It's Up to You

Two weeks from tomorrow you will be expected to vote on the Student Government's proposed tax. How will you vote? Or will you vote at all? Do you have any strong feelings on the tax one way or the other? Or aren't you interested?

If you're not, you should be.

This issue should be of vital interest to every student on campus. If the tax goes through, the Student Government will be financed by you, and consequently you will have more say in how it should be run and how your money should be spent. But if it fails, the government will be helpless to do anything but revert back to the meaningless organization of debaters it was prior to the adoption of the new constitution.

The new constitution does not, by itself, make Student Government a workable, efficient organization. But it does give the Government the necessary power on paper. This is all any constitution can do.

There are two other things necessary, interested, hard Roberts working members, and financial backing to put the Government's program into effect. Without these two ingredients, the constitution and the Government it sets up are

The first ingredient, hard working, sincere members, The first ingredient, hard working, sincere members, is present. This is evidenced by the recent circulation of Dispute in petitions to propose the tax, the plan to put the tax on a two year trial basis, and speech campaigns by the members to explain the tax to the student body

The second ingredient, financial backing, is the crucial one. Without money, the Government can do comparatively little. With money, it can do as much as you want it to do.

This may all sound very-reasonable, and yet you may ask, "Where will my 25 cents per term go?" And that's a very good question. But if you're really interested, you'll go about finding out.

Your 25 cents will go into various expenditures which will benefit the entire student body- The Government plans to expand its pep rally program, to purchase a PA system and a movie projector for use of student organizations, to hold all-coilege convocations, to supplement the lecture-concert series with such programs as a spring concert in the bandshell. These are a few examples of where and how the money will be spent. Your representative and the speech campaigners can give you many more. And the Government is interested in knowing where you. the contributor, would like to have the money go.

You have two weeks to look further into the tax. to make your decision on whether or not you want a financially sound Student Government. Check into it and give it a lot of serious thought. We have looked into it, have watched the Government work, have criticized a great deal, and have come to believe that it would be in the best interest of the MSC student body to have the tax voted in.

Give it a try; vote it in for two years and see how it works.
