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Washington dispatches, April 16: The Michigan Senators have gone to a caucus to select their first genuine choice from the new administration. They were permitted to choose Palmer as the President. The President had selected him. The agricultural interests of the country picked out Prof. White as a good man, and they learned of his probable appointment about three hours before it was made. Their next thought was to get the home of the Governor of Alaska, but the State did not have much confidence in their getting that.

A few days ago a leading Republican daily of Michigan headed its editorial column with this simple but pathetic and prophetic paragraph: "After much pulling and hauling the Michigan Senators have endorsed Ford Maynard for Governor of Alaska. The Senate of Michigan will not get the place. She is getting nothing."

The paper was right. President Harrison named a Governor of Alaska yesterday and he was not from Michigan. The nominee was Lyman E. Knapp, of Middlebury, Vt. The President gave the Michigan Senators to understand when they pressed Maynard's appointment upon him, that he believed Mr. Maynard a worthy man, but desired a man of much experience for Governor of the territory.
