

reaching the edge of the ravine, it finally now becomes necessary, in order to make things comprehensible and distinct, to render a minute description of the field and immediate surroundings where this famous and fatal contest to the southern confederacy culminated. Directly east of the open field gently sloped into a ravine, from whose southern entrance gradually arose with its apex some 100 feet higher than the ground we now occupied. It then again descended into a ravine. From here rose a hill of considerable magnitude, and on the brow of the hill Gen. Pat Claiborn's Division was already located, they having had about 1000 yards the advantage of position. They were drawn up in line of battle, and had already commenced to entrench by digging rifle pits and guarding the same in front with timbers and brush but no earthworks yet, hence it afforded but slight protection. On the left they were supported by a battery consisting of four guns. About 80 rods to the south from the line of battle we occupied, was a strip of low meadow land, some 500 yards unsprouted for this section, and this beautiful spot, out of range of the enemy's guns, was selected as the hospital grounds during the coming engagement. The 2d Division under Gen. Davis now formed into line of battle. The 1st Brigade under command of Col. Lamm, consisting of the 1st, 2d, 3d, 4th, 5th, 6th, 7th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th, 12th, 13th, 14th, 15th, 16th and 17th Regts., and the 17th New York Zouaves. We now stood directly in observation of the movements of the enemy on the brow of the hill, and any one ever participating in a charge knows the coming event.
