After his retirement from the army he devoted himself to the subject of Horology in which he first became interested in 1910 when he started his first collection of watches (which collection is in the Chamberlain Memorial Museum at Three Oaks, Mich. At the time of his death his second collection consisted of some 1400 watches and clocks, one of the finest collections in the world. He was internationally known as a horologist - his articles on that subject appeared in scientific, technical and trade journals throughout the world.

He married Olivia Langdon Woodward in 1891 who died
