CAIRO, Nov. 2 (AP)—Prime Minister Sir Ismail Haniya today gave a vote of confidence to the Egyptian Parliament, which had voted to support the British-French invasion of Egypt.

The vote was taken in a session of the Parliament which was held in the presence of the Prime Minister.

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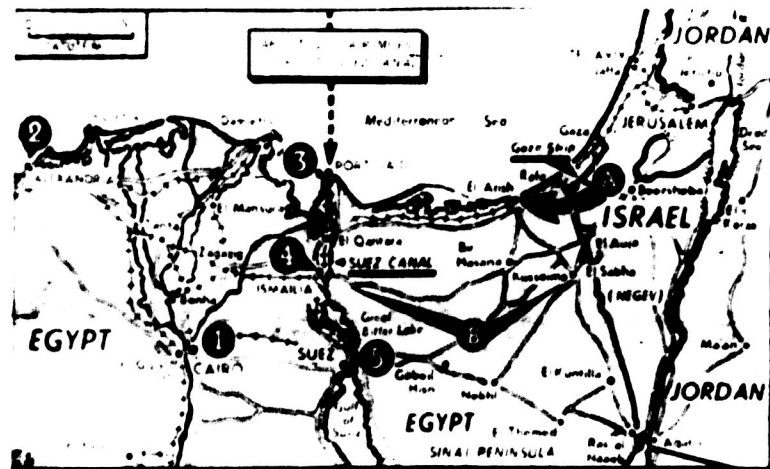
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Egypt claimed British-French air attacks hit Cairo, Alexandria, Port Said, Ismailia, and the city of Suez, but Britain denies bombing Cairo. In the Gaza strip area, an Israeli attack was aimed at El Arish on the Mediterranean shore. Apparently designed to cut off Egypt from the strip, Israel has captured the Sinai Peninsula.

Prices will be short because the huge volume of tonnage that used to move through the canal will now have to go the long way around skirting the Cape of Good Hope at Africa's southern tip. For the average merchant ship this will mean three extra weeks at sea for a one-way trip.

The Suez Canal is a vital link in the world's shipping lanes. It provides a shortcut between Europe and Asia, and is used by a large number of ships.

Over Intervention

U.S. Doubt of Allies Grows Every Hour

With every passing hour, the suspicion grows in this country that Great Britain and France connived with Israel to set a trap for the Middle East tinderbox. Immediately apparent that the two powers, if not actually guilty of urging Israel to launch her sudden attack upon Egypt, at least had been forewarned of the invasion.

There are the people who get a thrill out of breaking out for a deadline, who do their shopping on Christmas Eve, who pay their income taxes at 11:59 p.m., who wait for an airplane for an hour before taking it.

There are a number of the above species, who have not gotten around to making an absentee ballot for the fall election.

There are a few who obtained your ballot, but forgot to put out back, and you in the morning to vote.

Absentee ballots must be in the hands of your city or township clerk by the time the polls close Tuesday evening. Otherwise they won't be counted. The election isn't a ruselette slogan contest where the letter "must" be postmarked before midnight, November 6.

Many, then, and words have been printed explaining why all eligible American should vote. If you haven't learned that lesson yet, with world tensions calling for the best leadership America can provide, you probably never will.

Don't, however, throw away your vote just because you didn't mail it in time.

Mark the ballot the way you see it, fill out the information on the envelope, stick on a few cents worth of stamps, and drop it in the nearest mailbox. Tomorrow could be too late.

Both nations had much to gain from an Israeli invasion of Egypt: Britain because she would be given an excuse to again control the Suez Canal, "angular vein of the British Empire," and France because she was smarting over a suspicion that Egypt has been feeding arms to her North African rebels.

When viewed in relation to happenings in other parts of the world, the Israeli attack could hardly have happened at a more propitious time for Anglo-French intervention.

The U. S. "leader of the peace," wrapped up in a Presidential election campaign and practically sworn to a policy of non-military foreign involvement anywhere at any time, could be counted on not to interfere.

Russia, her hand full with Eastern European satellites seeking a more spacious orbit than she was willing to provide, could be counted on to make some noise and make no move.

So the "evidence" and suspicion of our allies piles up. The suspicion is warranted, but the "evidence" is purely circumstantial, made out of thread, not manila.

There has been a resentment built up between the U. S. and the British and French. Relations have been strained. But as yet there is no concrete, definite proof that a secret Israeli British-French pact had been made prior to the Egyptian invasion. Many things can be read into the events of the past few days, but a hasty judgment or rash castigation of our allies' action must be withheld, at least for the time being.

Britain and France may have satisfied themselves that their intervention was imperative "to insure peace."

Both may feel that allegations they have been aggressors in Egypt are, in the words of the British delegate to the United Nations, "not only absurd; they are false."

But Americans, it appears, are at present all from Missouri. They gotta be shown.

As yet, Britain and France have not provided a satisfactory explanation.

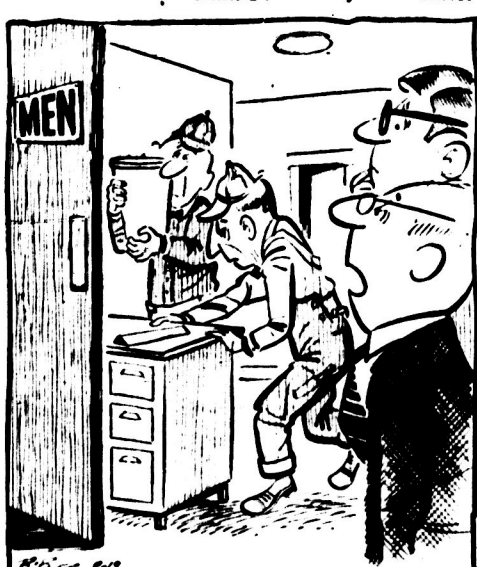

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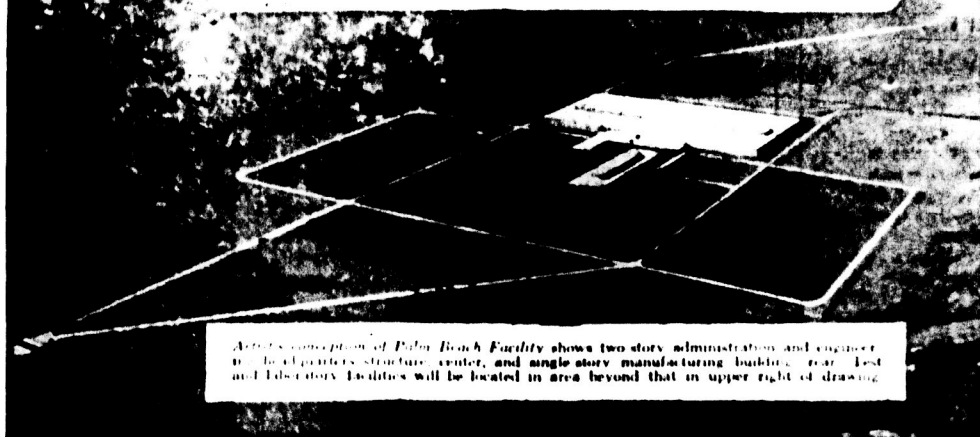
