Another rushing season has gone by and with it the Interfraternity Council, as far as any action being taken by that body in regard to the enforcement of rules, is concerned. Flagrant violations have been reported from all quarters by people in a position to know, but nothing has been done about it. The teeth have apparently grown dull and interest in the matter entirely lost by the council-either that or ignorance on the part of the council for they are the only two factors that can be responsible and we believe the council is far from ignorant.

With such a condition existing, it is high time that the council either rise from its lethargy or be frank about the matter and admit that disciplinary action is impossible.
