

Egyptian Archeologists Find Ancient Mummy

CAIRO (P)-Egyptian archeologists discovered a valuable, 2.300-year-old mummy recently right in a-dusty basement corridor of the Cairo Museum.

The perfectly-preserved mun-mo, in an exquisite coffin, was not listed in museum records Officials had no idea where it came from, who had dug it up, and just how it got to the mus-cial.

A report dug up from the files of the registration department of the museum showed 26,000 pieces of antiquity were missing from the museum. The report, published in 1936, collected dust for more than 20 years. Nothing was done about it.
