AUSG Conducting Survey To Back Student Discount

ONE RECENT undertaking of AUSG is urged to pick up the survey questionnaire, certain to meet with the approval of every student on or off-campus without exception. Circulating now are questionnaires, which AUSG hopes, when answered by a lause segment of the student body, will justify asking Lansing and East Lansing merchants to participate in a student dis

The surveys have been delivered to living units on and off campus, asking students the amounts they spend on various ems and the stores where they do most of their trading for them. Also with a good sampling of student opinion on these fol-lowing questions AUSG hopes to set a strong case before the merchants: What, percentage of your total expenses are spent at stores in the university area? If they gave SDS (Student Discount Service) reductions would you spend more there? How much? If one merchant whom you patronize refused to join the plan, would you change merchants'

NATURALLY THE number one purpose of the discount program is to enable the student to buy more cheaply. But it also increases the student's buying power, gives widely-spread advertising for the participating merchants and encourages the student to make his purchases in the Lansing and East Lansing areas rather than in his home town. AUSG hopes to have the discount plan in effect before the big Christmas shopping season begins.

The discounts would probably not apply in some instances where stores were not allowed to give them on certain items or where special sales had greatly reduced

AUSG IS SEEKING at the present time discounts on the following items: books and stationery, clothing, cleaning and laundry, off-campus food, gas and oil and auto repairs and entertainment.

According to Reinhard Schumann who is working with AUSG on the discount plan, contracts would not be made where mer-chants offered less than a five percent discount. Contracts would be made out on a yearly basis, renewable at the end of the year if the agreements made in the contract were lived up to.

Cards showing the membership of students in the program will be delivered at living units if this plan goes into effect. On the back of them would appear the names of the participating merchants. These cards and student ID's would be required when the student made a purchase.

THE STUDENT DISCOUNT PLAN has been successfully tried in several Mid-Western and West Coast universities, according to Schumann.
