THERE ALWAYS SEE IS TO BE A fall guy in every crowd. He is the proverbial butt of all jokes who is left standing in the rain when the doors of a loaded bus are slam-med in his face. He is the little guy who med in his race. He is the title key walk works hard and watches the big beys walk off with the prizes. If you have ever had any of these experiences, move over, Bud, and let me tell you the Little Eva story of the shivering MSC Department of Journalism.

Here is a rapidly expanding college department that is admittedly the best in the state of Michigan, and ranks among the first eight in the nation. Yet, it has had to stand by and watch almost every other MSC Department receive a stamp of approval for new buildings

A new natural science building costing one million dollars will open its doors next fall term. An electrical engineering building costing \$750,000 and a new ag-ricultural building costing \$475,000 will begin operations at the same date. As of yesterday, the journalism depart-mental head, Prof. A. A. Applegate, had not been consulted as to future plans for a journalism building.

This lack of equipment is the major reason behind the inability of the "American Association of Schools and Departments of Jour-nalism" to place Michigan State on its accred ited list of journalism schools. Unless finite administrative action is taken in the near future to O.K. some kind of expansion program for State's journalism department,) journalism majors are in danger of graduating from an unaccredited college.

The irony of the situation is that it wouldn't even take a new journalism building to put State on the accredited list. Under the new classification system of the AASDJ, State merely must acquire approximately 15 new typewriters, sets of plates and type for advertising classes, radio equipment, and photographic darkrooms. Applegate esti-mates that to do this would cost only five to _six thousand dollars.

For several years there has been a standing need in the Department of Journalism for a separate building, hous-ing a complete newspaper printing plant with classrooms and office space. The department now is crammed into a 2 x 4 corner of the Union Annex. It does not

Of State's approximately 13,500 students, home de almost 1,000 of them are taking journalism Gallery courses. The journalism staff now employs oight full time instructors and professors who have a total of 84 years of actual news-paper or advertising work. Yet, only five classrooms have been assigned to the department for journalism classes this term.

Supplies such as typewriters were difficult to obtain during the war. To some extent, that difficulty remains. But as each day of reconversion goes by, these necessities of a journalism school's life become more readily

State's journalism department has surmounted many obstacles to become known as a good journalistic school. But it needs help and cooperation from the higher-ups to bring it out of the cold.

The inability of the AASDJ to accredit MSC as a school of journalism is a direct challenge to college authorities to end the "beg, borrow, or steal" era which has made tough jeb for the journalism department to raise itself to its present rank



When reminded that a recent story on the sport pages of a Detroit newspaper placed the Jenison award in jou-pardy because of the NCAA's recent rulings regarding scholarships to athletes, the president smiled and state that Michigan State never has had anything to hide on this particular aid to athletes.

The president reiterated what he had said previously as far as action on the ruling goes. "Naturally we will abide by accepted motions of the governing body regarding scholarships in the future, but the Jenison award will stand as is for the present time," he said.

"We do not call it a scholarship, It is actually an award to an athlete who has athletic ability and who can keep a "C" average in his college work.

"If a man comes here on the Jenison award and fails to earn a varsity letter in his field of athletic endeavour, he still maintains the scholarship providing he earns a one point average in classes," the president said.

In other words, the recent charges and statements on the enison awards were answered by the men who should know, with smiles and comparative silence. The words spoken by these men lead me to believe there is nothing radically wrong with the Jenison award.

When accusations are made and you know you have nothing o hide, why defend yourself with shouts and protestations. We are inclined to agree with this philosophy

Michigan State has always been free and above board with the award. The president in his address to the NCAA meeting a year ago said he definitely sought a lessening of pressure groups and "Downtown Clubs" which tampered with athletes and their finances.

He favored a deemphasis of over-paid athletes, He is still very much for the idea and that is why we here have nothing to fear with the Jenison athletic award to Spartan athletes.


