-arm with Senator Cullon. At 11:59 President Pro Tem Ingalls rose and closed the fiftieth congress.
