

When this is heated it boils, giving off fumes of sulphurous acid, and turns intensely black. By evaporation the unconverted excess of acid and camphor is driven off and a black mass remains, which seems to have the qualities of Indian ink. Lake Indian ink, it can be apparently dissolved in water, and remains suspended for a long time. We hope that some one will pursue the subject of this camphorblack. A pure liquid black is one of the things that science has searched for in vain for many years, and even so near an approach to it as good Indian
