LOOSE MANAGEMENT

Experience is a dear teacher, but by experience we may learn. Even if improvement cannot be made in events of the moment, then by a probing of those weak spots in current happenings we can plan a smoother future for ourselves, and advise and

forewarn those who come after us.

These time-worn platitudes are self-evident and are followed every day purely from the use of common sense. The only reason that they are set down here is to show how woefully weak college people are when it comes to using those grains of common sense on financial planning of the social budgets. Altogether too much leeway is allowed in whom we repose our faith for the proper execution of these monetary measures.

Very seldom in the history of the four years a class is here, has any vestige of accounting of receipts been asked for party finances. This apathy is similar to the same state of mind that appeared about thirty years ago in the political life of our nation, when political officials astounded the world in misman agement of the nation's public affairs. However, it is to be expected that the individual responsibility and moral plane of the mass of college students should be slightly above that continue this presentation of awards in including evidenced by the lesser of our political lights. But there is nothing to guarantee that irresponsible persons, both mentally and morally, will not get a hand in student finance.

As the class party budgets are now handled, the student chairman can use his own judgment as the apportionment of the expenditures. They also can use their own judgment in the final accounting of the receipts. Often the responsibility is so much divided that no one cares a great deal as to what outcome results. Party chairmen now are not required to show the number of tickets that have been sold for their affair. A few years previous an affidavit was demanded from the printer of those tickets certifying-as to the number that had been printed. This check on the accurateness of the receipts should be returned to this, the class treasurer should be held more directly responsibility or surety bond. This is exceedingly practicable as it has been required of certain student organizations in past years, and is in use in business practice for all officials of high responsibility. That these last named suggestion are workable is supported J. Schepers, college treasurer, who states that they have been used successfully in this college before, and that there is no good reason why they should not be applied to class treasurers. These methods would certainly make class leaders feel more deeply the necessity for fulfilling their trust.


