

State's Campus Organizations

It's difficult to look about the campus and not sealize that in a few years State has grown from a medium sized school to a Women's organize giant among American universities.

The enrollment now shows signs of leveling off to a point where a normal student population of between 12 and 15 thousand students will be in attendance. Probably it is now possible to stand back and evaluate me of the changes that have taken place during the period of expansion on campus. The character of the student body has changed to a great degree.

It is our belief that the student body en-

joys less responsibility today than ever be-fore in the government of its own affairs. This might be a result of the preoccupation of the administration with physical prob-lems of expansion. It is a responsibility of the student groups to see that they are not deprived of rights and responsibilities that are justly their own.

Yet a thorough investigation of student organizations reveals that student leader-ship may not have developed to meet the challenge of the transition. Many student organizations exist but do not function. Many others spend their time with insignificant details and fail to approach real activities with real action.

Many points of the survey are concerned with "dead wood" in campus groups, and with the seeming lack of cooperation between student council and the mass of other organized students. Perhaps the council would effectively clear itself of the bottle neck of minor issues by delegating such smaller problems and duties to honoraries, men's and women's councils, and representative bodies of Greek and independent stu-

For information of all students, the following is a State News editorial survey of all major campus organizations with some suggestions as to how they might become more effective.

Union Board

Union board, student governing body of the Union, may be classified as a student organization which thus far has not developed post war leadership to cope with post war problems.

The general function of the board is to

see to it that facilities of the Union building are utilized to the best advantage of the student body. A listing of the board's activities this year would include sponsor-ing dances in the ballroom on weekends when other dances were not scheduled, supervising a bridge and a cribbage tournament, decorating the Union for Christmas season, purchasing a plaque of the college coat of arms to mount above the lower desk fireplace, and playing records of Christmas music in the Union. Members also aided in selling the College Calendar, a publication of the Union management.

However, in performing these functions the board has consistently allowed the initiative to come from the Union's administration. Miss Etoyle White, Union director of activities and Leslie Scott, Union manager, originated each of these ideas. In carrying out the ideas of the Union management it can be said that the board has done a relatively efficient job. But it cannot be said that the board has exhibited any initiative of its own or has acted truly as a representative body.

Board dances are a good illustration of the board's status. Board members collect tickets, sell tickets, arrange for publicity and sometimes play records. When an orchestra is hired it is hired by the Union administration. Even the dates of the dances are determined by the Union administration

The board was never consulted concerning the building of the new Union addition. Most board members felt quite privileged when Scott consented to show them the architect's drawings of the floor plan after construction had begun. Every change in the Union during the last year was undertaken without consulting the board. time did the board object.

Some serious defects in board membership policies will be corrected by the new constitution. Of 26 members at the present time, only one is not affiliated with a social fraternity or socurity. Under the new sys tem the independents are guaranteed at least four seats on the board of directors out of 14. A merit committee will choose other members from among applicants. But only in this respect does the new constitution make a stab at improving representation The new constitution, however, does not say ho shall make up the merit committee.

On the other hand, some few groups do fulfill their service functions, in combination with the social aspects.

The unactive organizations do little because of lack of initiative. The members are afraid to attempt any action for which there is no precedent.




