# Szypula Has Veteran Squad Gymnasts Enter Midwest Open

The Michigan State gymnastics team will travel to the University of Chicago today for the Midwest Open which will be held today and Saturday. The Open will provide a warm-up in competition for coach George Szypula's NCAA champions. Szypula said his main interest in the match would be watching his men perform in competition. He said the Open will provide some very tough opponents for all the top teams from the midwest area will be represented in the meet. Szypula said it will be difficult to win a team title at the meet, for several of his key performers are ineligible this term. State will enter several veter-

ran performers plus members from the freshman squad. Top performers from the varsity squad who may see action are Dick Becker, Ted Muzyezko, Cal Girard, An'le Festa, and Stan Tarshis. Becker is a Junior who specializes in the free exercise event. Last year in the NCAA championships he earned second place. Szypula rates him as one of the best men in his event in the country. Muzyezko, captain of this year's team, is an all-around man. His feats have gained him a NCAA first on the parallel bars, third on side horse, and a fifth on the still rings. Girard is also a top all-around man and will add many points to the team's score in the coming season, Szypula said. Szypula recognizes Tarshis as one of the nation's top performers on the high bar. He has shown his ability by winning second in the NCAA and first place in the Big 10 meet. **Akins, Jordan Battle Tonight**  
LOS ANGELES (AP) — World Welterweight Champion Virgil Akins of St. Louis and Don Jordan, the No. one challenger from Los Angeles, went into seclusion Thursday, both in top shape for their 15-round fight for the title tonight. ## 'Profit' Plan Is Rejected By Owners

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Major League club owners Thursday unanimously rejected a players' request for a salary budget plan of 20 per cent of the 16 clubs' gross receipts. They offered a counter proposal.

The plan originally requested 25 percent of all funds received by the 16 clubs for regular season radio and television rights. They withdrew this request at a meeting with the owners last Tuesday and substituted the new proposal.

If a minor league player escapes the draft after his first season in organized baseball, he will not become subject to draft until he has been active from two to four years, depending upon his league classification.

The new proposal goes into effect next year and will operate for only one year pending a review by the clubs.
