

AGAIN THIS WEEK the controversy around reasons why the National Anthem is not played before home bas-ketball games arose. When the question was last raised, the athletic department quickly came up with the answer, and a good one at that.

caution does not apply to the MSU Fight Song Twice at the Varsity-Oldtimers game last Saturday the East Lansing High School band struck the old familiar refrain and both times the fans rose as one body—a large body with a lot of weight to shift.

THIS DISPLAY PROVES one of two things: either, first, that the fans are more willing to die for the sake of MSU than for the United States of America (which probably has more fans), or, second, that the stands wouldn't DARE collapse while the Fight Song is being played.

Foreign Languages Lacking

A NEW CURRICULUM, the humanities divisional, was recently announced at MSU. Included in this, for students with broad interests in fields of music, art, literature (English and foreign), history, philosophy and religion, is the requirement of one year's study in a foreign language. The new major offers excellent opportunity to many stu-

dents who desire a liberal, well-rounded background. The added foreign language requirement is especially

It has been noted previously that MSU is the only school in the Big 10 lacking a foreign language requirement for bachelor of arts degree in the College of Science and Arts. In only two departments on campus is a foreign language

required of majors. A number of departments recommend that students study foreign language, and some offer it as an alternative to other required courses.

BUT FOREIGN LANGUAGE study should be required

of all college graduates, ideally, for all Americans.
United States citizens, however, endowed with that traditional and inappropriate American provincialism, seem to think that their own language is enough for them, and for all the world.

Few of us, who call our country a world leader, have mastered a foreign tongue. We could not even communicate with the rest of the world's peoples. How can we expect to

WE MUST SPEAK to our world neighbors, effectively, and in a language they can understand. We cannot send ambassadors and technical assistants, or even tourists, abroad who cannot communicate to those the meet, and with whom they live and work.

Increased foreign language enrollment this year has shown that students are interested. The world situation has shown the vast need. We are waiting for the university to show its awareness by reinstating the foreign language poquirement and strengthening the foreign language offer-ing at MSU.
