When UCLA dropped a close one to USC in the battle for the Rose Bowl, people began predicting that if Southern Cal could beat Notre Dame by a larger score than State's 21-3 margin over the fighting Irish, the USC club could then wind up the season on top of the polls.

No one ever had an opportunity to test this theory how-

ver, because Notre Dame, refusing to cooperate with the pollsters, pulled a 9-0 upset win over Southern Cal, leaving Michigan State as the only team in the country with a record impressive enough to take the title.

Georgia Tech, the only other undefeated, untied team in the country was given the second place spot in the poll on the basis of its 11 wins as against no losses, and no ties. The Rambling Wrecks picked up 36 first place votes to come up with a total point score of 2,249.

Notre Dame, although beaten by State and Pitts-burgh, and tied by Pennsylvania, still managed to nail down the third place spot in the nation by virtue of their wins over some of the country's toughest opposition, including Southern Cal, Oklahoma, and Purdue. Oklahoma received 14 first place votes, but had to be con-

tent with a fourth place finish with a total of 1,685. West Coast teams walked off with the fifth and sixth place positions as Southern Cal and UCLA got the nod from

It has been a long climb up the football ladder of success.

Eisenhower's Cabinet

President-elect Dwight Eisenhower's cabinet selections, at least those up to this time, have served to cause surprise in some circles and smug "I told you so's" in others.

But one thing that Ike has done which has not surprised anybody has been his selection of business-minded men to act as his top advisors. Names such as Charles E. Wilson, president of General Motors; George M. Humphrey, president and chairman of the M. A. Hanna Co. of Cleveland; and Joseph M. Dodge, president of the Detroit Bank, dot the roster

Ike's selection of these men appears to show that he will attempt to put government on a business basis, a theory to which many businessmen will subscribe. But the efficiency of businessmen in government remains to be seen. Same of them, General Electric's Charles E. Wilson

among them, could not manage the intricacies.

Taft influence in the cabinet selection has apparently been insignificant. Only one appointee, Secretary of the Treasury Humphrey, claims out and out support for Taff

Eisenhower is known to have expressed his own opinion on at least one of the appointments. According to Associated Press reports before Thanksgiving, Senator Taft submitted three names to Ike as possibilities for the sec retary of defense job. None of the three men, Edward L. Ryerson of Chicago, B. E. Hutchinson of Detroit, or Charles M. White of Cleveland, was named.

The secretary of labor appointment, one of the three still not filled, could hinge on the outcome of the ClO and-AFL presidential elections. Ike will probably wait to see which way the labor tide turns before naming his secre

Present indications seem to show that Ike is sincere in carrying out his tax cut campaign promise. Whether or not he can combine this with continued farm support and maintenance of the defense program, will be a tough problem for his cabinet to work out.

vields the best educational tesults-as recent studies have indicated-college classrooms offer opportunities for considerable improvement, according to a study reported by the University of Illinois.

More than 1,000 college students in eight different institutions of higher learning partieipated in the study made at the pated in the study made at the university's College of Education by Prof. Ray H. Simpson and E. S. Brown and reported in a bulletin entitled "College Learning and Teaching" Results of the study indicated that in a brage percentage of college of the study indicated that in a large percentage of college classes, the teacher tends to be are autocrat and the student is evaluated chiefly on the basis of how much of what has been told him he can remember long enough to be quizzed.

Apparently, very little is being college classrooms in

done in college classrooms in the way of encouraging inde-pendent thought and research or in offering practice in reaching and trying out solutions to problems. Students are actually being taught to be dependent on teachers for systematic learning, rather than acquiring for them-selves the habit of systematic learning which will be useful after college, the bulletin says College courses rated by each

student were selected arbitrarily—in each case, the first and sec-ond classes attended by the stu-dent during the week. All of the students who participated were taking a course in education or psychology, but the courses rat-ed were not necessarily in eithor of these fields On this scale classes in edu-

tation, music and art scored the highest biological sciences, so-cial studies and physical sci-ences, Iqwest Other results not-

Required courses were scored higher in "total learning quality"

than electives.

Best learning appeared to occur in classes under instructors between 30 and 50 years of age Courses given by more than one instructor received signif-cantly higher ratings than those taught by one only, the elemen of competition appearing to af-fect teaching quality. Size of class had no significant

effect on the score suggesting that better teaching does not necessarily result from small


