The most extraordinary feat of memory is one which Sir William Hamilton. believes to be true without doubt, cited to him from Geographer Maretus, who witnessed it and had it solemnly attested by four Venetian noblemen of undoubted honor. Maretus tells us how in Padua he met a young Corsican who had gone thither to pursue his studies at the universal. Having heard that the young man was gifted with a most extraordinary memory, so that ne could retain and repeat as many as 36,600 words, which would be read over by him once only.
