





FRAUDULENT LAND ENTRIES.

Officials in the general land office say that they are not aware that, as stated in a Portland, Ore , disputch, the govern ment is withholding from settlers in Oregon patents for timber lands to any great extent on the ground that the lands are agricultural. There are some cases held up penaing investigation by special agents to determine the character of the land. The groat trouble that the land office officials have to deal with they say is to prevent violations of the law in regard to the entry of timber land not only in Oregon but in the northwest generally. By law one person can make only one entry of 160 acres of timber land. 
