

I thought it was important to include this for those who might have missed it in the latest issue of Golf Course Management (GCM) publications. There is a local connection to one of these awards. The Allan MacCurrach Jr Award. Allan MacCurrach Jr became the PGA Tour's first staff agronomist in 1974 and was the GCSAA Distinguished Service Award winner in 1994. He was a GCSAA member for 31 years and was one of the first to become a certified golf course superintendent. He was a native of Hamilton, MA, a graduate of the Stockbridge School at UMass Amherst and superintendent of the Chevy Chase Club in Chevy Chase, Maryland prior to his appointment with the Tour. Allan passed away suddenly while on a pre-tournament visit to the site of, what was called at the time, The Bob Hope Classic in Palm Springs, California. The Alan MacCurrach Jr. Award is funded by his son Allan MacCurrach III and the PGA Tour.

Allan's position with the PGA TOUR developed through his friendship with Dean Beaman, a noted amateur and professional golfer, who became Commissioner of the PGA TOUR. Beaman recognized the agronomic talent and likeable personal traits of Allan and knew these would be valuable assets moving the PGA Tour forward.

PGA Tour donates to three GCSAA programs

The organization has pledged \$300,000 to support initiatives to grow the game and strengthen the industry.

The PGA Tour has announced two major donations to GCSAA through the GCSAA Foundation. The gifts will help fund three programs: GCSAA's best management practices (BMP) initiative, the First Green STEM education program, and the Allan MacCurrach Jr. Award.

©Over five years, the PGA Tour will contribute \$250,000 to support BMP development and the First Green. From 2016-2021, the PGA Tour provided similar funding to GCSAA to administer grants to GCSAA chapters to help establish state BMP guidelines. The resulting **state BMP manuals** outline golf course maintenance practices that protect and enhance the environment and are tailored to the state's unique geographic conditions and regulatory climate. By January 2021, all 50 states had established BMPs.

Now, the initiative moves to its next phase: the creation of BMP manuals for individual golf facilities. Facility-specific BMP manuals direct and document agronomic and environmental

practices, and provide an accessible, detailed reference for golfers, lawmakers and community members that can give them a better understanding of the maintenance behind one of their local green spaces.

"The PGA Tour's generosity was key in our reaching our ambitious goal of BMPs in all 50 states," says GCSAA CEO Rhett Evans. "We thank them not only for their financial support as we move on to the next BMP step, but also for their backing of programs that help grow the game of golf and the superintendent profession like First Green and the MacCurrach Award."

First Green provides hands-on STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) education on golf courses. Each First Green field trip averages 75 students who learn about golf and the environment. For many students, these outdoor classrooms represent their first exposure to a golf course.

Editor's note: What's hosting a First Green field trip like? A Colorado superintendent shares his experience welcoming elementary school students to his turf.

The PGA Tour has also pledged \$50,000 over the next 10 years to the Allan MacCurrach Jr. Award, a scholarship that recognizes an outstanding nontraditional college student pursuing a career

in golf course and turfgrass management. The award is named in honor of the late Allan MacCurrach Jr., who became the PGA Tour's first staff agronomist in 1974. The recipient receives a \$10,000 scholarship and an all-expenses-paid trip to the annual GCSAA Conference and Trade Show.

"We believe in the work GCSAA is doing to provide environmentally sustainable maintenance practices, grow the knowledge base of superintendents and introduce young people to the game," says Paul Vermeulen, director of competitions agronomy for the PGA Tour. "We look forward to seeing these programs enhance golf's future."

Recently I viewed a tweet from Chris Donato, superintendent at Bass Rocks Golf Club that I believe deserves more than to be called a tweet. It has to do with the extremely wet conditions at Bass Rocks this season and how he has communicated this to the club's members. Chris addresses the "why" of the course wetness—wetter than some other courses. He has included video to help the viewer better understand the situation. It is one of the best explanations of wet course conditions I've seen. I recommend you click the link to pick up some ideas for a presentation you might have thought about but weren't sure how to present it. Thanks to Chris for sharing this with us. During a recent meeting of the Alliance of Massachusetts Golf Organizations (AMGO) the subject of wet conditions was brought up and how to address access to the course under Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) guidelines. The question was asked: "What do you do if golf cars are limited to golf car paths only and a person with a disability cannot walk from the path to hit the next shot? Or, how to handle a situation if no golf cars are allowed because of wet conditions?" Thanks to the follow-up of Elaine Gebhardt, Executive Director of the New England Golf Course Owners Association (NEGCOA) there is information attached that can serve as a guide if you are faced with this situation. Because of the extremely wet conditions for most of the state this year maybe this has already come up at the course you manage, and no issues arose. In the event you might be faced with this in the future, I recommend you read the following information received from Ronnie Miles, Senior Director of Advocacy for the National Golf Course Owners Association (NGCOA).

"While we do recommend operators take reasonable steps to accommodate golfers with limited disabilities, such as having the inability to walk for extended distances. However, owners and operators have a right and responsibility to protect their property from damage created by golf carts on the turf.

If the owner has allowed their superintendent to make the call and they have determined carts should not be permitted off the cart path and are unable to identify selected areas that they may drive, they are not in conflict with ADA guidelines.

If the maintenance crew is able to drive their equipment throughout the course without damaging the turf the customer may have a reasonable argument but to date, we have not

heard of any claims filed to DOJ.

The National Alliance for Accessible Golf published a tool kit that may help owners understand their rights and responsibilities.

As I state above DOJ does not specifically address this temporary problem. Because they have denied all golfers access to the course with a cart, they are not violating ADA guidelines."

GCSAA Update by Kevin Doyle



What a long, strange trip 2021 has been. This is the time of year when the job board should be filled with double-cuts and multiple rolls followed by fans, hoses, and syringing. Instead, pumping bunkers and flood rebuild seems like a daily task. The tines getting replaced are the venting variety on the aerator, not the moisture meter. I wanted to see if there were any educational or academic

resources that could be referenced to assist in the aftermath of a summer season that was cool, historically wet with minimal sunshine for weeks on end, but I couldn't really find any? I was looking to highlight changes we might see agronomically as we transition into late summer early fall. For our academics giving the newsletter a read.... consider this a hint! I did want to mention a few items including some I found when scrolling the hundreds of search mishirs.

Communication will play a critical piece moving forward. Whether it is with your owner, board, or internal decision maker, be sure to take pictures and document the struggles Mother Nature has dealt you this year. Increase in disease pressure, decrease in efficient mowing practices, labor intensive flood mitigation, and many more wet-weather related outcomes can negatively affect your budget. Superintendents do an amazing job of making these struggles appear as they never happened. Be sure to photograph and document for those with short memories.

The weird weather pattern of today will overshadow the strange temperature swings of the spring. It does not mean the timing difficulties of preventative practices for insect and weed control won't rear their ugly heads. In-season curative measures that are more aggressive than usual may be needed as a result. Be sure to accurately document and communicate the challenges posed and hopefully successes your programs provided.

Working in the rain is not fun. Rebuilding bunkers is not fun. Clearing storm and flood debris is not fun. Hand mowing acres of turf due to wet conditions is not fun. Having to do each of these multiple times a week can be demoralizing. Managing the staff who are facing these challenges with you is not the normal grind of the summer season. Think of outside the box opportunities to add a sip of sunshine to their work week to keep your staff both physically and mentally healthy.

Summer in the Northeast is almost always a war of attrition and full of surprises. Being reactive to conditions that are not the norm and excelling in the face of adversity is a specialty of golf course superintendents and their staffs. Communicating these challenges and successes are often not priorities during challenging times but can become critical down the road.
