Report The Issues

Public indifference to issues of an election campaign has unhinged many a sound and stable political scientist. But if the truth is faced, it's probably a good thing. In recent years real black and white issues, those a voter can take a rational stand "fer or agin," have been as scarce as the redman on the American scene.

A modern office seeker can fare as well by taking to the ukelele as to the statute books and the legislative roll call "into colonial slaves of a new mire perialism" in which the state is

As long as there is an absence of controversial issues we suggest it's just as well, and less dangerous, to meditate on the vibretto of a candidate's tenor rather than on his political views. Political scientists suffer a perhaps undeserved martyrdom but the common man is undoubtedly less néurotic for it all,

We are not saddened by the lack of issues to wage hot political battles over. On the contrary we are delighted over this evidence of our solidarity. But let's recognize that the theme is "anything you can do I can do better" and not be misled by phony malfeasance charges. Then, if the accusations are not legitimate, let's uncover and

elect the man who can do it better.

Four yes or no choices will be listed on the Michigan Ballot Nov. 7, incidentally, which require no personality probe. Voters will be given an opportunity to register directly their opinions on the following proposed state constitutional amendments:

1: Increase of city or township residence requirement from 20 to 30 days.

2. Authorization for state to borrow a sum not to exceed \$65,000,000 to construct and equip mental and physical health institutions.

3. Control of Communism.

4. Oleomargarine controls.
