



THE terrifying meaning of a telegram which began, "The Secretary of War regrets to inform you..." was brought back into sharp focus last week when the first boatload of American war dead was brought home to a final resting place.

Michigan was home to 16 of these men. One of them attended Michigan State col-fore before he took up arms to fight for his country. He was Edwin J. Fielder, '36, of Lansing, who died in combat in China on Sept. 28, 1944, Sixty-four hundred men and women, students and alumni of Michigan State, served in the armed forces. One out of every 19 last their lives.
