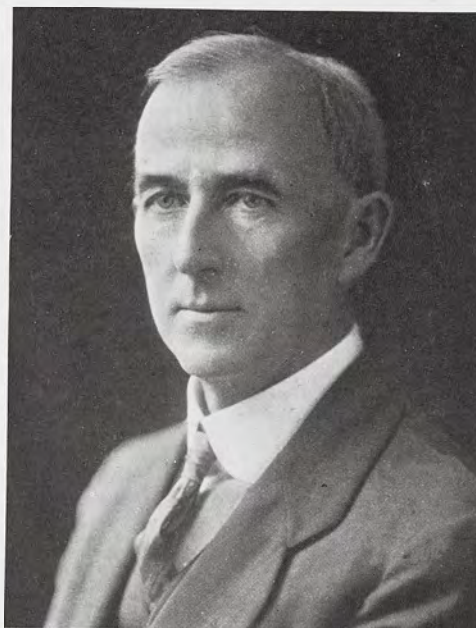
AGRICULTURE

ENGINEERING

Engineering in all its different phases—Mechanical, civil, electrical, chemical, and agricultural—has long been a prominent branch of the swiftly growing college curriculum. Michigan, with its tremendously varied fields of application, has been in need of her engineers; that they have served her well is shown by the results of their labors in turning her raw resources to the uses of her people. Besides wide opportunities at home, graduates from this division have a rapidly developing world before them which is bidding for their services.



HOME ECONOMICS

Home makers of the state are the students in this division of the college. Experience has proven that the housewife has before her a task that calls for scientific study and a deep grasp of the principle of social life. Gradually the department has included a wide curriculum of courses dealing with science, the arts, biology, physiology, sociology, and economics, as well as a close acquaintance with the world of letters. Home economics has also aided many energetic young women to establish themselves in the industrial world.

LIBERAL ARTS AND BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

This division endeavors to train young men and women for life by giving them much practice in definite and accurate thinking through subjects which have also a cultural value. It is assumed that those who complete the Liberal Arts course plan to earn a living afterward. We believe with David Starr Jordan that a fine type of alumnus is a "Gentleman," but that a finer type is a "Gentleman of work," hence in all subjects the vocational aspect is emphasized. This has proven to be an admirable preparation for life work.

The wide choice of electives in this division permits a student to choose a course that satisfies his peculiar demands, and yet the requirements of the course are such as to insure broad training.



PHYSICAL EDUCATION

With a staff of sixteen trained instructors and coaches and equipment which includes one of the most modern gymnasiums in the middle west, the gymnasium annex and a new armory and field house, Michigan State College, is in an excellent position to give instruction in the newly organized division of physical education.

VETERINARY MEDICINE AND BIOLOGY

A complete veterinary course is available in this division with special emphasis on the biological and economic angles of animal life. Men going out from this course are offered opportunities to take part in the direction and conservation of one of America's greatest industries—animal husbandry, not from an agricultural angle but from a scientific one. Medical biology is a digest of all the known sciences in relation to animal life, and prepares its followers to be trained technicians in offices, hospitals, and public health laboratories.

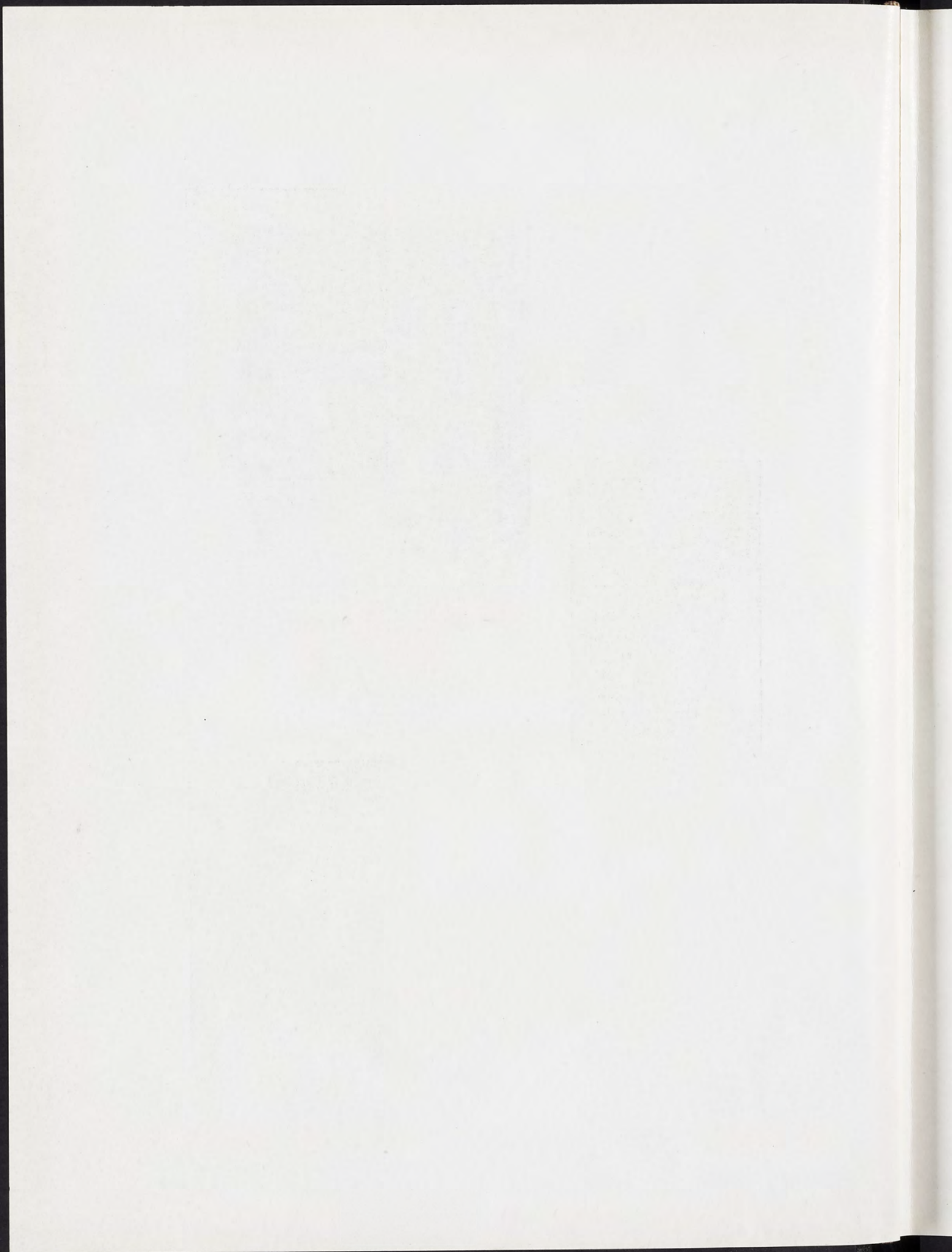
Frank S. Kedzie, *Historian*

Frimodig is assistant director of athletics, and Warren Burt is secretary to Director Young. Jack Heppinstall is the veteran trainer of all college teams. Charles D. OUR ATHLETIC PROGRAM

With the appointment of Harry Kipke, All-American half-back of the University of Michigan, as head football coach at Michigan State, Director of Athletics Ralph Young has climaxed the building up an athletic program that should put Spartan teams at the pinnacle in the Middle Western athletic world. The great backfield star of the University assumed charge of football practice in the spring of 1928 to prepare for the fall campaign.

Assisting Kipke will be Miles Casteel, for the past three years an assistant coach in football and track, and two new-comers to East Lansing. They are Edliff Slaughter, another All-American choice of Walter Camp while at Michigan, and Edward Vandervoort, a team-mate of both Slaughter's and Kipke's. They will give State the largest varsity football staff in its history.

The past year has marked the building up of every sport at State. Teams of championship caliber flaunted the Green and White during the track and baseball seasons of 1927, the cross country season of 1927, and the track and basketball seasons of 1928. And in football, tennis, wrestling, hockey, and fencing the Spartans have had better than average squads.

Notable athletic victories of the past year include: A crushing defeat of Butler University in football; victories over Notre Dame and Michigan and the winning of the Central Intercollegiate in cross country; baseball victories over West Virginia, Michigan, and Notre Dame; the defeat of Notre Dame in track, and the winning of the Michigan A. A. U. championship in both 1927 and 1928, and the annexing of the State Intercollegiate and Central Intercollegiate titles in 1928; basketball victories over Marquette, Notre Dame, and Detroit; a wrestling victory over Chicago; and the defeat of the Michigan hockey team.

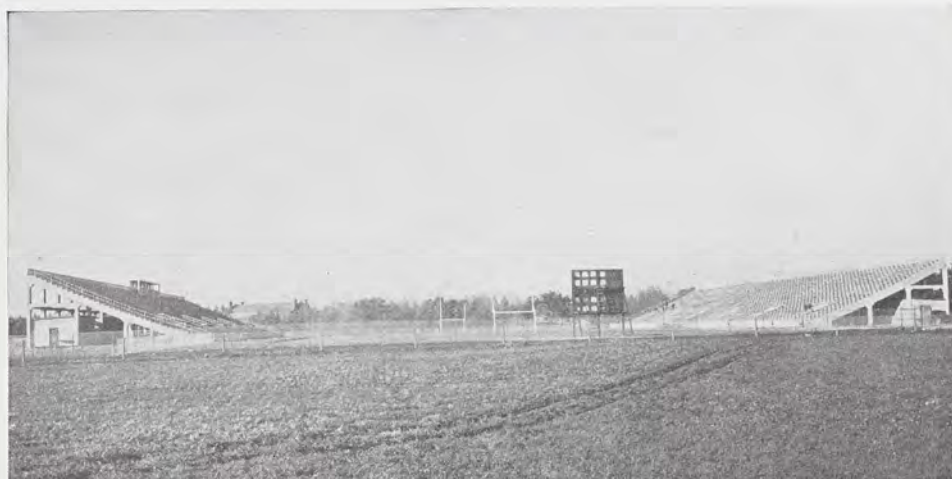

REVIEW OF SEASON

A season mixed with victory and defeat fell to the lot of the Spartans on the football field in 1928. Starting the season with considerable green material, Coaches Young, Traynor, and Casteel were handicapped by frequent injuries and by what at times seemed to be almost indifference on the part of the student body.

A tough nine-game schedule faced the ambitious squad called back for September practice. Out of those nine games, State scored four victories, and five times met defeat. The Spartans tallied 111 points to 128 for their opponents.

As might be expected of an inexperienced team, the play at times was bad and at times was brilliant. State probably showed to its best advantage against Butler University, Ohio University, and for part of the game against the University of Michigan.

An encouraging attempt was made during the season to introduce organized cheering sections to the college. The co-eds outshone the men in their support of the team in this respect.

Alumni of the college were brought close to their team through radio accounts of many of the home games broadcast over WKAR, with "Jimmie" Hasselman at the microphone. Perched in his little booth atop of the press box, "Jimmie" gave a vivid account of every play to radio and sports fans scattered over the west. His intimate knowledge of the game enabled him to interpret many subtleties that would be beyond the average spectator.

As has been the case for many years, the famous military band of the college was a feature of every home contest, and in addition thrilled spectators at the University of Indiana game, played at Bloomington, Ind., with its precise maneuvers and well-timed music.

KALAMAZOO, OHIO UNIVERSITY

The Spartans opened the football season at East Lansing with an indifferent 12 to 6 victory over Kalamazoo College that was followed a week later by a smashing 27 to 0 triumph over a much stronger Ohio University eleven. The improvement during that one week was a tribute to the State coaching staff.

State came close to being forced into a tie with Kalamazoo when Johnson, visiting tackle, scooped up a fumble and ran 85 yards for a touchdown. Going into the fourth quarter with the score tied at 6 to 6, college fans had almost given up hope when Deacon, junior half-back, was sent into the game. After a few brilliant plays he snatched a pass out of the air to score the deciding touchdown.

In the Kalamazoo game, State made 24 first downs to only four for Kalamazoo, indicating the power of the defense. In addition to Deacon's counter, Kurrle also scored for the Green and White.

State's offense shone to its fullest advantage at the very outset of the Ohio game. In less than three minutes after the kick-off, the Spartans scored a touchdown after a hard off-tackle attack. This was followed by two more in rapid succession, before the first period was even ended. The college team tallied again in the last half, but the remainder of the game lacked the thrills of the first new moments.

Captain Paul Smith, Schau, Dickeson, and Wilson led the attack, with Dickeson scoring two touchdowns, and Schau and Smith one apiece. Smith's unerring toe made three out of the four try for points. The contest was marked by the frequent passing of both teams. Ohio tried 40 heaves, 12 of which were completed.

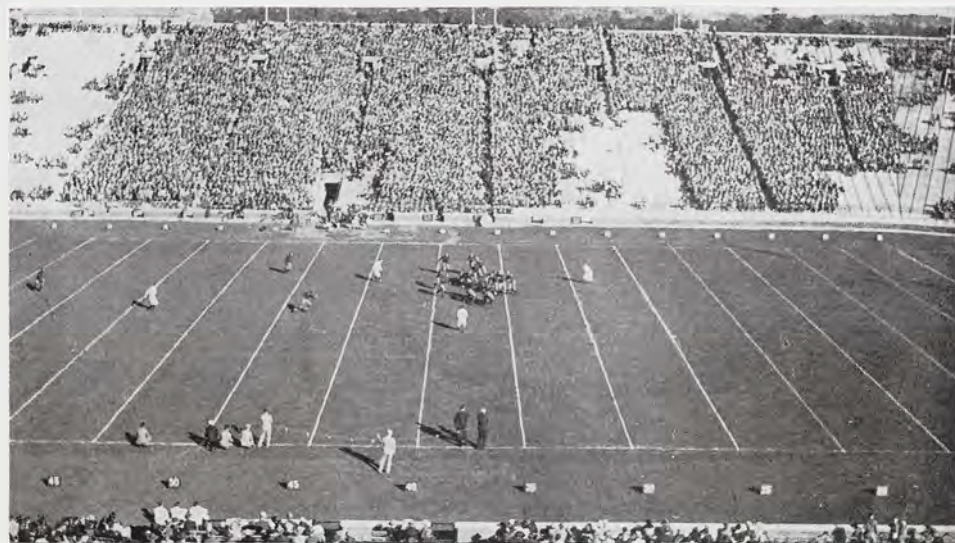

MICHIGAN

Early in October came the annual game with Michigan, and to the general delight of college fans, the Spartans gave their traditional sport rivals a slam-bang battle, although losing 21 to 0. Playing before a crowd of 37,000 in the great new stadium at Ann Arbor, State at times flashed a brand of defense that left nothing to be desired.

The whistle had scarcely blown to start the game when Michigan scored, but shortly thereafter State took a new lease on life, and contested every inch that the Wolverine backs gained. Ross at center played a great game, outshining every pivot man sent against him. Ferrari, sophomore tackle, was a power on defense and spoiled numerous plays of the blue-shirted backs.

Michigan's two touchdowns after the opening one came directly as the result of misplays on the part of the Spartans, due, more than anything else, to greenness. The height of the State offense came in the fourth quarter when Christensen snared a pretty pass from Captain Smith to run to the 29-yard line, but an intercepted heave ended the parade.

Deacon turned in several nice gains for the Big Green team, and Captain Smith kicked and passed in his usual form. Christensen played a brilliant game at end both on offense and defense.

Several of Smith's kicks in the Michigan game went for 60 yards, and not once was he outpunted. The absence of Schau from the State line-up was sorely felt, the Spartans lacking a powerful enough back to crash the Michigan line.

Coached by Dick Barker, former wrestling mentor at the University of Michigan, Cornell was almost a smaller edition of the Wolverines. and McCosh smashed through the Cornell line for a touchdown that served to raise State's hopes, but Cornell again went down the field for counter just as the last period opened.

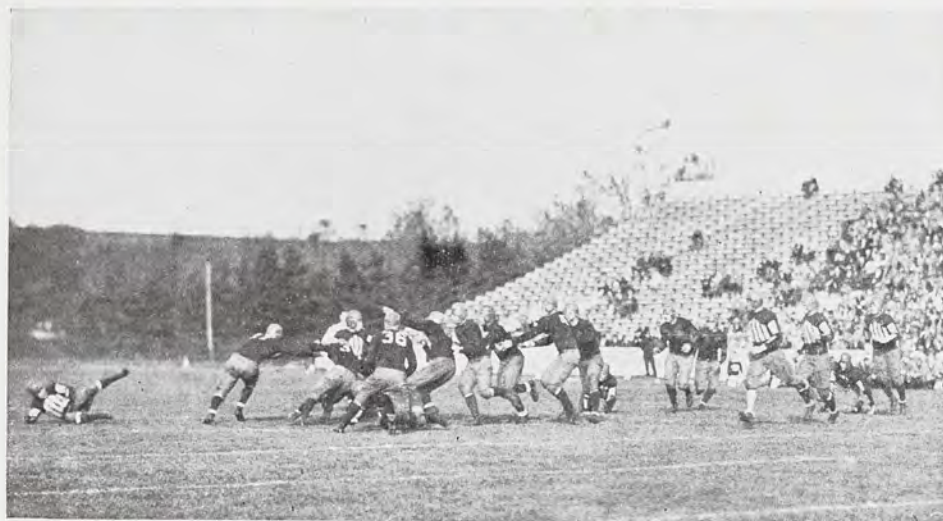

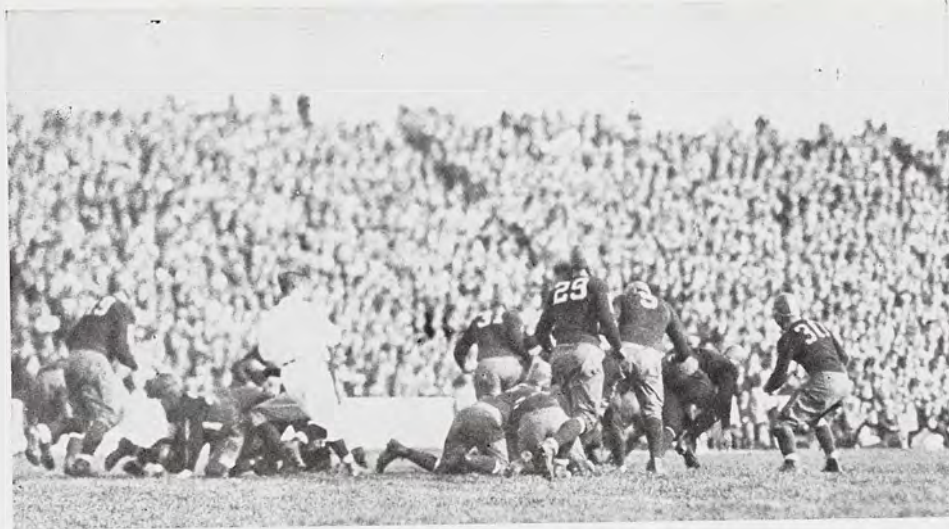

INDIANA

State's fourth successive defeat came at the hands of Indiana, 33 to 7, on the first Saturday in November. Battering away until the Albion line was helpless, State came from behind to defeat a plucky Methodist team in the Armistice Day game at East Lansing, 20 to 6. The victory ended a losing streak that had extended to four games.

As had been the case in the previous four games, the opponents scored first, and with the count reading 6 to 0 in favor of Albion at the end of the half, the State stands were none too cheerful. But the superior off-tackle lunges and end-runs of the Spartans told heavily in the last two periods, and State scored three touchdowns and came close to counting on two more.

Using only the simplest of plays, the Spartans nevertheless were able to gain almost at will after the Young machine got under way. The game was marked by the return to uniform of Henry Schau, big fullback, and the spectacular end-runs of Vern Dickeson. Schau was unstoppable through the Albion line, and Dickeson was

always good for a gain. Captain Smith also played a great game, and the State forward wall, although outweighed, stood head and shoulders over their opponents in the knowledge of football.

It is quite possible that State could have run up a large score easily on Albion had the Spartans elected to use any passes, but Coach Young was saving everything for the Butler game, and his foresight was justified. The statistics of the game reveal how badly Albion was outplayed. State made 278 yards on running plays for a total of 24 first downs.

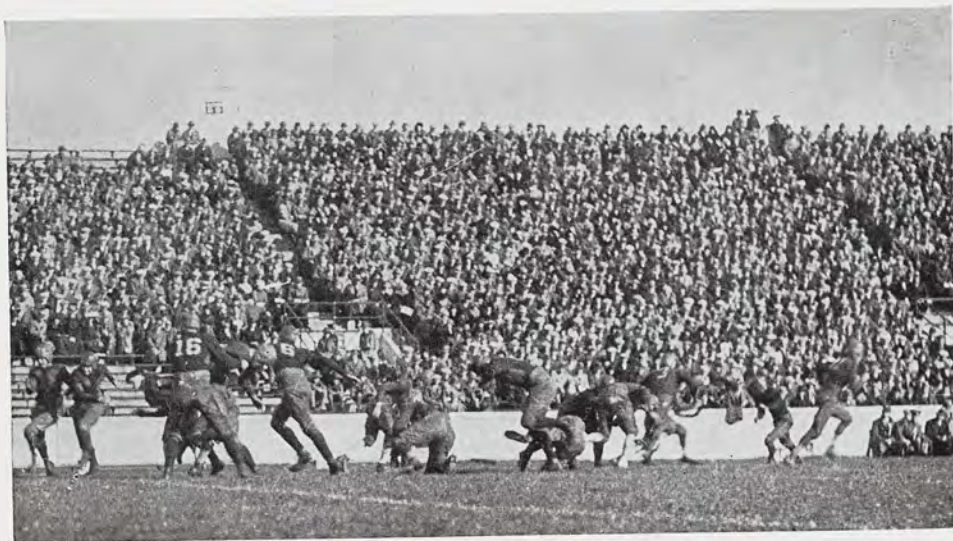

SPRING FOOTBALL

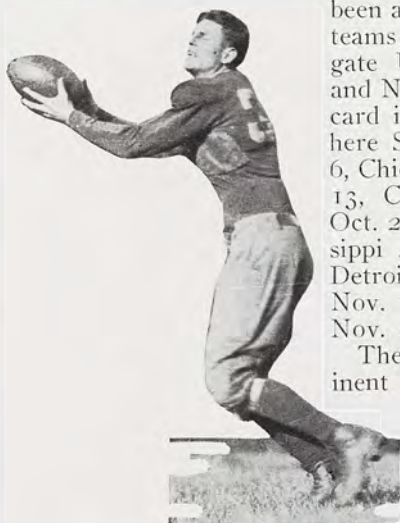

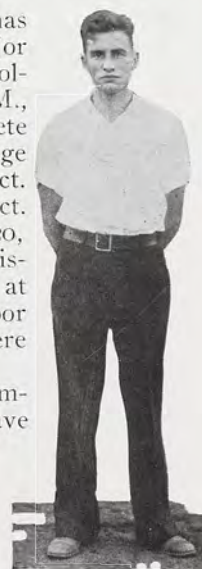
Coach Kipke was pleased with the attitude of the men but not overly optimistic of the prospects for the coming season.

SUMMARY OF SEASON

Michigan State came to the fore with a vengeance in basketball during the 1928 season under the direction of Coach Ben Van Alstyne. Eleven games were won against four defeats, the best record hung up at East Lansing since the days of Frimodig. Achieving national prominence by defeating the powerful Notre Dame quintet, 26 to 16, before a frantic home crowd, the Spartans also gratified

their followers by twice turning back the University of Detroit in overtime contests.

At the very outset of the season Captain Kenny Drew, a fighting guard, was declared ineligible. This left Coach Van Alstyne with only one veteran defensive man—Colvin. Three sophomores were developed, however, and performed in a manner that would do credit to seasoned players. They were Schau, Russo, and McGillicuddy. Schau bore the brunt of the defense most of the time. Since opponents could average but 23.6 points against State during the season, the strength of State's guards is well illustrated.

State's offense, on the other hand, went out and made baskets galore, on several occasions running up scores of over 50. The average for the year was 31.5 points. Dickeson, elected as captain to succeed Drew, led the attack, scoring 100 points during the season.

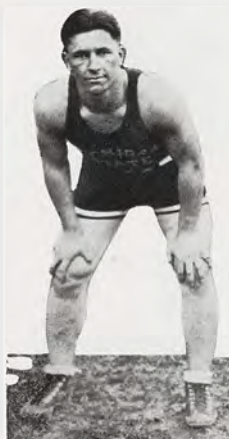
Coach Van Alstyne started the basketball season under several handicaps. Several of his outstanding players, notably Schau, Captain Drew, and Dickeson, were still out for football, accounting in no small way for the 43-23 defeat at the hands of Michigan. Then Captain Drew was declared ineligible, a further blow to the squad. With Colvin he was the only veteran guard.

State brushed aside Adrian 30 to 25 to open the season, before the Michigan tussle, and then came back with the start of the new year to defeat Ohio Northern, 43 to 23, with a revamped lineup. Real scoring power was exhibited in the defeat of Hillsdale, 58 to 24, when State's sharpshooters seemed able to score at will.

Detroit proved a hard tussle at East Lansing, the traditional rivals of the Spar-

tans forcing the contest into an over-time before State emerged victorious, 27 to 23. A few days later a powerful Coe College team from Iowa fell before the accurate passing of the Spartans, 35 to 25. Two hard fought games were lost on a brief mid-western trip, Loyola downing the Spartans after two over-times, 23 to 21, and Marquette, another old rival, winning 21 to 18 at Milwaukee.

Undaunted State journeyed to South Bend and came within an ace of doing something no other five has accomplished in five years—defeating Notre Dame on its own court. Three times the Spartans led and three times Notre Dame came from behind to tie the score—once as the game ended, and once in each of the first two over-times. Finally the Irish won out, 29 to 25, but not until State's plucky five, playing virtually without a substitution during the entire contest, had been worn out by the terrific pace.

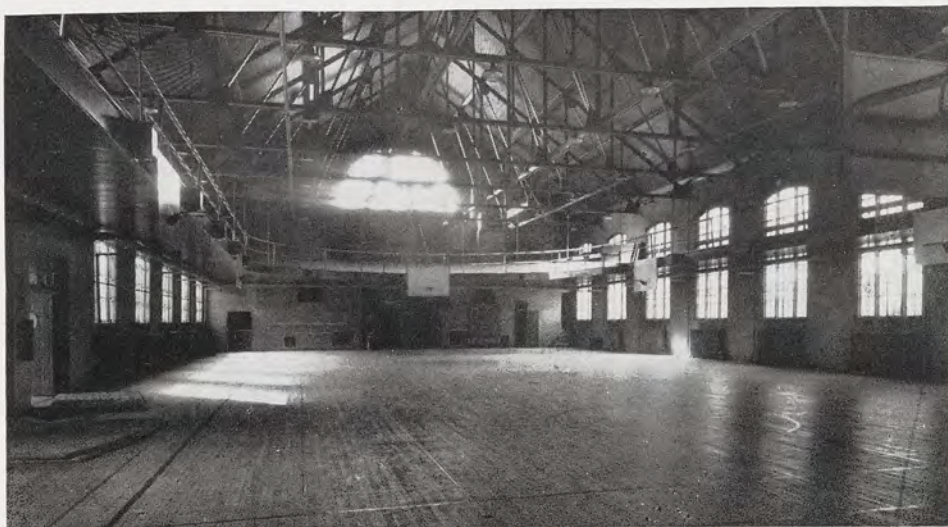

Following the heart-breaking defeat at the hands of Notre Dame, the Spartans took a new lease on life and concluded the season with six consecutive victories, the outstanding one being the 26 to 16 drubbing handed Notre Dame at East Lansing.

This game, too, will go down in annals as a brilliant example of basketball. State's guarding was perfect, the Irish never having a close-up shot at the basket during the entire contest. Schau stood out with his great defensive play. With the score tied late in the contest, State staged a rally that netted ten points while the Irish were held scoreless.

Another victory that pleased the home fans was the 52 to 20 triumph over the same Albion team that a year before had invaded East Lansing and nosed out Coach Van Alstyne's five. A 17-13 victory over the University of Detroit at Detroit, in another over-time contest, established the true worth of the squad.

An ambitious schedule has been arranged for the coming season, and there is some possibility that a larger playing court will be found for the Spartans.

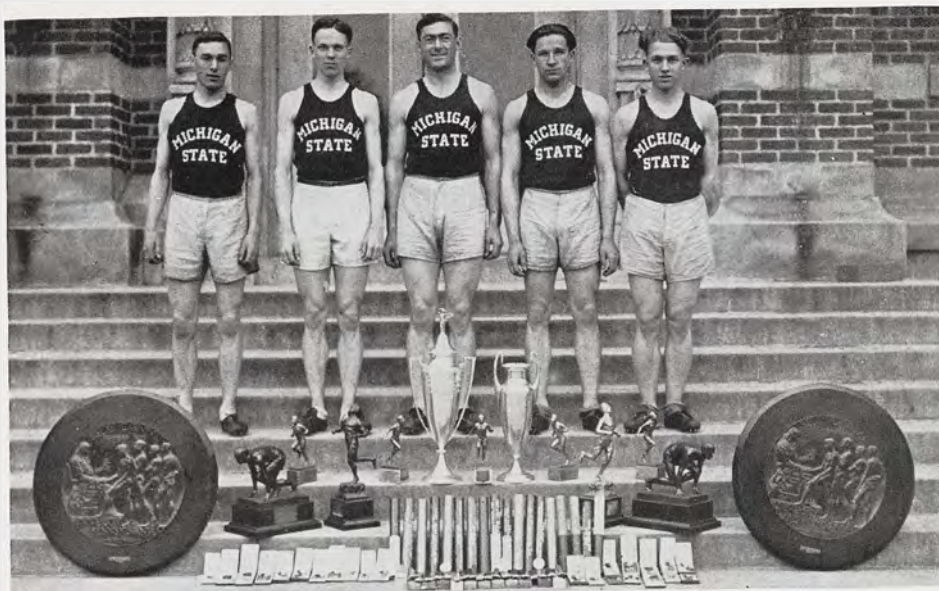

RELAYS

Michigan State's 1927 track team, unquestionably the best in college history, won national renown for the Spartans, was undefeated in dual meets, and annexed the Michigan Intercollegiate and Central Intercollegiate crowns, in addition to cutting a wide swathe at the National Intercollegiates, I. C. A. A. A. A. meet, and at four major relay carnivals.

The performance of the undefeated half-mile relay team, named as All-American by the experts, was outstanding. Captain Alderman, Grim, Lang, and Henson made up the fleet combination. They dashed to victory at the Rice,

Texas, Ohio, and Pennsylvania Relays. Kroll was the alternate, and he also figured in brilliant victories. State annexed the quarter-mile crown at the Rice and Texas Relays, was second in the mile relay at Ohio, and won the Class B mile event at Pennsylvania. In addition the mile combination won the state crown.

The fleet Spartan sprinters gathered more than 30 gold and silver wrist watches during the season, in addition to a plentiful supply of medals and trophies.

With Alderman running in the anchor position the Spartans were unbeatable. Given an even break the State captain could always open up a good lead, and time and again he would come from behind to win with his brilliant finish. With his graduation State lost one of the greatest sprinters of all time, and an athlete who made college history.

DETROIT

State opened the dual meet track season with an easy victory over Detroit City College, 88 2-3 to 44 1-3. The outstanding performance was the time of :09.6 turned in by Alderman in the hundred-yard dash. The mark tied the national intercollegiate record. It was made against a slight breeze.

Wylie won both the mile and two-mile, and Alderman, with the aid of Henson, Grim, Lang, and Kroll, piled up points in the dashes. State also scored well in the distances and field events.

NOTRE DAME

For the first time in a score of years, Michigan State defeated Notre Dame in a dual track meet. The score was 68 to 58. The feat was accomplished in a steady downpour of rain at South Bend, Ind.

Captain Alderman won the 100 and 220-yard dashes, and the broad jump. He set a new Notre Dame record in the 220 of 21-flat, accomplished despite a soft track.

Wylie's brilliant defeat of Judge of Notre Dame in the mile also stood out. Judge was the 1926 national intercollegiate champion. Wylie nosed him out by less than a foot in 4:29, after racing the entire last lap neck and neck.

Grim took second to Alderman in both the 100 and 220, and won a brilliant victory in the quarter-mile. Tillotson and Paul Smith added points in the weight events, and the performance of virtually every man on the squad was well above average.

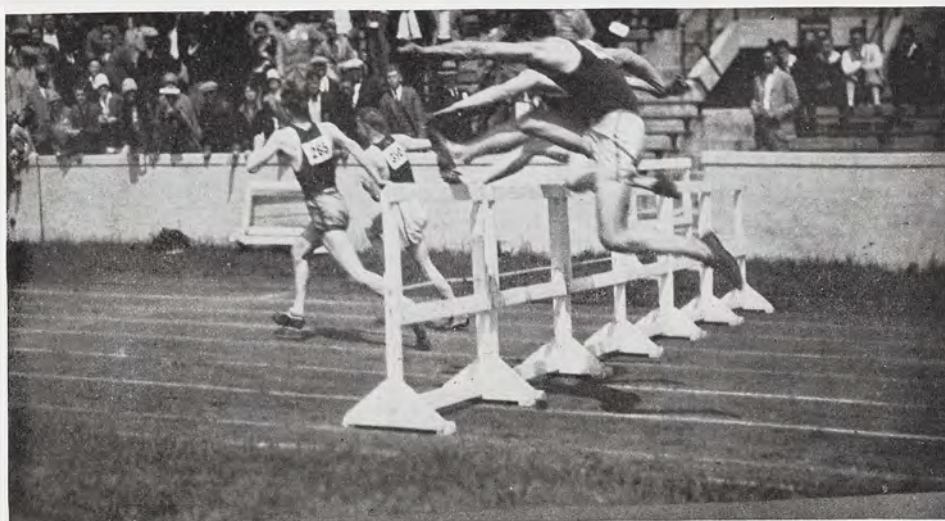

STATE INTERCOLLEGIATES

Coach Young achieved a goal towards which he had been aiming ever since his arrival at East Lansing when he won the State Intercollegiates by piling up 53½ points, nearly twice the score of the nearest opponent.

Alderman, Grim, and Henson finished one, two, three in both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, Alderman's winning time being :09.6 and :20.5 respectively. Grim set a new State record in the quarter with a mark of :48.9, with Kroll and Alderman a foot behind. Wylie lost a heart-breaking race to Potter of Ypsi in the mile, but Brown, State Freshman, won the two-mile with ease. McAtee tied for first in the pole vault, and Paul Smith accounted for points in the weights.

CENTRAL INTERCOLLEGIATES

Despite the fact that Grim could not run because of an injured foot, State won the Central Intercollegiates, scoring 73½ points. Alderman took both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, and won the broad jump, with Henson placing in both dashes. Wylie and

Captain Alderman added to his laurels at Philadelphia by surprising the entire track world with a brilliant victory in the quarter-mile run. He had been doped to race it out with Borah of Southern California for honors in the sprints, but instead he chose the longer race and led the pack home to victory.

His time of :48.3 ranked him as one of the greatest quarter-milers in America, despite the fact it was his first intercollegiate appearance at the distance. He defeated, among others, Ross of Yale, and Cooke of Syracuse, the intercollegiate champion. Grim and Henson qualified in the sprints but were eliminated in the semi-final races. McAtee cleared 12 feet and 6 inches but could not place in the pole vault. Wylie was sixth in a fast mile.

NATIONAL INTERCOLLEGIATES

With the I. C. A. A. A. A. quarter mile title safely stowed away, Alderman set out for new honors in the national intercollegiates in the 100-yard and 220-yard dashes. He won both races, the hundred in :09.9, and the 220 in :21.2, despite a slow track. This gave him the greatest collection of major sprint titles held by one man during recent years in intercollegiate track.

Although Grim seemed an obvious fourth place in the century, he was overlooked by judges. He finished fifth in the 220.

Had Alderman not been hampered with a bad leg muscle at Chicago in the national intercollegiates, many believe he would have come close to or bettered the world's record in the 220-yard dash.

INDOOR SEASON, 1928

Despite the loss of Grim and Alderman, Coaches Young, Mason and Casteel developed a much stronger track team than had been expected. The Spartans started the season on right foot by retaining their title in the Michigan A. A. U. championships, piling up 40 points to 25 for Ypsilanti Normal. Thirteen teams were entered in the meet. Brown, a sophomore, captured the A. A. U. two-mile title, and McAtee surprised by setting a new indoor pole vault record of 13 feet and $\frac{1}{2}$ inch, one of the greatest vaults ever made off a board floor in the history of track.

State cut a wide swath at its own relay carnival, capturing several of the special relays, but losing a heart breaking two-mile race to the University of Michigan when one of the Spartan distance runners dropped the baton.

At the Illinois Relays an inexperienced Spartan four-mile relay team composed of Captain Wylie, Roossien, Brown, and Willmarth surprised by pushing the University of Illinois to a new Carnival record, the Spartans themselves running eight seconds under the previous mark.

State was nosed out of the Central Intercollegiate indoor championship at South Bend when Notre Dame scored 27 1-3 points to 22 1-3 for the Spartans. Marquette was third with 19 1-3 points while a dozen or more teams trailed behind the leaders.

Only two State men captured individual championships, Kroll winning the quarter-mile, and McAtee tying for first in the pole vault.

OHIO WESLEYAN, MARQUETTE

State split even in dual meets indoors, defeating Ohio Wesleyan, the champions of Ohio, 70 1-6 to 38 5-6, and losing, 56½ to 52½ to Marquette University in a well contested meet at Milwaukee.

In downing Wesleyan, State surprised even the squad's closest followers with team balance. The Spartans took all three sprints, and virtually slammed the distance races. McAtee won the pole vault, Tillotson took the shot put and broke a college record, and the Spartans nearly held their own in other events in which they were admittedly weak.

1927 BASEBALL SEASON

Coach John Kobs' 1927 baseball team has rightly been called one of the greatest in college history. The outstanding victories were over traditional rivals—Michigan and Notre Dame—and the performances in every game were a delight to the campus fans.

Captain Don Fleser headed a hard-hitting squad, that was able to field well, run the bases, and play "heads-up" baseball. Given the able pitching of "Lefty" Tolles, the captain-elect, the Spartans were well nigh unbeatable.

Strangely enough, State started the season with a disastrous southern trip. But the experience gained in Dixie served the Spartans in good stead during the regular season. West Kentucky State Teachers took the first game, 4 to 3, then Fort Benning won a wild exhibition at its Georgia camp, 19 to 11. The next day the Spartans came back to down the officers, 12 to 8, only to lose again on the third day, 5 to 3. Mercer defeated State 7 to 0, and Maryville College of Tennessee took two from the Spartans, 7 to 4, and 17 to 0. The long jaunt was concluded with a brilliant 1 to 0 victory over St. Xavier College at Cincinnati.

It was an alert, bronzed team that returned from the South, ready to battle any and all. In view of the fact that during the remainder of the season only two games were lost, the justification for the journey seemed ample. State easily had the jump on most northern teams, and started its regular season by playing a smooth brand of ball.

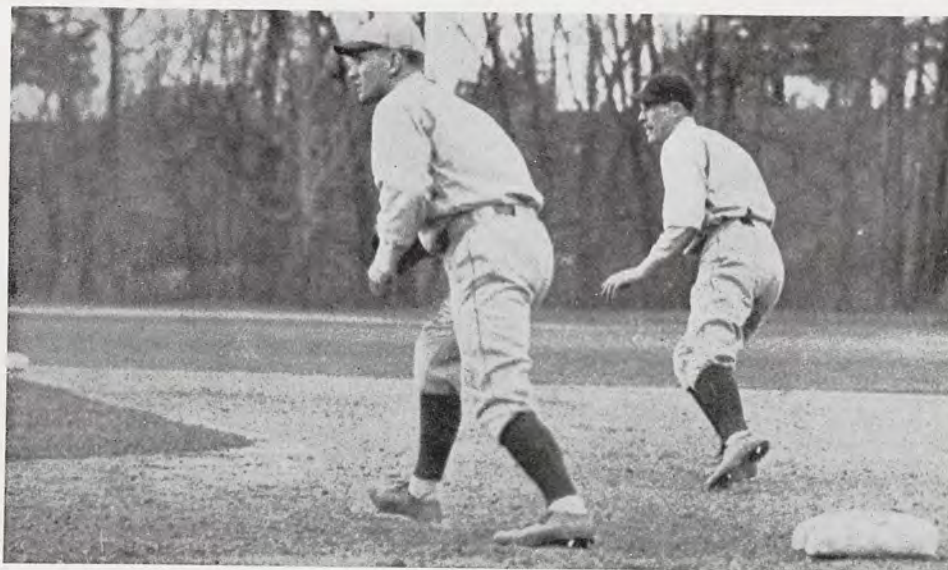

Three small state colleges were trounced just to start the regular season off right, Albion succumbing 17 to 0, Adrian 13 to 2, and Olivet 16 to 0. Then Michigan took a little wind out of the Spartan's sails by winning 6 to 4 at Ann Arbor in an interesting contest.

But Michigan had not seen the Spartans at their best, as a subsequent game demonstrated. Following the Michigan encounter State returned to East Lansing where "Bob" Bremer, veteran pitcher, turned in the best game of his college career to humble the powerful West Virginia University nine, 9 to 3. Despite a disposition towards wildness, Bremer was invincible that day, and aided by splendid fielding and hard hitting the Spartans emerged on the long side of the count in the second major contest of the season.

Hope College's Fighting Dutchmen nearly caught State off its guard, but the Spartans squeezed through with a 7 to 5 victory.

Few State fans saw what was one of the outstanding games of the season, when the Spartans went to South Bend and turned back Notre Dame, 4 to 1, on one of those rare occasions when the Irish are beaten in their own stamping-grounds.

Albert Tolles was on the mound for State, and the little left-hander had the Irish eating out of his glove. State's four runs proved an ample margin of victory.

Following the Notre Dame contest the Spartans returned to East Lansing and subdued Bradley Tech, 9 to 5, in a listless game that was to be expected after the grueling test at South Bend.

St. Viators College of Illinois brought one of the best teams to East Lansing of the entire season, but lost, 5 to 1, with Tolles again turning the trick. The game, however, meant little to the State fans who were looking ahead a few days to the encounter with Notre Dame.

The tradition tilt with the Irish at East Lansing failed to live up to expectations, but was a very good exhibition of college baseball. The Irish avenged themselves on their defeat at South Bend by handing State a stinging 5 to 0 setback.

After Notre Dame came Armour Tech, but the Chicagoans were no match for State, and fell by the wayside, 7 to 3. The Michigan game, next on the schedule, was the high light of the season. The campus turned out en masse for the game,

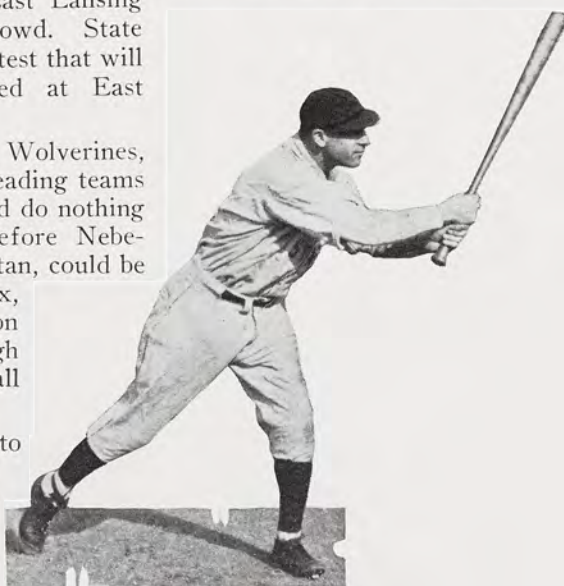
and Lansing and East Lansing fans swelled the crowd. State won, 4 to 1, in a contest that will long be remembered at East Lansing.

The hard hitting Wolverines, one of the leaders leading teams in the Big Ten, could do nothing with Tolles, and before Nebelung, a former Spartan, could be yanked from the box, State had pounced on Michigan for enough runs to cinch the ball game.

It was decided to make their annual games in 1928 the feature of the commencement exercises of the two schools.

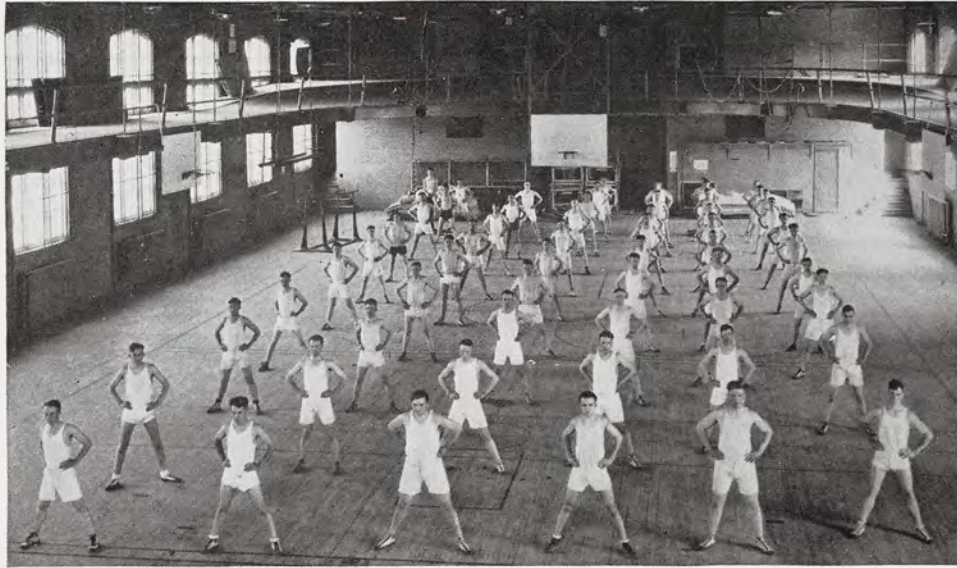

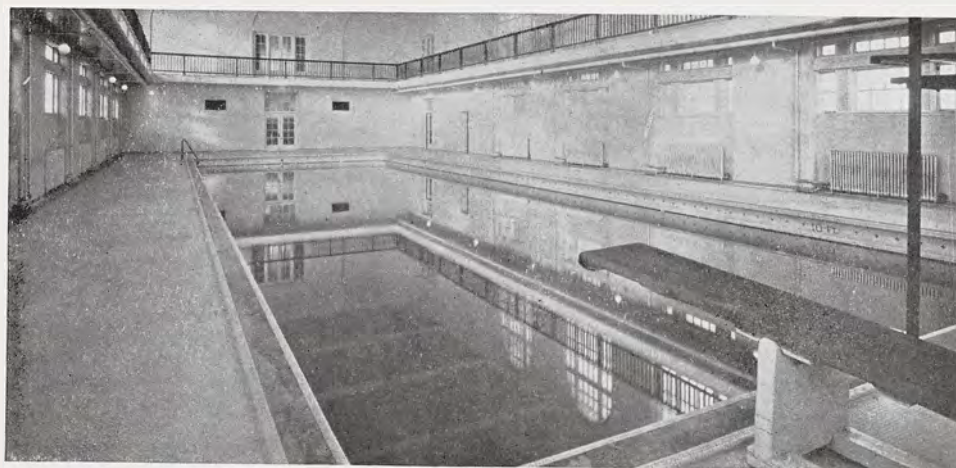
CROSS COUNTRY

Michigan State's 1927 cross country team was without question the greatest in the history of the college. Michigan, Notre Dame, and Marquette were pushed aside without difficulty, and the Central Intercollegiates were won with ease. Many track experts asserted that only Illinois and Wisconsin in the entire west had runners comparable to the Spartans.

In Loren Brown, State had a great distance star. The little Spartan, captain-elect for the 1928 season, met defeat but once, and then at the hands of Pfeiffer of Marquette in the first dual meet of the season. He obtained ample revenge when he led Pfeiffer to the tape in the Central Intercollegiates by several hundred yards. Brown set a new course record of 25:45.7 for the difficult five mile run, a full minute under the old mark. In addition he bettered the Western Conference record at Ann Arbor by thirty seconds in leading his team to victory over Michigan.

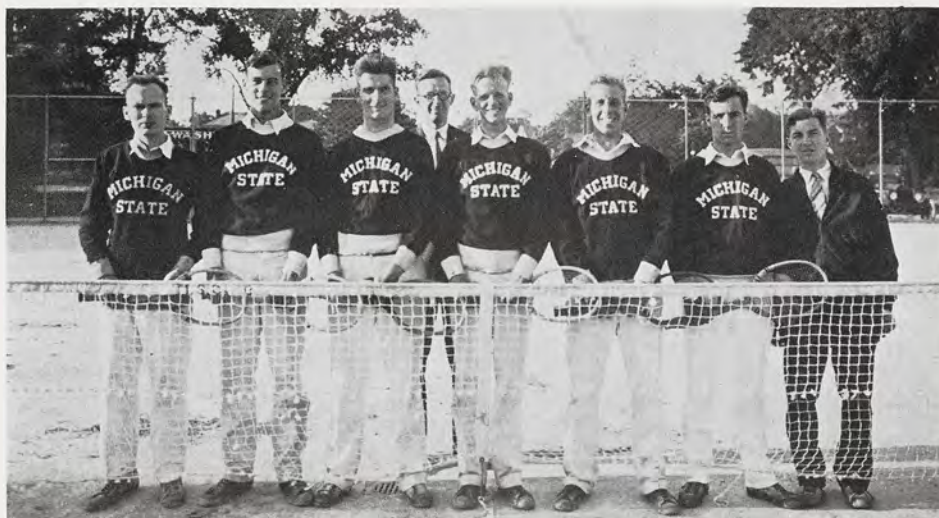

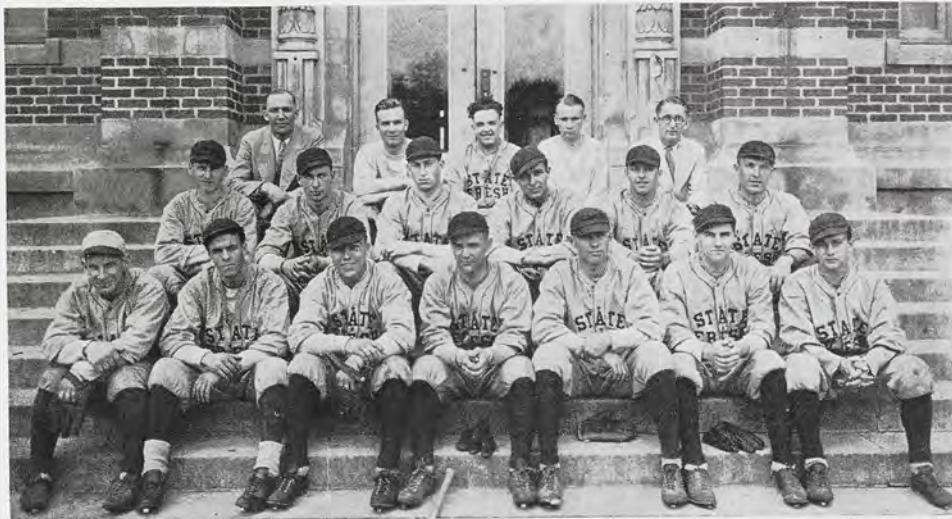

The department of Physical Education for Women has developed rapidly since 1919, at which time the present building was first occupied. That same year sports made their initial appearance—swimming and rifle marksmanship being introduced. Since that time the enthusiasm and demand has grown steadily until the 1928 season opens with eighteen different sports sponsored by the Women's Athletic Association and seven sports sponsored by the Sororities.

The growth of the department has included a minor course in Physical Education, which has developed into a major. The first plan for a minor course was formed in 1922, put into operation the fall of 1923, and the major course is to be introduced the fall of 1928.

The major course will include, besides the Physical Education subjects, courses in Dietetics, Nutrition, and Dietotherapy, also music and art.

With the introduction of the major course the thoughts and plans of the department are turned toward a Woman's Gymnasium.

COLONEL SHERBURNE

Colonel Sherburne came to Michigan State College six years ago and has established an enviable record equal to that which he made in the service of the United States. The fact that the United States Government has this year granted him another year at Michigan State College is a very satisfying condition. 1924 saw the constant efforts of Col. Sherburne rewarded, when the United States Dept. of War granted the "Distinguished College Rating" to the Michigan State R. O. T. C. In 1925 the crack cadet unit was given the same honor. In 1927 the distinguished service was again given, making Michigan State College one of the very few colleges to ever receive four consecutive honors of this nature. This rating has since been discontinued by the War Dept. so the annual inspection held May 18 and 19, 1928, carried with it no such reward. It is through the efforts of Col. Sherburne that we now have on our campus the magnificent new field house known as "Demonstration Hall."

Col. Sherburne has as enviable a military record in the service of the United States as he has at Michigan State College. During his college days at Louisiana State University he was Cadet officer in the R. O. T. C. He left the southern university in 1898 at the declaration of the Spanish-American War to become a second lieutenant in the First Louisiana Infantry. Following this in 1899 he became a second lieutenant in the regular army. Prior to receiving this commission he had been cited for bravery after serving in twenty-one skirmishes during the Philippine Insurrection during which time he was wounded in action. He was commissioned First Lieut. in the regular army in 1911, after he had served in both Alaska and Panama. He became a Captain in 1916 after following the Punitive Expedition into Mexico in 1914. The coming of the World War in 1917 brought him the rank of Major, and took him to France. While in France, Col. Sherburne was again wounded and cited for gallantry. In 1918 he was commissioned to his present status of Lieut.-Col. Later he served in the American Army of Occupation in Germany and came to Michigan State College in the year of 1922.

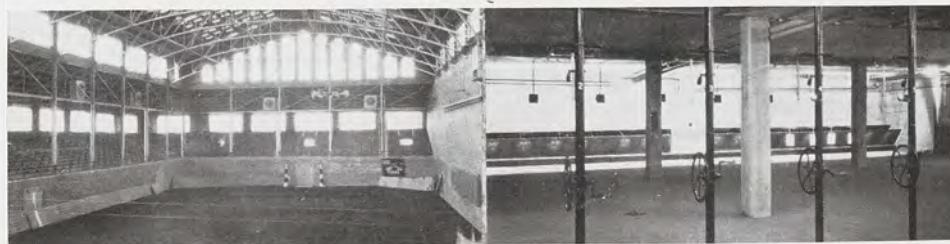


DEMONSTRATION HALL

The long looked for modern armory is now a reality, as is pictured above. The beautiful building is appropriately named "Demonstration Hall," and stands as a monument of achievement to Colonel Sherburne, whose efforts made it possible.

The building has interior dimensions of two hundred fifteen feet by one hundred feet, which is five feet longer than Madison Square Garden of New York. The seating capacity of the balconies alone is approximately forty-one hundred, and when the building is used for special purposes, can be made to accommodate about ninety-five hundred people by arranging seats in the riding hall. The building is equipped with a large gymnasium which affords an excellent place in which to hold large social functions.

Special rooms for each of the various forms of military science are a feature of the building. A rifle range that is a remarkable piece of work, and equipped with modern devices for the handling of targets, makes the study of marksmanship interesting. A large open area with no floor covering is used for riding purposes and for polo games. Headquarters for the officers are also in the building.
