SECRETARY OF THE COLLEGE



A new building to house this important factor in education was completed in 1924. For thirty-eight years, Mrs. Linda E. Landon, as college librarian, has witnessed this development and done much toward making the library what it is today.

DIVISION OF LIBERAL ARTS

The departments comprising the Liberal Arts Division have been in existence for years. Although their work has recently been coordinated as a unit, the Liberal Arts Division has already begun to assert itself and to develop a consciousness. As time goes on, a greater call for service is made on the Division.

The development of a course in Public School Music during the past year has strengthened greatly the work in Arts. The course meets a demand for students adequately trained in music to serve in our public school system. Another contributing factor to the development of the work has been the addition of a course in Hotel Training. This curriculum has been arranged in response to a demand on the part of the hotel men of the state for personnel trained to meet the needs of an ever-increasing traveling public.

While endeavoring to care for these wants, the work in Business Administration and other arts has shown a healthy growth. All of these courses increase the cultural as well as the vocational aspects of the Arts work at this institution.

DIVISION OF AGRICULTURE

An increase, though slight, in the number of students in the Agricultural Division and a marked increase in Short Course attendance may be taken as indicative of public realization of the fact that Michigan agriculture offers bright prospects for those entering this field at the present time.

The apparently unavoidable conditions following the World War have best been met by increasing the diversification of Michigan's farm enterprises. The variety of courses offered by the Agricultural Division have been developed hand in hand with Michigan's agricultural needs. Dairy husbandry, animal husbandry, poultry husbandry, farm crops, soils, horticulture, landscape architecture, forestry, and agricultural engineering offer excellent opportunities at the present time and will require more trained men than now available to take care of the needs of the immediate future. The next ten years bid fair to be prosperous ones for those trained in scientific agriculture.

DIVISION OF ENGINEERING

The conception of engineering as expressed by the leaders of the profession is as follows: "Engineering is the science of controlling the forces and utilizing the materials of nature for the benefit of man, and is the art of directing and organizing human activities in connection therewith."

Engineering as an art is old, so old in fact that it has probably never been traced to its beginning. As a science, however, it is young, and in its applications to our present civilization has become extremely diverse. The success of the engineer, however, as in the past will be due largely to his intensive training in language, science, mathematics, mechanics, the fundamentals of engineering science, and the practice of the art of engineering. This training is offered students in the engineering division and with the addition of certain fundamental courses in economics and business law, helps to fit him for the diversity of work which he will meet after leaving college.

DIVISION OF HOME ECONOMICS

The ultimate purpose of this course is to train students in the application of principles of the sciences fundamental to living and utilization of all modern resources in the improvement of the home. Courses of instruction in home economics together with all the subjects correlated therewith are designed to emphasize the civic, moral and economic responsibility of the individual home to the community, and instruct in the right care of human life in the home.


Eight lines of work are offered in the Home Economics Division: general, foods and nutrition, institution management, clothing, textiles, related arts, vocational, and a five year course in home economics and nursing. In each of these the work is practically the same for the first two years. The groups are offered to permit the student to specialize in the phase of home economics in which she is most interested. All groups prepare for teaching and a student in any one may obtain the state life certificate to teach by electing the courses in education specified by the State Department of Education.

DIVISION OF APPLIED SCIENCE



Acting Dean E. A. Bessey

The Applied Science Division was established in 1921. Its purpose was to provide opportunity for a more intensive training in the fundamental sciences than was afforded in any of the divisions already in existence. Naturally, and rightly, the more technical courses of study such as agriculture, engineering, home economics and veterinary science required of their students much time in studying the technical phases of these subjects. The new course permits this time to be devoted to the deeper study of the science or sciences in which the student is interested. The sciences in which such specialization is possible are: Bacteriology, botany, chemistry, entomology, geology, physics, zoology and mathematics. Graduates of the Applied Science Division may look forward (1) to further work as graduate students, (2) to teaching in high schools and small colleges, (3) to certain classes of positions for which the technical scientific training has especially fitted them.

DIVISION OF VETERINARY MEDICINE AND BIOLOGY


The medical sciences are not neglected at Michigan State. In addition to the work offered in other divisions, the Veterinary Division gives a complete four year course in veterinary medicine leading to the degree of D. V. M. and a course leading to the B. S. degree in medical biology.

Graduates of the Veterinary course have made a marked success in practice, teaching, research, federal and state civil service, in the army, and in many other enterprises. The veterinary course is interesting and not only trains the student for a professional career, but it is a good liberal education.

The medical biology course is something new and is the only course of its kind offered by any college in America. It trains men and women for technical scientific positions in hospitals, board of health laboratories, commercial laboratories, and as technical assistants to physicians.

MICHIGAN STATE INSTITUTE OF MUSIC

With the advent of Lewis Richards as director, the Music Department of the College underwent a complete reorganization in the fall of 1927. The object in view, which has been attained with signal success, was to place this department on the highest artistic and educational level that has been reached by music departments in any of the foremost colleges or by conservatories of music today.

A feature which has attracted wide attention is the placing, as heads of the various departments of the work, of professional artists actively before the public. It is felt that this unusual procedure will be of great benefit to students intending to enter a professional career as artists. Men of national and international name, continuing their public activities, are here at the head of these divisions, the director, Mr. Richards, at the head of piano; Louis Graveure, voice; Michael Press, violin; Philip Abbas, cello; Arthur Farwell, theory, and Leonard Falcone, band and brass instruments.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

The four year course in physical education for men was started in the winter term of 1927, while that for women was started in 1928. It leads to a degree as bachelor of science.

Students may take up to sixty hours of work in physical education. The remainder of the work is in education and other academic subjects so that the student will be prepared to teach upon his graduation. The courses have been planned to give instruction to students desiring to enter the field of physical education. It will prepare men to serve as directors of physical education and athletics in public schools and colleges and as coaches in football, basket ball, baseball, track and field athletics, wrestling, and swimming. In addition it prepares them for conducting classes in calisthenics, gymnasium games, and giving physical examinations. It prepares the women to serve as instructors and directors of physical education in public schools and colleges, supervisors of playgrounds, camp directors, and club leaders.


CO-ED

Featuring one of the fastest offenses in the entire country, the 1928-29 Michigan State College basket ball team was rightfully regarded as the greatest in the history of the school.

During the season State won 11 games and lost only five. Two of these were lost by but a single point. The highlight of the season without question was the astounding and brilliant 31 to 24 win over Michigan at Ann Arbor, December 7, in the season opener for both schools. The true strength of the Spartans is best shown by the fact that Michigan carried through to a tie with Wisconsin for the coveted Big Ten title.

Four regular members of the team, Captain-elect Jim VanZylen, Fred DenHerder, Art Haga and Roger Grove, remain as a nucleus for next year's five. Captain Carl Felt is the lone regular to graduate.

Following the Michigan victory the speedy Spartans swept through to easy victories over Hillsdale, Penn State and Cornell. Then the Spartans met a tartar in Ohio Wesleyan here, January 7. After leading 17

to 13 at half time, State slipped to lose in the final seconds 31 to 29.

Undaunted by this heartbreaking reverse State came back to swamp Marquette here to the tune of 29 to 19. The crushing 39 to 0 University of Detroit football defeat of last fall was avenged the following Friday, when the Titans were humiliated by a 27 to 13 score at Detroit. Detroit sport critics united in proclaiming State one of the greatest basketball teams in the land.

The joy of State fans was not for long though. The team went to Notre Dame January 23 only to be turned back 29 to 24 by the Irish quintet. An injury to Fred DenHerder early in the contest hurt State's chances materially.

In a slump as a result of the grueling Notre Dame contest, State was given a scare three days later by Kalamazoo College, but managed to win 30 to 22. The score was knotted at 12 all at half time.

Then the Spartans went on a road trip that proved decidedly disastrous. Colgate, the alma mater of

As a grand climax to the home season Notre Dame played here February 22 to a gymnasium full of howling fans that clung to the very rafters. After two extra periods Irish luck won out, and State had lost 28 to 27. Jim VanZylen, high scorer of the State team, was out most of the contest because of a leg injury, and his absence told heavily. The game was the most thrilling ever witnessed in East Lansing.

Lake Forest College closed the home season for State by losing a 49 to 16 decision. State's team was at top form against Lake Forest and scored at will. VanZylen was on the bench because of the injury that kept him out of the Notre Dame fray.



More remarkable than anything else in connection with the great State team was the wonderful spirit of the players. Ex-Captain Vern Dickeson and "Cappy" Russo, regulars a year ago, were relegated to the bench by sophomores during the season, but they worked harder than ever, and when the pinch arrived where they were needed, a better response could not have been asked for.

Several other men who did not receive letters failed to miss a single practice during the season.

Thus was State's basket ball season culminated. One fact was brought out clearly during the year and that is, that larger playing quarters must be provided if all of the fans are to be seated at the games. Several plans to provide extra space were advanced but fell through during 1928. Next year the needs of the athletic department for some new arrangement must be met; they can be denied no longer.

Success again smiled on the Michigan State College baseball team in 1928 although prospects were gloomy at the start of the season. Coach John Kobs in his customary fashion took a green outfit and moulded it into a formidable machine that included Michigan, Big Ten champions, in its list of victims.

Captain Forrest Rinehart headed a squad of ball players who individually did not stand out, but together were a nigh-on perfect machine.

As in 1927, State experienced little success on the southern training journey the last week of March. The Spartans started the southern jaunt off by defeating Cumberland University 5 to 3. Three games played against the Fort Benning officers were not so successful though, State only winning the last one, 9 to 7. On the following day Marysville College, stamping ground of a number of present big league stars

STATE'S OLYMPIC REPRESENTATIVE

Fred Alderman, captain of the 1927 Spartan track team and the greatest sprinter ever developed at the college, was the representative of the college at the 1928 Olympic games at Amsterdam. Alderman ran on the 1,600 meter relay team which won one of the three victories America scored on the cinders, and incidentally set a new world's record of 3:14.2. Alderman in college achieved most of his fame in the 100 and 220-yard dashes, in which he holds the college record, and was national champion as well. He was, however, the I. C. A. A. A. A. champion at the quarter-mile, the event in which he represented his nation.

REVIEW OF SEASON

Michigan State's 1928 outdoor season began at the Ohio Relays, when the Spartans took a third in the mile team race between Wisconsin and Indiana. At the Penn Relays, however, the same four milers—Wylie, Clark, Brown and Willmarth—were second to North Carolina, while the mile relay team of Kroll, Lang, Salmon and Henson, scored a sensational victory in one of the special mile relays.

The real season began with a dual meet at East Lansing with Detroit City College, which State won, 85 to 46. Henson took the 100 and 220, while Clark pulled a surprise by beating Captain Wylie in the mile in 4:28. Willmarth nosed

out Brown in the two-mile, while Hackney took the half, McAtee the pole vault, Smith the shot-put, Tillotson the discus, and Hayden the javelin.

On the following Saturday came one of the best dual meets that has ever been staged at East Lansing when Notre Dame finally defeated Coach Ralph Young's team, 64 to 62. Captain Wylie won the mile, with Clark second, setting a new college record of 4:24.2, while Willmarth again took the two-mile from his teammate, Brown, also setting a new record of 9:42.7. Kenyon pulled a surprise by winning the low hurdles, and McAtee went 13 feet to take the pole vault. Tillotson again captured first in the discus, and Smith and Tillotson finished "one-two" in the shot-put. Hayden set a new college record in the javelin with a

heave of 182 feet, $1\frac{1}{4}$ inches. The meet was not decided until the last event, when Abbott of Notre Dame defeated Hackney of State by six inches in the half-mile to take the necessary points for victory. Elder, the great Irish sprinter, took the 100 and 220 from Henson, but not without a struggle.

In an exhibition race, Alderman, wearing the colors of the Illinois Athletic Club, defeated Otto, former Ypsi star, in the 250-yard dash, setting a world's mark of :24.7 that was not allowed because of the wind.

The track team of Coach Young and his assistants, "Mike" Casteel and "Mort" Mason, won their second successive state intercollegiate crown the following Saturday, piling up 53 $\frac{16}{21}$ points, far ahead of Ypsilanti, Western State,



Detroit City College, Albion, Kalamazoo, Hillsdale, and the remainder of the state colleges. Henson carried on State's sprinting tradition by taking both the 100 and 220-yard dashes, with Lang third in the 100. Wylie and Clark were second and third in the mile, behind Potter of Ypsilanti. Kroll was second in the 440, and Roossien and Hackney were second and third in a fast half-mile. Tillotson also took a second in the discus, and was third in the shot-put, which was won by Paul Smith. Brown won the two-mile from his teammate, Will-

marth, setting a new intercollegiate record of 9:45.2. McAtee tied for first in the pole vault, the State mile team was third in its event, and Hayden and McAtee finished second and third in the javelin.

In a special 175-yard race at the state meet, Alderman won in the record time of :17.3, displacing Charlie Paddock's mark of :17.4. Lewis of Detroit City College, who later made the Olympic team, was second, with Otto of the I. A. C., third, and Robb of the University of Michigan, and former sprint champion of Scotland, fourth.

The Spartans made an impressive showing at the Eastern Intercollegiates at Cambridge, Mass., when they tied for eighth place with Princeton, with ten

points. Henson was fourth in the 220, Wylie was third in the mile, behind Luttmann of Harvard and Cox of Penn State, with Clark of Michigan State, fourth. Lauren Brown took third in a close two-mile, being nosed out by Reid of Harvard, and Hagen of Columbia.

State was barely nosed out of the Central Intercollegiate title at Milwaukee, scoring 53 points to 56 for Marquette. Notre Dame was third with 41, while Grinnell had 13, Lombard 7, Carroll 3, and Loyola of Chicago 1. State made an impressive showing in the distances, Captain Wylie setting a new C. I. C. record of 4:22.2 in the mile, with Clark second in 4:24. Brown won the two-mile in 9:37.5, also a C. I. C. record, displacing Willmarth's college record set earlier in the season. Willmarth was third in this race. In the half-mile, Hackney secured revenge on Abbott of Notre Dame by winning the race in 2:00. McAtee took the pole vault crown with another leap of 13 feet, while Smith won the shot-put with 42 feet 2 inches, and Tillotson took the discus with 129 feet 4½ inches. Carney of Marquette defeated Hayden of State in the javelin to win the meet. Henson scored well in the sprints, and Kroll looked good in the 440.

At the national intercollegiates, Henson showed surprising form by taking third place in the 220 against the cream of the nation's sprinters, while McAtee tied for fourth place in the pole vault.

Two Michigan State athletes secured national ranking in the American Honor Roll for their work during the 1928 season. Wylie was placed fifth in the mile with a best time of 4:22.2, while Brown's mark of 9:37.5 secured for him fourth place on the list of the nation's greatest two-milers.



The entire team was well balanced, with Kane and Swan doing well in the singles, and Farleman and Kane teamed in the doubles.





State won three meets in 1929 and lost three. New records were hung up in almost every event.





FRESHMAN FOOTBALL


For the first time in a number of years, a rather small squad of freshman football aspirants reported at Michigan State last fall.

Carlton Colvin, a member of the State basket ball squad one year ago, coached the team, and introduced the VanAlstyne style of play to the yearlings.



The club sponsored a home-made pumpkin pie sale which was very enthusiastically supported.


The local club is combining with all college and high school clubs in the state to support a scholarship for a Home Economics student in a foreign land.





THOMAS L. SHERBURNE

LIEUTENANT COLONEL, CAVALRY (DOL)

Colonel Sherburne was born in Louisiana in 1877. He attended the public schools of that state and entered Louisiana State University where he was a senior at the outbreak of the Spanish-American War.

He left college to join the 1st Louisiana Infantry as a Second Lieutenant. He served throughout the Spanish-American War, going to Cuba, and attaining the rank of First Lieutenant. At the end of the war, Colonel Sherburne returned to his college, where he was graduated in 1899.

On July 5, 1899, he was appointed a Second Lieutenant, 33rd U. S. Infantry. He was then sent with his regiment to the Philippine Islands, where he remained in active service during the entire Philippine Insurrection.

In 1901 he was appointed to the Artillery Corps, where he served for one year, when he was transferred to the Cavalry. In 1902 he served a tour in Alaska. Two more tours in the Philippine Islands were given Colonel Sherburne, these starting in 1905 and 1910. In 1915 he was sent to Panama.

In 1916 he entered Mexico with the 5th Cavalry as Commanding Officer of Troop E of that regiment, a part of the punitive expedition.

In February, 1918, he went to France as a Major in the Signal Corps. He served as Signal Officer of the 2nd and 4th Divisions. In France his service was as follows. Aisne-Marne Defensive, Aisne-Marne Offensive, Champagne-Marne Offensive, Saint Mihiels, the Argonne, First and Second Army Defensive Sector and the Army of Occupation in Germany.

Upon his return to the United States he was an instructor at the Cavalry School and entered the Field Officers' Class, from which he was graduated in 1921. In the fall of 1921 he entered the Command and General Staff School at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, from which he was graduated in 1922.

In 1922 Colonel Sherburne came to Michigan State College. Here he took over the R. O. T. C. and started the work of raising the standard to the place where it was soon recognized as one of the best units in the country. Largely through his personal efforts he secured from the legislature an appropriation for the Demonstration Hall, which will remain an everlasting monument to his energy and splendid personality. Not only did Colonel Sherburne give to the Military Department of the College a new standard of efficiency but he has endeared himself to the hearts of the students of each class through his years as commandant here. The people of East Lansing and Lansing, as well as the staff of the college, have come to love him.

It is with deep regret that we see him leave us this year, after seven years of faithful service given to Michigan State College. The entire student body wishes him joy and success as he departs to take up his work at the Army War College at Washington, D. C.

U. S. A. OFFICERS STAFF (DOL)

The Instructional Staff of the R. O. T. C. at Michigan State College is at present composed of nine officers. They are detailed to this unit for a period of four years, but may, if they so desire, make application for an extension of leave. Six of these officers are remaining at State for at least another year, while three are leaving to take up duties elsewhere.

The present staff consists of Lieutenant-Colonel T. L. Sherburne, Cavalry, who is leaving State after seven years of service; Major Thomas-Stahle, C. A. C., who is finishing his second year here and who will remain; Captain Hardie, C. A. C., who is at present finishing his fourth year with this unit but who has been granted an extension of leave; Captain Flagg, C. A. C., who is now completing his second year; Captain Larson, Cavalry, who is remaining after four years' service on the campus; Captain Chase, Cavalry, who is rounding out his third year; Captain John, Infantry, who, after five years here, is leaving for Honolulu after the closing of the spring term; Captain Hinwood, Infantry, who is also going to Honolulu to complete his foreign service; and First Lieutenant Rockafellow, who is now completing his second year with this unit.

Home is in St. Paul, Minn. Attended St. Thomas College and the St. Paul College of Law, from which he was graduated in 1914. Practiced law in St. Paul until 1917, when he entered the Regular Army as a second lieutenant of cavalry. Promoted to first lieutenant in 1919 and captain in 1920. Graduated from the Troop Officers' Course at the Cavalry School, Fort Riley, Kansas, in 1925. Reported for duty with the Cavalry Unit at Michigan State College in June, 1925.



CAPTAIN C. R. CHASE, Cavalry

Graduated from University of Kansas in 1917 with B.S. degree. Commissioned Second Lieutenant of Cavalry, October 26, 1917, assigned to 10th Cavalry at Fort Huachuca, Arizona. Promoted to First Lieutenant, March, 1918. Sent to Army of Occupation in Germany in June, 1919, and returned to United States in December. Assigned to 2nd Cavalry at Fort Riley, Kansas, from 1920 to 1922. Cavalry School graduate in 1923. Assigned to 3rd Cavalry at Fort Ethan Allen, Vermont, from June, 1923, to October, 1926. M. S. C. since October, 1926. Promoted to Captain of Cavalry, August, 1928. Member of Beta Theta Pi Fraternity at University of Kansas and Phi Delta Society at M. S. C.

The Reserve Officers' Training Corps is organized under the National Defense Act of 1920, and has for its purpose the qualifying of selected students at civil educational institutions as officers of the Organized Reserve. Students successfully completing both basic and advanced courses are offered commissions in the Officers' Reserve Corps, acceptance of which is optional.

Two years of basic training are required of all male students at M. S. C. who are physically fit. The M. S. C. department is organized into Cavalry, Coast Artillery, and Infantry units, the total enrollment being about 1,100.

Each year a cadet colonel, one or more lieutenant colonels, and the unit majors are selected by the corps officers. The selection is made on the basis of scholarship as displayed in military department work, appearance and leadership, and all-around executive ability.

It is customary for the three units to alternate in furnishing a cadet colonel, the lieutenant colonels coming from the branches not furnishing the colonel.

CAVALRY UNIT

Upon the Cavalry rests the responsibility of all scouting and reconnaissance work. Although it is especially adapted to these missions, due to its extreme mobility, it is no less adapted to the other phases of modern warfare, for the equipment of Cavalry not only includes individual rifles, pistols, and sabers, but machine guns, machine rifles, and armored car troops as well.

The Cavalry course at State consists of a general training course during the first two years, while the elective course embraces advanced equitation, a machine gun course, map reading and sketching, military history and policy, and Cavalry tactics.

Two night rides were held during the spring term, Junior and Senior, while a Cavalry demonstration was given May 8, the latter consisted of jumping, both singly and in groups, and some bareback work. In addition to these activities, the Cavalry acts as mounted escort to all notables visiting the campus.

COAST ARTILLERY UNIT

The Artillery is organized to aid in the support of the Infantry in its various movements and maneuvers.

Cadets in this unit are limited to those taking Engineering in college. The present enrollment is: Seniors, 43; Juniors, 31; Underclassmen, 276.


The basic course covers general artillery drill and instruction in the use of the artillery weapons. The advanced course consists of field engineering and tactics, Military Law, Military History, and Firing Problems. Instruction covers practically all the weapons used in the coast artillery from the .22 calibre rifle to the 16-inch railroad howitzer.

The unit is equipped with two anti-aircraft machine guns; one 75 mm. anti-aircraft gun mounted on a truck; one 155 mm. field gun drawn by a ten-ton tractor, and all necessary range finding apparatus.

On May 8 the Artillery gave its annual demonstration. A squadron of pursuit planes from Selfridge Field was present and simulated targets on which the anti-aircraft guns were used. This was followed by a demonstration of aerial maneuvers by the Selfridge squadron.

INFANTRY UNIT

The work is both practical and theoretical, and while basic infantry training consists of rifle practice and drill, the advanced work offers courses in sanitation, infantry weapons, military tactics, leadership, map reading, military history and policy, and the advanced military sciences.


All rifle teams are under the instruction of this department, and a great interest is shown in the work.

The annual Infantry demonstration was given May 15, the day Governor Green reviewed the troops. The demonstration showed a platoon in attack, the taking up of the battle formation as in regular warfare, with the conditions simulated as near as possible through the use of pyrotechnics, smoke, rifles, machine guns, automatic rifles, 3-inch trench mortars, and the 37 mm. gun.
