THE WAR TODAY

Violent hand-to-hand fighting in the streets of Singapore marked tonight the final stages of the battle for the great British bastion of the Far East.

The Japanese enemy, hurling-thousands of troops and hundreds of planes into the battle, tonight battered his way into the city area proper and there was begun one of the most savage conflicts of the war.

Although it appeared that only a miracle could save Singapore now, the British appearently are determined to fight to the last. The British command at Singapore disclosed that a Jap demand for the unconditional surrender of the city has gone unanswered.

The situation in the Far Pacific was the blackest tonight that it has been since the start of the war. The Dutch have admitted new landings in the Macassar area, on Celebes island.

In the Philippines, General MacArthur reported to the War department that the Japanese pressure on his lines had slackened somewhat. But the Japa apparently are merely regrouping their forces for another attack.




