## Turfgrass Breeding and Genetics A Vision for Success

Michigan State University has, in place, the faculty and staff to make significant progress in the area of turfgrass breeding and genetics. Much of this was made possible due to the substantial commitment of GREEN funds to hire Dr. Suleiman Bughrara as the new turfgrass breeder. Dr. Bughrara brings with him a number of research projects of interest to the turfgrass industry in Michigan. Previous research conducted by Dr. Joe Vargas in identifying disease-resistant germplasm and the genetic profile of various diseases provides a basis for breeding and genetics in turfgrass disease resistance. Disease resistance has been identified by the turfgrass industry as a major research priority. Dr. Mariam Sticklen has been active in genetic transformation of turfgrasses. The industry and MSU have partnered to purchase a microarray to facilitate progress in molecular genetics in turf and to allow Dr. Sticklen to fulfill a significant grant by the United States Golf Association (USGA).

In addition to these faculty working in turf, there are a number of faculty that are currently conducting breeding and genetics work on a more basic level. This research is of potential value to many commodity areas. The turfgrass industry supports the interaction of turf faculty with basic plant science and genetic researchers. The new turfgrass physiology position complements the breeding and genetics program in turf and facilitates this interaction between applied and basic research.

While these developments are occurring at MSU, the turf industry, through the Michigan Turfgrass Foundation, is also continuing to evolve. There is recognized excitement throughout the industry as we contemplate the potential benefits that turfgrass breeding and genetics will bring to our livelihood. As part of this excitement, we see a renewed commitment to fund-raising as we recognize the increased financial needs of this research. What we need as an industry and foundation to make fund-raising effective is a cause. We believe turfgrass breeding and genetics is this cause with the initial goal of releasing a dollar spot resistant cultivar in three to five years.

This initial goal is substantial on its own, but it is important that we identify a broader vision for the continued support of the turfgrass program as a whole. This will ensure long-term success.

The formation of a Center for Turfgrass Breeding and Genetics provides this broader vision. The Center would take a new breeding program and meld it with the past genetics work done at MSU. It also provides an umbrella for future projects in turfgrass breeding and genetics to succeed. Basic research now being performed in plant science would have a ready outlet for application. And finally, this centralized organization identifies a clear vision and goal for fund-raising activities by the MTF. Instead of fragmentation we now have a well-defined focus.

This vision statement was prepared for a grant request to GREEN in January, 2001. In addition to this overall vision, a specific short-term goal was identified to develop a disease-resistant creeping bentgrass. The MTF Board of Directors and the MSU turf faculty is pleased to announce that this project will be funded by MSU for a two-year period for \$98,510.00.

#### **MTF Research Committee Update**

Dear Members,

Here's an update as to what the MTF Research Committee has been doing. When we organized the committee it was our goal to seek out research needs, develop research priorities, improve overall communication between the MTF members and the MTF Board of Directors, recommend improvements and changes to the grant request process and explore and recommend additional funding opportunities.

So where are we one year later?

Based on the survey and lots of discussions with people in the industry we will be asking for research in the following areas: moss control, ant control and removal of grassy weeds from desirable turf.

Research priorities that have already been identified and are being further researched are:

Sports Turf Management Research (general) Trey Rogers

Biocontrol of Japanese Beetle Dave Smitley

European Chafer

"Labor Issues" was also identified as a research priority.

Communication has improved by the fact that we had a great response to the survey and since then, that message has been conveyed to the professors at Michigan State. Right now you are reading this letter. Tom Smith, MTF President, has also included an article in this newsletter. But, we still need more involvement from the membership. Don't worry we won't make you be on the committee just because you made a suggestion. Any input from the membership is always welcomed.

New Research Grant Guidelines were identified, proposed and approved by the board. Based on the "Mission Statement" of the Michigan Turfgrass Foundation, awarding of research grants is an important

Included in the New Research Grant Guidelines are revised Research Criteria, Protocol for Grant Requests, Renewal of Grants and Support Funding. Another update will include the newly approved guidelines.

As far as additional funding opportunities, the MTF has partnered with the Farm Bureau, MDEQ Great Lakes, USGA, GCSAA, The O.J. Noer Foundation, and GREEEN as well as other various sources. The MTF is contributing \$75,560.00 for the research listed above while these organizations are supporting us with an additional \$578,181. The MTF has leveraged our donations by a huge amount! That's why, if it sounds like the MTF is asking for money, they are. These partnerships that have been created generate larger amounts of research dollars that are being used for turfgrass science. Every dollar we contribute can go so much farther now.

So with that you have the current update from the MTF Research Committee.


