The controller said the Veterans Fund seems to be the only immediate answer to the crisis, short of taking retirement funds.

Miller added that he had no idea of touching retirement funds.

"This simply can't be done," he explained, "These funds were act up to put retired employes on a stable basis, it would be silty to upset this program."

Miller explained that mortgaging the Veterans Fund would be only a short-range, immediate solution.

"After a one-shot injection of cash by using the Veterans Fund, it becomes a tax problem of putting things on a stable basis," he said.

In a recent report on state finance. Miller wrete:

"At will be recalled, the most critical aspects of the cash shortage of the General Fund and School Aid Fund were pinpointed last year at this time (February, to be exact).

"It may be wondered why we are once more not only in a crisis position but actually with a more critical situation. The answer is simple.

"Last year, 536 million, in round figures, of one-shot, non-recurring cash was injected into
