## Oil Pipeline Inaugurated By France

ALGERIA (AP) — Premier Michel Debre inaugurated the Sahar Oil Pipeline Sunday with a warning to nationalist rebels that France will press pacification of the strife-torn land.

The pacification will be pursued until the end . . . We will continue Algeria's economic transformation . . . After the revolution had been ended, we will put the accent on this French accomplishment which is called liberty. In this land, only France is capable of bringing real the triumph of liberty," Debre symbolically opening the control valve, Debre added.

"This pipeline reassures our confidence in the future of the country."

The premier came to Bougouni, some 100 miles from Algiers, where he spent the night after negotiating the start of the massive pipeline at the Sahara end of Hassi Messaoud.

Debre originally had been scheduled to spend the night in Algiers. The change of plans may have been made to avoid demonstrations by Right-Wing European settlers of Algeria, who accuse the government of sending Algerian troops across the border.



## Kaiser Steel Committee Member Discusses Labor Disputes, Strikes

Many problems arising in labor disputes do not lend themselves to traditional handling and new mechanisms are needed in industry to resolve the problem, Dr. John Dunlop, Harvard University professor and member of Kaiser Steel's Labor Relations Committee, said Friday night.

Dunlop's address at Kolling Auditorium was sponsored by ABUS (Alumni and Industrial Relations Center).

Strikes have a major adverse effect on the economy. The strike is usually predicted, and profits are made ahead of time to compensate for time lost later on, Dunlop said.

The country needs a greater appreciation of legislation, he said, for there appears to be a desire for passing laws when ever something seems to go wrong. It is usually the unintended consequences of legislation that come to the forefront ten years later.



**Newspaper Man Gets Bahama Spot**

LONDON (AP) — Lord Beaverbrook has sold his winter home at Nassau, Bahamas, to Lord Kemsley, once a rival newspaper magnate. Beaverbrook's Sunday Express reported. The price, it said, was \$3,000 pounds (\$20,400). The paper added that Beaverbrook intends to spend more of his future winters in his native Canada.

Hereditary characteristics, the researcher pointed out, are controlled by submicroscopic particles called genes.

A person may carry a gene that causes a hereditary disease without being affected by it. This is called a recessive gene.

When two such persons marry each other, there is one chance in four that any given child will be affected.

There is also one chance in four that the child will be completely free of the defect.





## Hydrogen Rocket Fueled Engine Tested

### Successful Trial Opens Door To New Space Achievements

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Pentagon disclosed Sunday that the nation's first rocket engine fueled with liquid hydrogen has been test fired successfully.

The huge engine, in the XLR-115 version of power, the vented cone, vertical shape, is modified Atlas booster.

It can well power an upper stage of Saturn, the booster that will be used to place 45,000 pound satellites in orbit 300 miles above the Earth, or send a 12,000 pound space probe to Venus or Mars.

The sound testing was conducted at the Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Plant near West Palm Beach, Fla.

Development of the engine was started by the Air Force. The project now has been turned over to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

NASA and the Defense Department permitted Charles Roeke, general manager of the Florida plant, to announce that experimental models of the engine have

1. Operated for several minutes at a time, starting and running under simulated conditions of outer space.

2. Achieved the engine's rated thrust of 15,000 pounds.

3. Delivered a specific impulse more than 30 percent greater than current kerosene-fueled rocket engines. Spec. impulse is the standard measure of a rocket engine's thrust per pound of propellant put out of time.

Roeke said the work thus far shows that there is no technical obstacle that might limit the size of a hydrogen engine of similar design.

The new quarters are located on the first floor of the recently constructed MSU office building, 1445 South Harrison Road.


The new facilities include four service windows, private conference rooms, and a spacious lobby and waiting room to serve the rapidly growing membership now totaling 5,300.


Twice a year he will write the text for a folder of materials mailed to over 20,000 Latin teachers.

## Geography Lab Considered

A joint field laboratory for geography students is being considered by the Big 10 universities and the University of Chicago, reported Lawrence Sommers, head of the geography department.

Preliminary plans for establishment of the laboratory in the summer of 1960 were made by geographers from the universities at a recent meeting at Monticello, Ill.

Although MSU has a laboratory at the Kellogg Gull Lake Biological Station, a satellite that will remain fixed in space at a certain point above the earth, the advantages of hydrogen power are apparent," Roeke said.

one geography department could hope to provide," Sommers said.

The Gull Lake Station is the kind of facility that the Big 10 universities would like to have, Sommers said.

Facilities for housing students and staff are available, leaving the staff of housekeeping to concentrate on teaching.

Another advantage of the Gull Lake Station is its proximity to the various environments which the student geographer studies. It is located in relatively wild country, near urban-Battle Creek and farm country.

This gives the geographer an opportunity to study people living under a variety of conditions, said Sommers.

The most important facet of the proposed joint laboratory is that it would bring large numbers of geographers together for the exchange of ideas and information, he added.

A committee made up of one member from each of the 10 participating universities has been formed to solve several remaining problems, including the selection of a site, Sommers said.

The Monticello conference was sponsored by the Committee on Institutional Cooperation of the Council of PPs and the University of Chicago and financed by the Carnegie Corporation.


