

Students Urged to Act on ROTC Issue

WE HAVE BEEN ASKED how ROTC can be changed from its present compulsory status to a voluntary program. There is no exact answer to this problem other than the one we made the other day that any action in this direction will have to be initiated by students.

The University of Minnesota was the first land-grant college to eliminate compulsory ROTC, Beginning with student protests and the formation of an Anti-Compulsory Military Drill League, the Minnesota campaign grew into student mass meetings, circulation of petitions among faculstudents, state legislators and citizens of the state, and finally focusing on the Board of Regents.

A similar campaign at Pennsylvania State eventually led to eliminating compulsory ROTC there. The means used Penn State were the same as at Minnesota. Student paints grew into an organized effort to place ROTC on


