The University - A Guide to the Future

In view of the interest in education arising in part at MSU specifically from these occurances and across the country in general, the State News has asked several distinguished members of the MSU faculty to collect a few of their thoughts about education, its aims and faults,

Dr. Herbert Weisinger, whose article appears first in our series, is a professor of English, editor of the Centennial Review of Arts and Sciences and is recognized as a distinguished scholar in the history of ideas.)

CONFRONTED BY the bewildering, and sometimes overwhelming, variety of activities which are constantly going on in a large university, we may usefully stop and spend a moment to ask, what is the function of a university? To my way of thinking, the function of a university, large its devot of its history or special oriantation, is to transmit the values of the past to the present as a guide for the future. It is therefore conservative and radical, committed, and uncommitted, all at the same time.

THE UNIVERSITY is uncommitted because it is timeless and universal. It owes allegiance neither to party, flag, Men, institutions, systems, all pass before it, nor doctri and, pre ely because they must pass, the university es-

The university is committed in the sense that it owes only to the free operation of the critical intelor small, state supported or private, and irrespective ligence, and it is even more committed to stand by the consequences of the expression of the critical intelligence. Like the little boy in the story, the university must be clear sighted and courageous enough to tell us when the

ture of the university, then it follows that it is not a place but an attitude of mind, and whatever it does ought to be manifestations and illustrations of that attitude of mind. Adjustment, entertainment, career preparation—these are not so much in contradiction to the function of the univer-

ment of the university attitude of mind, and it does not much matter how this is done, as that what is done toward that end is not to be confused with the many other things which are done in a university. The simplest and most effective way of getting the university's job done is by irritating the student mind into thought by grating it against the university mind. The teacher asks only that he be allowed to use the same old-fashioned methods of pedagogy as those employed by the coach; a way of behavior and thought taught by grounding in fundamentals, exercise, practice, and discipline. It might also be noted that on the playing field, excellence is not considered undemo-

Finally, when we come to evaluate the worth of our educational system, charity reminds us that all institutions must by their very nature coarsen the ideals which they were founded to perpetuate.
