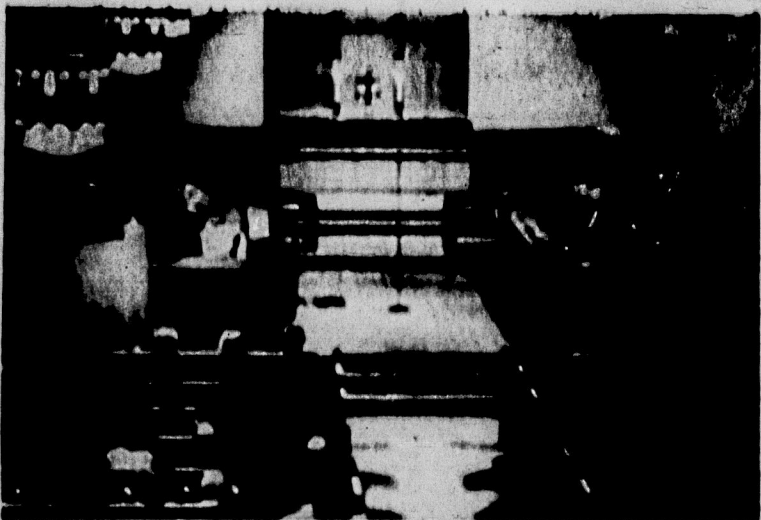

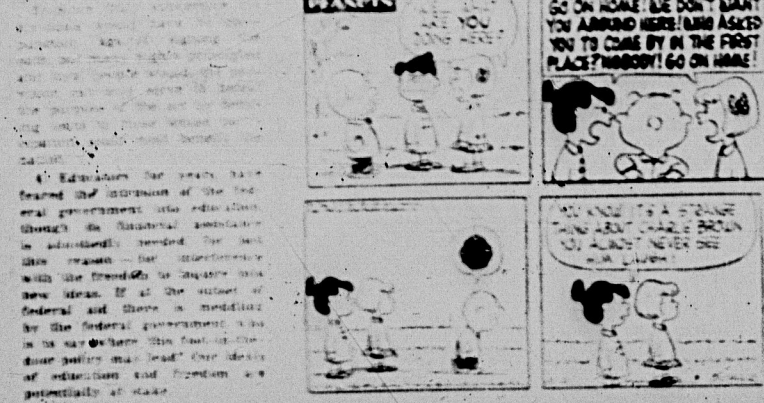

Michigan Expects Skiers!

At least 1500,000 skiers are expected to make an average of three trips each to Michigan ski centers this winter — they will spend some \$15 million in the process, the state's travel experts estimate. In 1953, a total of 38 areas catered to some 65,000 skiers. This season the number of areas has almost doubled, dotting Michigan from the far reaches of the upper peninsula in the north to the fringes of metropolitan Detroit.

Michigan ski slopes range from 300 to 6,000 feet. The longest is at Boyne Mountain in the northwestern lower peninsula.

La. Voters Shun Long In Primary

NEW ORLEANS (AP)—Louisiana voters turned a cold shoulder to hot-tempered Gov. Earl Long in the Democratic first primary election Saturday.

Instead, they selected for a second primary runoff two bitter foes of the rambunctious governor—Mayor, Deleesse Morrison of New Orleans and one-time Gov. Jimmie Davis, the country music crooner.

The state constitution barred the 64-year-old Long from reelection, so he ran for lieutenant governor.

He stood third with 85 per cent of the vote reported, 11,000 votes behind the leader, "Taddy" Aycock of Franklin, Davis backed Aycock.

Morrison himself beat a 5-1 lead over Davis with 95 per cent of the state's precincts counted—261,468 to 194,995.

The showdown for governor comes Jan. 9, since neither Morrison nor Davis polled a majority of the total vote.

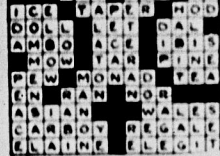

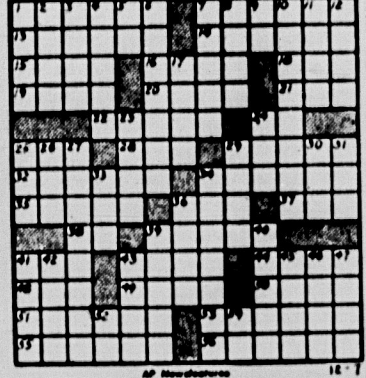

Prof Modifies Gene Idea At Convention

While the "survival of the fittest" theory generally holds true, less fit humans often do very well.

They tend to survive because of rather than in spite of their hereditary defects, according to Dr. George Williams.

He presented this as a minor modification of Charles Darwin's theory to the Society for the Study of Evolution, meeting in conjunction with the Darwin Centennial celebration.

The assistant professor of natural science explained that parents often have a strong urge to replace a child who dies.

If the death was caused by a hereditary defect, the second child may also carry the same defect but be unaffected by it.

The second child may therefore pass on the defect to the next generation, Williams reasons.

Hereditary characteristics, the researcher pointed out, are controlled by submicroscopic particles called genes.

A person may carry a gene that causes a hereditary disease without being affected by it. This is called a recessive gene.

When two such persons marry each other, there is one chance in four that any given child will be affected.

There is also one chance in four that the child will be completely free of the defect.

Says 'Wouldn't Exclude' Idea

Stevenson Might Take Office

NEW YORK (AP)—Adlai Stevenson Sunday gave a qualified "yes" to the question of whether he would accept an appointment as secretary of state in a Democratic administration.

The former Illinois governor, twice defeated candidate for President, said however his decision would be based upon whether his own ideas and that of a democratic president were similar on foreign policy.

"I would not exclude the possibility of serving my country in any capacity, and that is my honest opinion," he said.

Commenting on President Eisenhower's retreat trip abroad, Stevenson said such trips should be used sparingly, for great emergencies.

"Just because (Soviet Premier) Khrushchev travels around the world, it is not necessarily good for our President to do the same thing," Stevenson said.

On the current birth control controversy, Stevenson said: "If foreign countries want to do something about the problem, it is not our role to tell them what to do but to entertain requests for aid as we entertain requests from foreign countries for aid in building highways or economic aid."

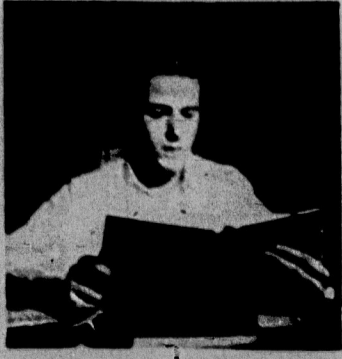

State Cagers Beat Notre Dame In Overtime Clutch Performance

Extra Period Points Made By Gowens

The Michigan State Spartans rallied in the last 32 seconds of Saturday's game against Notre Dame in Jemison Fieldhouse to score three points and force the game into overtime.

In the five minute overtime the Spartans edged out the Irish 21-20 to win the game.

Spartan coach, Frank Anderson, called it the best and worst game he had seen since he's been here.

He stated that it was the best example of clutch playing he had ever witnessed but on the whole, the team performance was poor.

MSU trailed throughout the first half by margining up to six points. With 20 seconds left in the first half, Art Clowers tied at 23-all on a foul shot.

Steve Fabe stole the ball and scored on a lay-up. Then Bill Walker got a point for the Spartans on a foul on Howard Walker.

The Spartans had made 10 of 31 attempts for a low 32 percent average, while the Irish had scored on 11 of 27 for a 41 percent average.

Ski Season Begins

Michigan's 1959-60 ski season will soon be underway with 23 winter sports areas in operation.

Michigan is the number one winter sports state in the Rockies with resorts spread from the suburbs of Detroit to the wilderness of the Upper Peninsula.

Usually the season is in full swing by the first of January when snow piles deep over hill-sides, but areas with artificial snow machines are in operation by early December.

Six new ski areas are scheduled to open this year, two in the Lower Peninsula. Snow machines will be in operation at nine of the ski centers, assuring a long season and more reliable conditions.

Over 100,000 skiers are expected to spend some \$15,000,000 in Michigan's ski resorts this winter.

In addition to skiing, many resorts offer toboggan runs, skating rinks, ice fishing, ice boating, and hunting.

"I feel more at ease," Ozybko said. "I've always played defense, and you learn a lot of tricks that you can't change overnight."

State won't be losing any defensive strength, Ozybko does a good job, said Bessone.

The Spartans are in good shape for the series with Colorado. They have been working on the offensive play. Goal tender Elton VanSoybrook has been improving with every practice, Bessone said.

DETROIT (AP) - The Detroit Lions broke out of a season-long slumber Sunday and blasted the Chicago Cardinals 45-21 before 43,811 fans, the smallest home crowd in nearly seven seasons.

The Lions got their sputtering offense moving early on Cardinal mistakes and scored in every period. Only once before the season have the Lions been able to score more than two touchdowns.

But they banged out in front Sunday by capitalizing on a rash of Cardinal fumbles, and rolled on with their most productive offense in 18 national football league games.

This battle of division tail-enders gave the Lions their third triumph in 11 starts and the Cardinals their ninth defeat in 11 games.

He passed for one touchdown and ran for another before turning the reins over to Earl Morrill and Jerry Reichow. Hydrogen Rocket Fueled Engine Tested

Successful Trial Opens Door To New Space Achievements

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Pentagon disclosed Sunday that the nation's first rocket engine fueled with liquid hydrogen has been test fired successfully.

The first engine is the XLR-45, designed to power the central stage of a modified Atlas rocket.

It will power an upper stage of Saturn, the booster that will be used to place 35,000 pound satellites in orbit 300 miles above the Earth or send a 12,000 pound space probe to Venus or Mars.

The latest testing was conducted at the 17001 A. Wright Aircraft Plant near West Palm Beach, Fla.

Development of the engine was started by the Air Force. The project now has been turned over to the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

NASA and the Defense Department permitted Charles H. Rouse, general manager of the Florida plant, to announce that experimental models of the engine have

1. Operated for several minutes at a full starting and running under simulated conditions of outer space.

2. Achieved the engine's rated thrust of 15,000 pounds.

3. Produced a specific impulse more than 30 per cent greater than current kerosene-fueled rocket engines. Specific impulse is the standard measure of a rocket engine's thrust per pound of propellant per unit of time.

Rouse said the work thus far shows that there is no technical obstacle that might limit the size of a hydrogen engine of similar design.

He added that the engine "has demonstrated performance which opens new fields of achievement for missiles and space vehicles."

"The extreme high energy of liquid hydrogen promises substantially to increase the payload, instruments and passengers by as much as 3 1/2 times. Similarly, he said:

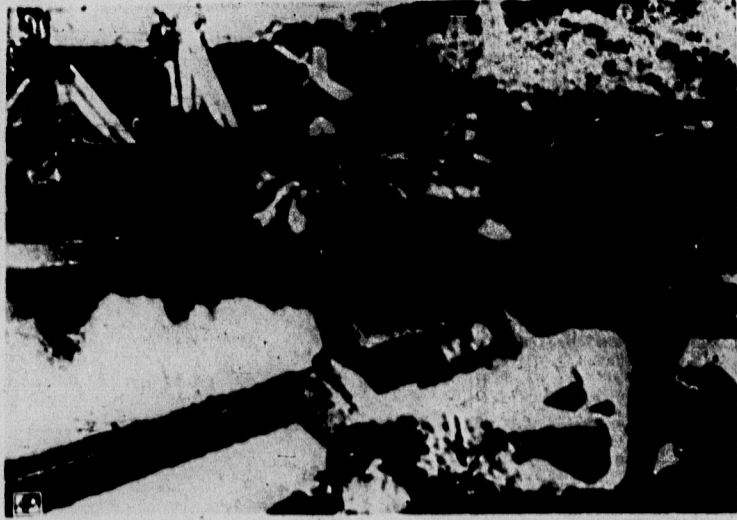
1. If a hydrogen second stage were added to a current R-VM, such as the Atlas, it would more than double the payload or increase the range.

2. The payload of a current two-stage R-VM such as the Titan could be doubled if the second stage were converted to hydrogen fuel.

3. Three hydrogen stages in a rocket could do the same job as two conventional liquid oxygen-kerosene and two hydrogen stages, thereby eliminating the need of one stage.

4. The use of hydrogen stages would yield a payload more than 3 1/2 times that possible with four conventional stages.

"For the space mission of placing a satellite in 24-hour orbit—that is, a satellite that will remain fixed in space at a certain point above the earth—the advantages of hydrogen power are apparent," Rouse said.

Big 10 Universities Geography Lab Considered

A joint field laboratory for geography students is being considered by the Big 10 universities and the University of Chicago, reports Dr. Lawrence Sommers, head of the geography department.

Preliminary plans for establishment of the laboratory in the summer of 1961 were made by geographers from the universities at a recent meeting at Monticello, Ill.

Although MSU has a laboratory at the Kellogg Gull Lake Biological Station, cooperation in a joint laboratory would give out-of-state and other graduate students a wider coverage of specialized field training than any

one geography department could hope to provide, Sommers said.

The Gull Lake Station is the kind of facility that the Big 10 universities would like to have, Sommers said.

Facilities for housing students and staff are available, relieving the staff of housekeeping chores, and allowing them to concentrate on teaching.

Another advantage of the Gull Lake Station is its proximity to the various environments which the student geographer studies.

It is located in relatively wild country, near urban-Battle Creek and farm country.

This gives the geographer an opportunity to study biotic living under a variety of conditions, said Sommers.

The most important facet of the proposed joint laboratory is that it would bring large numbers of geographers together for the exchange of ideas and information, he added.

A committee made up of one member from each of the 10 participating universities has been formed to solve several remaining problems, including the selection of a site, Sommers said.

The Monticello conference was sponsored by the Committee on Institutional Cooperation of the Council of Ten and the University of Chicago and financed by the Carnegie Corporation.

MSU Prof Named as League Head

Is Latin a dead language? Not to William Seaman, professor of classical languages. Dr. Seaman has just been named director of the service bureau of the American Classical League.

It is a non-salaried, extra-curricular job, undertaken in addition to his duties at MSU.

The service bureau's materials include over 600 mimeographed leaflets and printed bulletins, pamphlets and books of interest to Latin teachers—as well as Latin and Greek Christmas cards, Latin calendars, Latin games and many other items. Prices for most materials range from 3 cents to \$1.

As bureau director, Seaman reviews all new materials for publication and revises old materials. He writes the announcements for the publication "Classical Outlook" and proof-reads the entire issue each month. Twice a year he will write the text for a folder of materials mailed to over 20,000 Latin teachers.

Another of his duties is to answer a stream of inquiries from Latin teachers and students relating to the study of the classics. From MSU, he will direct the bureau office at Miami, O., and its three full-time employees.

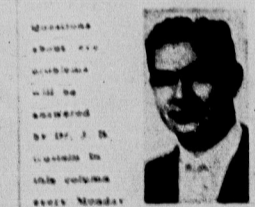

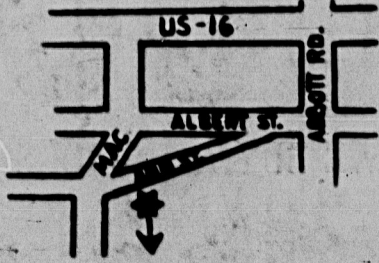
