Grind Across 18 More Miles of 'The Loop'

LONDON, Oct. 27 AP- Rus sian troops surging into the south Ukrainian steppes on the heels of a beaten German army captured 90 towns in an 18-mile advance in the Melitopol area today and took 30 more populated places in the Dnieper bend, Moscow announced tonight,

As German resistance broke in the northern gateway to the Crimea, the Russians farther north tightened their stranglefarther hold on the Germans in the Dnie per bend with an advance of nine miles, the Moscow communique

The Russians were storming the outskirts of Krivoi Rog, iron mine center and buckle that held together the whole German line in south Russia.
