## Physics Dept. Receives Device for Studying Ultra-Violet Ray

metal, thus assuring permancy of adjustment under any climatic conditions. It is mounted on a heavy iron
base, two meters long and covered with
a steel hood having convenient openings to give access to the optical parts.
