Albert Bulow was hanged shortly before 2 o'clock Friday morning at Little Falls, Minn., for the murder of Frank Eich in November last. The Minnesota newspapers printed elaborate accounts of the affair, in spite of the new law, which provides that they shall print only the bare announcements of hang-

A secret ballot has been taken in the block-coal region of Indiana to determine whether the miners would resume work at the price offered by the operators-70 and 75 cents a ton. The returns are not complete, but enough have been received to indicate that the proposition to go to work was defeated by at least 4 to 1.

The papers in the Burke extradition matter have been received at the department of justice at Ottawa, from Winnipeg. A lapse of time being provided for by law, an order for extradition can not issue until the 26th instant, and in the meantime the minister of justice will have an opportunity of considering the merits of the case.

The London police have another Whitechapel horror on their hands. The body of a disreputable woman, terribly mutilated, has been found on the scene of former awful crimes committed by 'Jack the Ripper." The most extraordinary feature of the occurrence is that the scene of the murder was overrun with policemen and that several officers must have been only a few rods distant when the bloody deed was committed.

There is no clew to the assassin. Advices from China say that on June 2 the Chan-Ping and Ping Yuen districts were flooded by the bursting of a waterspoult or tornado, and the level country flooded with nearly thirty-six feet of water. The villages of Chae Kon and Ha Ku Hui, in the Ping Yuen district, and Cueong Tan, Hop Lui, Ngai Ku, Sam Chan Kiu, and San Po Hui, in the Chan Ping district, were overflowed, many houses being wholly swept away. Unward of six thousand lives were lost.

There is a movement on foot looking to the consolidation of all of the natural gas companies in the Ohio and Indiana fields in a trust. It is, understood that this arrangement has the sanction of Calvin S. Price, Oliver H. Payne, and other Standard Oil magnates. They now own the majority of all the stock of the companies in Ohio and Indiana and will buy up the stock of the remaining independent companies. It is a gigantic scheme which will likely mature fully in a few weeks.

From dispatches from Indian Terriof the Cherokee strip to the United States is likely to fail. Chief Mayes will doubtless call a special session of the Cherokee Legislature to consider their proposition and also the offer of the live stock company, which now holds the strip under a lease which they want extended for ten years. The Cherokees claim to hold a Government patent for the strip and, say they must have a big price if they sell.

In Kansas City the Sunday law had its designed effect for the first time since its enforcement and Kansas City was as dry as prohibition Kansas. The Commissoners ordered that arrests be made under the State law, which makes it a felony to sell intoxicating liquors Sunday and renders it obligatory upon the part of the trial Judge to revoke the license of every conviction. Forty arrests were made the previous Sunday under the latter law. On last Sunday only three arrests were made.


