















































Registration is a time of frustration for most students and of fun for very few. The whole process begins with early enrollment. During Finals Week students pick up their schedule cards to find out which classes they have received. At this point, the students either continue through registration, paying fees and filling out cards; or they enter "the pit" to spend time begging their way into classes.












Moving-In Fall Term 1974

Each year more than 17,000 students move into the MSU dormitories. The moving-in process is not an easy one. Station Wagons, U-Haul trailers and trucks are filled to the top as students move almost all of their worldly goods. Parents and younger brothers or sisters march back and forth with their arms loaded with anything from books to stereo equipment. Returning students rush to greet their old friends while new students tour the dorms to locate themselves in their new homes.

MSU again faced a problem of overcrowding in the dorms when an increased number of applicants for residence halls forced the university to triple more than 1200 rooms. A decision by the Board of Trustees alleviated part of the problem. During the summer it was announced that for the 1974-75 year sophomores would be allowed to live off campus.

Co-ed floors by suites was a new lifestyle for a few floors in three of MSU's dorms. Students involved in the new option were generally pleased and called the atmosphere a healthy one. Other dorms hope to be included in the option next year.

Co-ops: Not Just a Cheap Place to Live



Cooperative housing has become the answer for those students who find living units elsewhere too expensive. This, however, is not the only consideration for choosing a coop.


Coops are now exerting more effort towards demonstrating to other students the ideas on which their organization is based. The philosophy of coops springs from Robert Owen's utopian idea that the best human characteristics are developed by cooperation, not competition.

All coops elect officers who coordinate activities, arbitrate disputes, make the work schedule and work with the main office in the Student Services Building. Coops are run by democratic control with each member carrying one vote. Individuals are responsible for three to five hours of house duties per week.

Cooperatives do not only involve living units but also include the Wolfmoon Food Coop, the Co-optical, an Auto Coop and a Bicycle Coop. A cooperative exists solely for the purpose of supplying some service to its members and not for making a profit.



Lower Cost of Houses Lure Students







Students who are looking for a place to live off campus often choose to rent a house because of its size and privacy.

One of the main advantages of renting a house is that most of the residents can have a single room, decorate it to their own liking and still avoid high rent. However, finding furniture for all the rooms sometimes poses a problem.









Where Shall We Eat Again?

The rising cost of food has caused many students to find that living in dorms has actually become cheaper than living off campus. In order to economize food production, MSU recently designated different dorm complexes to specialize in the preparation of specific types of food. Brody, for example, prepares all the baked goods which are then delivered to the other residence halls.

Even though most of the dorms have grills, quick-service restaurants are very popular with students both on and off campus. Students eagerly order pizza, hamburgs, tacos, chicken or fish either in place of their regular meals or as late evening snacks.






At least a half dozen MSU farms, located south of main campus, provide students with an opportunity to conduct special research projects. Students also gain experience in farm operations. In addition to the learning experience, the farms help supply the university with products such as the cheese which is sold in the MSU cheese shop and often

served in the dorm cafeterias.

The College of Agriculture and Natural Resources offers about 20 degree programs in areas such as Agricultural Biochemistry, Agricultural Engineering, Animal Husbandry, Crop Science, Dairy Science, Fisheries and Wildlife, Parks and Recreation, Resource Development





The Colleges of Human and Osteopathic Medicine have combined in many areas to provide their students with a better opportunity to learn.


The Gross Anatomy Lab and microbiology labs are two areas where the students are able to do research together.





College of Social Science: Study Through Involvement






The College of Social Science offers 17 degree programs which provide their students with a working knowledge of human behavior and social institutions.





The College of Engineering offers degrees in eleven majors including the professional fields of mechanical, civil, electrical, chemical, agricultural and metallurgical engineering.

National programs provide research projects for students to work on either individually or as a group. Scholarships are often presented to the leaders of these research projects.

Students of the department follow programs that will help them keep up with the continually changing field of engineering.





The department of Health, Physical Education and Recreation offers a variety of classes for students at MSU. Many students participate in the classes to have a break from routine lectures and to keep in shape. Other students take the classes to fulfill their graduation requirements. New classes like Neuromuscular Relaxation have promoted a renewed interest in the HPR department among both majors and non-majors.







Kresge Art Center






The Kresge Art Center provides facilities for MSU art students and enthusiasts. Classrooms and studios give artists space to work on their drawings, paintings, sculptures and other projects. Most instructors place the finished work on display. The center also includes a gallery which exhibits both touring and permanent collections.

Music Students Gain Experience

Students majoring in music may earn degrees in Applied Music; Theory and Composition; Choral, Instrumental or Stringed Instrument School Music; Music Literature and Music Therapy. The Department of Music requires most of its students to present recitals or participate in internships before they graduate. This is to give the students some practical experience. Organized groups within the department present concerts each year to both on and off campus audiences.





Residential colleges provide students with a smaller college community within the larger University. Integration of the students' curricular and extra-curricular activities is brought about by having classrooms, faculty offices and housing under one roof. MSU's three residential colleges offer students an alternative to the traditional undergraduate program.

Lyman Briggs College is geared for students interested in science and math oriented programs. The curriculum is varied to enable study and experimentation in science, mathematics and sociology.

Justin Morrill College places greater emphasis on the teacher as a partner working with students in their educational experience. Experimental programing consists of courses in fine arts, humanities, social sciences, natural sciences and writing.

James Madison College seeks to identify and analyze public policy problems. Students develop communication skills along with the ability to think through complex issues of an international, judicial or socio-economic nature.



He is presently a member of several boards of directors including the Ford Motor Co., the Burroughs Corporation, the Rockefeller Foundation, and the Agriculture Development Council.




International Programs Encourage Involvement



Campus radio stations serve the students who live in the dorms. Each dorm complex has a radio station which provides its residents with entertainment, news and special programs. Frequently, stations will have contests in which pizzas or movie tickets are given away as prizes.

Radio stations also provide practical experience for the students who run them. Some students work for enjoyment while others plan to seek a career in the broadcasting field following graduation.

WMSN, located in the Student Services Building, serves the whole campus. The three dorm complex stations are WBRS in Brody, WEAK in Wonders and WMCD in McDonel.

Coffeehouses: Informal Entertainment





Coffeehouses have gained popularity in the last few years. This increase has been reflected in a greater demand for more coffeehouses in the dorms. Students often join together in the dorms to create their own programs. Sometimes these coffeehouses are planned as finals-week breaks.

Mariah, a branch of the MSU Pop Entertainment program, presents many distinguished folk and blues artists in intimate settings. The program is run entirely by student volunteers.

Four Corners Coffeehouse provides entertainment for those dorms that call and wish to set up a program. They have a list of students with talent who wish to perform when the opportunity arises.

All of the coffeehouses are organized on a non-profit basis. Organizers hope to encourage students to further develop their talents and to share them with others.

Free University

Interested in sharing your knowledge with others? The Free University is the place to go. Established in the 1960's, the Free U remains an outlet for education in non-structured surroundings, providing courses outside of and in supplement to today's liberal arts curriculum.

Free U operates on two basic assumptions. One, that the desire for knowledge should spring from an

aroused interest in the subject matter rather than an external stimulus (i.e. grade point). Two, that the Free U can serve as a channel for communicating greater awareness and understanding of individuals by working with constant growth in a small community setting.

The Free University is not officially affiliated with MSU, but it receives financial support from ASMSU, the student government.












Concerts Satisfy Many Tastes






Comedian Danny Thomas, founder of ALSAC, attended the game along with folk singer Josh White Jr. who led the national anthem.


Most students acquire extra money from one source or another. This money is not usually spent at the University but on Grand River Avenue.







Experience, Enjoyment, and Money



Rallies and demonstrations were not prevalent on campus this year, but there were a few issues which seemed to bring controversy.

The United Farm Workers were looking for support from the University in boycotting non-union lettuce as they gathered near Beaumont Tower to talk to interested people. Supporters of the Veterans' Bonus Proposal also assembled at Beaumont to urge students to vote for the proposal in November. The measure passed, providing Vietnam veterans with more money.

The Union Building lobby hosted several groups which were reaching out for support of their causes. Among these groups were the Wounded Knee Defense Fund and supporters of the abolition of the CIA.

A small group of MSU students joined together to form the Student Workers Union. Tim Cain, president of ASMSU, was one of the main organizers of the union. Because of his involvement, some people were interested in ousting Cain from his position on the ASMSU Board; but they were unsuccessful. Nevertheless, Cain's unionization attempts met with little support from most students.

Waste Control Authority, an operation devoted to recycling paper, cardboard and plastic, began Fall Term 1972 with three student employes and a rented U-Haul trailer. The program has expended to over 80 student workers and four vehicles.

A new phase of WCA, Project Recovery, will save the university money and provide more student employment opportunities. The project will employ workers for a new warehouse and for waste pick-up. Waste is delivered to the warehouse where it is sorted before being bailed and sold to companies.

Waste Control has 13 collection sites on and off campus and about 300 waste barrels in campus offices. Off campus, the Authority has three collection bins for glass and one for cans.

The Department of Television and Radio, Alumni office and offices for Union Board activities are also in the building.



DPS — U and the Law



The Department of Public Safety provides several services for MSU. Police officers patrol campus in order to keep activities under control. Often the department conducts programs on self-defense for interested students.

The Records Office issues all permits and gate cards. Students and faculty-staff members must register their cars, motorcycles and bikes here if they plan to operate them on campus. This office also handles complaints about all student parking violations.

During Fall Term 1975, the department will move to a new building which is being built near the Audiology and Speech Sciences Building. The quonset huts, those "temporary" shelters which have housed the department for years, will soon be destroyed.


Campus Mobility Improving for Handicapped



Handicapped students and faculty-staff members have special problems as they try to move around campus. In the past year, MSU has made several changes that make mobility easier. Ramps and curb cuts are the most noticeable of the changes. The Office of Programs for Handicapped Students has been instrumental in planning many of the ramps and curb cuts as MSU starts the construction of new buildings.

The University provides transportation for those confined to wheelchairs at the cost of about \$160 per term to the individual. The van used for this is outdated and does not accommodate all of the wheelchairs. It is hoped that in the near future better lifts can be purchased.

Blind students at MSU were presented with braille maps this year, making the maze of sidewalks on campus less confusing. The maps, made at the Michigan Transcribing Service at Southern Michigan Prison, in Jackson, cover the central area of campus.





Spartans Back to the Big Time



It was a typical autumn day in early November. Spartan Stadium was overflowing, filled to the extreme. Over 80,000 people were in attendance, and millions more sat in front of their color televisions opening beers, chewing on potato chips, preparing themselves for another Ohio State victory. But something happened between the kick-off and the final gun. Some forty men, all dressed proudly in green and white, came together to prove they were a football team. Some forty men beat the unbeatable. Some forty men sent out a nationwide message - Michigan State is back!

There was more to the season than the Ohio State game. MSU opened with a 41-7 rout of lowly Northwestern and then shut-out Syracuse 19-0. A 56-14 shellacking from UCLA left the Spartans bruised and battered; but against a highly-ranked Notre Dame team State fought back unmercifully after giv-

ing the Irish two easy touchdowns in the first half, only to lose 19-14. In nearby Ann Arbor the Spartans again gave up early TD's and lost to arch-rival U of M 21-7. The trip to Illinois resulted in a disappointing 21-21 tie, but the team returned home to annihilate Purdue 31-7 in front of an enthused Homecoming crowd.

At Wisconsin, State continued its flawless play, defeating a good Badger squad 28-21 before facing number one ranked Ohio State. The Spartans edged Archie Griffin and company 16-13. State then beat a scrappy Indiana team 19-10 and demolished lowa 60-21 in the final contest of the year.

Michigan State finished third in the Big Ten with the tie against Illinois keeping them from a three-way tie for the championship. MSU also ended the year ranked in the nation's top twenty. For the Spartans there was no trip to Pasadena in 1974, but next year





Spartans Fizzle Out, End Season in 5th Place





Hockey caught on like wildfire on campus this past season. With an MSU team that was number one in the nation for a major portion of the campaign and with the opening of Munn Ice Arena, this enthusiasm was quite naturally expected.

The Spartans started their season by winning 7 of their first 9 outings including two key, away victories over Michigan Tech. After Bowling Green edged the Spartans 5 to 4 it was uphill for the hockey team as they won 11 out of their next 12 clashes. The tough third-period play that the Spartans became known for ended with injuries to center Steve Colp and defensiveman Kelly Cahill. Then the balloon burst and the Spartans proceeded to drop 8 of their last 11 games to plummet from first down to a fifth place finish in the Western Collegiate Hockey Association, WCHA.

In the post-season action the Spartans faced Wisconsin and earned a berth into the second round of the WCHA playoffs by defeating the Badgers 7 to 4 after losing 5 to 4 in the third period the night before. With that victory the Spartans clinched a bid at the finals as they tallied the most goals in the series.

State Starts Fast and Then


Michigan State's basketball team opened the season with the specter of Mike Robinson, the graduated all-time leading scorer in Spartan history, hanging over their heads. Could MSU compile a winning season without Robinson's scoring punch? The team answered that question quickly, sweeping their first five opponents and finishing Christmas break with a 6-2 record. It seemed State had survived Robinson's graduation and were on the way.

But down in the lockerroom a number of the players were unhappy with Coach Ganakas and his starting lineup. A freshman from nearby Holt, Jeff Tropf, had captured a starting spot some of his teammates felt he did not deserve. This and other petty grievances came to a head before the Indiana game, resulting in the suspension of ten varsity members. Surrounded

by a screaming sell-out crowd, the ten walked out of Jenison a few minutes before the opening tip, leaving Ganakas with a motley crew of JV's and Tropf to face the likes of Quinn Buckner and Steve Green. The Spartans of the day were no match for the number-one Hoosiers, losing by the largest margin in MSU history.

A day later the ten were reinstated and the participants "kissed and made-up." It was back to basketball and winning. But can the 6500 avid fans forget that the suspended varsity left them and the rest of the team alone to face the toughest test MSU would receive all year? And can they forget how determined the JV's and Tropf played while those on full-rides sat in Benny White's apartment without the time or the inspiration to wear the green and white?




Hustle and Tough 'D' Make up for Lack of Height

With two devastatingly great jumpers in the forms of center Lindsay Hairston and forward Terry Furlow the Spartans have proven a basketball team does not win by height alone. A balanced attack of playmaker-guard Bill Glover, hustler Pete Davis at the other guard and high scorers Hairston and Furlow made for a tough team.

After getting plastered by Indiana during the walkout, the return of the team brought on two back-to-back victories over Ohio State and Michigan. In the land of the giants the MSU Spartans proved to be giant killers. Next year with many returning lettermen the giant killers will be tough.







At Old Ballgame Litwhiler is King


Danny Litwhiler is a perfectionist. He is also one of the winningest baseball coaches in the nation and his '74 Spartan team proved him again.

The Spartans came through last spring with a fine 23-16-1 record; yet for this fine showing they placed a mere sixth in the Big 10. This was due to a 7-8 record in league play. The Spartans lost 8 of their first 15 games because of cold pitching. But the old arms came up with 11 victories in 16 games during April. For the rest of the campaign the Spartans played .500 baseball. Capping the season, catcher Dale Frietch was selected Academic All American and coaches' All-American.

With 16 returning lettermen Coach Litwhiler predicts, "we'll be in the race next year."












Lindsay Leads Harriers


Lacrosse Looks Ahead


Tennis Team Breaks Even

The netters showed some signs of improvement last spring. This was due to the consistent play of number one single's man Larry Stark and freshman Brian Smith.



Above: Larry Stark shows good backhand form while returning a deep lob.




Grapplers Show Improvement



Panhellenic Council


















St. John's
