Ted Lindsay Forgets Ties With Detroit

Veteran Making 'Comeback of Year'

NEW YORK (AP)—Ted Lindsay is making the comeback of the year in the National Hockey League while boosting the Chicago Black Hawks toward their highest regular season finish in 24 years.

"And," said the 33-year-old veteran of 15 pro seasons today, "it wouldn't have to be a comeback if I didn't feel sorry for myself."

"When Detroit traded me to Chicago before last season I guess I sulked for awhile," he added. "Now I've reached the point where the Black Hawks uniform means something to me too."

Lindsay is one of the all-time greats of the big league. With 358 goals, he ranks only behind Maurice Richard of Montreal (325) and Gordie Howe of Detroit (418) in the all-time competition. Ted has 57 points this season compared to 29 for the entire 1951-1958 campaign.

Lindsay also has several other distinctions. He is president of the Players Assn. This is comparable to the jobs the American and National League player representatives have in baseball.

"I guess being head of the Players' Assn. also had something to do with my bad year and there was some mental strain. It was effort I guess I should have put in playing."

However, Lindsay feels his efforts in behalf of his fellow players have been fruitful.

"The clubowners are now matching our pension money," he said. The players put in \$900 a year and the teams put in the same amount.

Ray Eliot, Veteran Illini Mentor, Will Leave Post

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. (AP)—Jovial Ray Eliot, 53, Thursday resigned as University of Illinois football coach, effective after his 18th Illini season next fall, to become the school's assistant athletic director.

A successor will not be named until after the 1959 grid season. The dean of Big 10 coaches, Eliot's resignation was accepted at a meeting of the University's board of trustees which also announced his appointment as assistant to Athletic Director Doug Mills.

Eliot, serving as head coach since he succeeded the late Bob Zuppke in 1942, had a 4-5 overall record last fall and finished sixth in the Big 10 race with 4-1.

His 17-year Illini record included 78-70-10 overall and 50-33-6 in the Big 10. Eliot's successor will be only the third

Illini grid coach since the legendary Zuppke took over in 1913 and quit under pressure after the 1941 season.

With the resignation of Eliot and last fall's move by Michigan's Bennie Oosterbaan, an 11-season Wolverine coach, to the front office, the mantle of Big 10 coaching dean now rests on Ohio State's Woody Hayes who will start his ninth Buckeye season next fall.

Eliot implied there was no pressure in his "difficult" decision to resign.

"It is always difficult to decide that one will leave the firing line of the fierce competition which is Big 10 football," he said.

Among the first mentioned as a probable successor was Chuck Studley, 30, an Illini line coach since 1955 and captain and guard on Eliot's 1951 Rose Bowl team.

Most attention during the games will be centered at games where both Robertson and Bozer will be in action. Kansas State has the best record in the college's history, a 20-game unbeaten streak longest in the nation. The cats were beaten by Br Young, 77-68, in their 28th of the season.

Academy Award "Best Actor"

Channel 10 Combines University, Community

With only two days before channel 10 goes on the air this Sunday, rehearsals and final preparations are going full-swing at the studios of WMSB-TV and WILX-TV.

Two full-time stations sharing a single channel is the unique situation being pioneered by MSU's educational station WMSB and Television Corporation of Michigan's WILX.

"This will bring the educational resources of the university and the community, and the commercial and network resources of the commercial station together for a combined service that is greater than either could produce individually," said Dr. Armand Hunter, director of broadcasting at MSU.

The programming schedule for WMSB promises a wide variety from TV classrooms to ladies' shows and comprehensive news coverage.

"Science and Decision Making," a program that will make a systematic inquiry into the problems which must be faced in the atomic age, opens Monday.

Dr. Lewis Berby, professor of philosophy at MSU, will conduct this weekly non-credit series of 10 half-hour shows.

Bob Downey, graduate of MSU, has been news editor for the university's stations since 1956. He is producer of WMSB's weekly program, "Special Report."

Bob Shackleton, a 1948 graduate of MSU and sports editor of WMSB, will feature university athletic events on his half-hour Tuesday night show, "Spartan Spotlight."

One of the highlights of his program will be the showing of sports movies of Spartan games

dating back to 1936. Some of them show Spartan stadium when it was but one low circle of bleachers surrounding a playing field that sat in the midst of cow barns and farm land.

Next Tuesday Shackleton plans to have as his guest basketball coach, Fordy Anderson, with films of the NCAA playoffs.

George Szypula, Spartan gymnastics coach, will also be on with team members and Canadian Olympic star, Ernestine Russell. She will demonstrate gymnastic techniques.

University of the Air courses this spring will offer on WMSB a TV credit course in "Physics for the Atomic Age" through the Continental Classroom produced by NBC and the American Association of Colleges for Teacher Education.

The half-hour lesson series will be offered in the evening Monday through Friday.

"The Land of Play," an activity program for pre-school children, will begin at 9:30 a.m. Monday through Friday.

Mrs. Helen Shaw, an East Lansing resident with experience in little theater, work, radio and teaching, will conduct the show with stories, songs, imaginary characters and puppets.

Shaw Chorus Sings in Aud Monday Night

The Robert Shaw Chorus, which will make its appearance at MSU Monday, was founded in 1948 and is now in its 11th year of activity.

The concert will be a feature of the Lecture-Concert Series A at 8:15 p.m. in the Auditorium.

The group of 30 singers has become one of the brightest musical stars of choral work through its concert tours, radio appearances and recordings. Shaw, at 42, has not only won universal fame as a choral director but has also conducted many of the nation's leading symphony orchestras.

At present he is associate conductor of the Cleveland orchestra, where he will conduct more than 30 concerts this year. He is guest conductor of the Boston Symphony Orchestra, which he will lead in several programs in Boston as well as on tour.

Robert Shaw stepped into fame in 1941 when, at the age of 25, he formed a group of amateurs under the name of the Collegiate Chorus and presented them at a concert in Town Hall in New York. Typical of Shaw's attitude toward music, it was a concert devoted to the works of a contemporary composer, the American composer William Schuman.

At 8 p.m. Saturday Series Slates Colorado Film

Dr. Alfred Bailey will present his all-color travel program, "Colorado Through the Seasons," at 8 p.m. Saturday in the Aud. The program is a feature of the university's World Travel Series.

A pictorial account of Colorado from the plains to the high mountains, "Colorado Through the Seasons" was given its premiere showing before members of the National Geographic Society in Washington.

Bailey, director of the Denver Museum of Natural History, has traveled extensively and is well known for his outdoor photography and articles on natural history.
