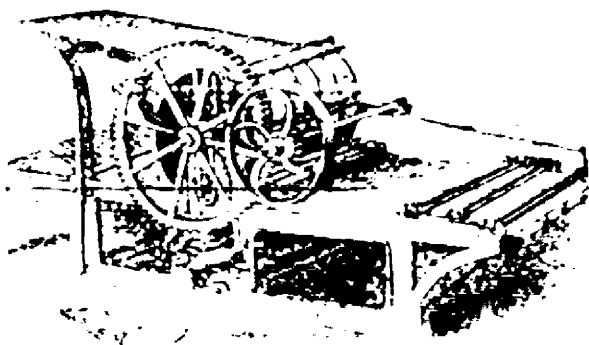

Prof. H. H. Tucker, of the High School, has returned to his home at Hartford, Conn. after a visit to his family.

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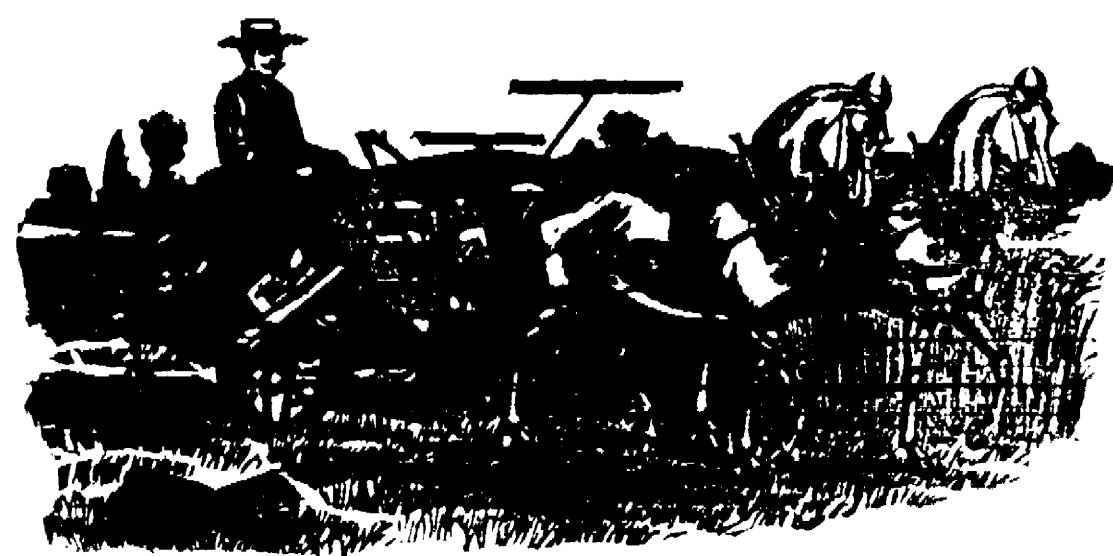
