The East Lansing city council will hear for the third reading Monday night a proposed ordinance restricting hitch-hikers on the streets of East Lansing. As the proposed ordinance is worder, and as it is interpreted by J. P. Hackett, chief of police. it is a wise move and one that should be rigidly observed by Michigan State students.

The proposed ordinance reads, "It shall be unlawful for any person to stand in any street or roadway for the purpose of soliciting a ride from the operator of any private vehicle." The fine proposed for violation thereof is not to exceed \$100 or 90 days in fail or both.

According to Chief Hackett, persons "bumming" rides while standing on sidewalks or other points not "in" the street will not be considered as violating the law.

Many persons who do bum rides are careless about standing in the street while so doing. Bumming can be accomplished just as well from the sidewalk, eliminating possible injury to those soliciting rides or damage suits to drivers.


