SUBMIT REPORT OF INSTITUTE'S EXPENDITURES

O. Wilkins, Comptroller, Gives Out List of Disbursements.

AW COMMENDS WORK OF MUSIC INSTITUTE FOR HIGH TYPE OF CONCERTS PRESENT DURING YEAR.

COMPLETE financial statement of the Music Institute concert course for three years that that series has been presented on campus was submitted to the Michigan State News yesterday by Lewis Richards, director of the Institute. This summing up, drawn by G. O. Wilkins, comptroller, shows detailed position made of the student fees paid to the Institute every term for partial support of the college experts that have brought to the stage some of the country's outstanding artists in the past three years.

In an interview with a News representative yesterday, President R. Shaw said regarding the statement: "It is highly commendable that any institution handling public funds make a public accounting of its disposition of those funds. I am much pleased with the type of accounts that the Institute has brought to this campus and judge by the student attendance the student body also appreciates them." In the 1928-1929 season, the first of the course, there was paid to the Institute \$3,589.50 in student fees; for fall terms, \$192 for term, and \$1,109.50 for spring term. Expenses for that season \$3,024, disposed of as follows: \$255 for hall, \$5,100 for art, \$341.30 for advertising, \$220.24 printing, 35 for postage, \$201.65 transfer, and for miscellaneous sum \$153.05. The sum paid to students for their services was arrived at after deducting \$850 representing special discounts given the students as an educational institu-

tion.

Freshman, Sophomore Classes to Blame for Slight of Custom.

Are Michigan State time honored traditions, except Douglas Carruthers president of the Student Council, expressing the viewpoint of many who say that observance of certain customs is on the wane?

It is true that instances of such traditions occur many times a day and instead of the instances lessening in number they are increasing. The faults for the state of affairs lie largely on the shoulders of the freshman and sophomore classes. It is the duty of the freshmen to follow tradition, as closely as possible, and the duty of the sophomore class to see that they do.

Michigan State traditions follow:

1. All freshman men shall wear a coat buttoned at all times and shall never appear in public otherwise attired.
2. All freshman men shall wear a coat buttoned at all times and shall never appear in public otherwise attired.

3. Freshmen are not permitted to be seen with a coed or any girl on the streets of East Lansing.

4. Freshmen shall never remain seated on a street car or in a house where upperclassmen are standing.

5. The privilege of wearing a matriculation derby hat and cap is denied exclusively to the senior.

6. Freshmen are to be in their room by 7 p.m.

7. The barbecue is the cessation of hostilities for the winter months, but this does not mean that freshmen are anything more than freshmen.

8. No one smokes on the campus within the bounds of Grand River Avenue, Farm Lane, the Red Cedar River, and Michigan Avenue, except in the Union. It was announced that officers of the Council would be elected at the meeting of May 5.

College traditions were discussed and a movement toward more drastic enforcement began. Douglas Carruthers president made known the administrative decision that only sophomore classes would be excused from the Memorial Day recess.

May 14 was set as the date for nominating officers in the three lower classes. Separate meetings of each group will be held and nominating will be done from the floor as has been the custom in the past.

10. Spartan students shall not run across the lawns, use the sidewalks.

11. Member of all classes, peak week they meet students on the campus. The underclassmen are requested to do this.

12. Sophomore men shall at all times wear a hat or cap.

Central State Nine Here Saturday

KOBSEN DISPOSE OF HOPE COLLEGE TEAM EASILY; 10-2 THURSDAY; MCASLIN PITCHES

Spartan Stickers Find Hitting Eyes at Expense of Dutchmen; Pounce on Visiting Hurler for 17 Hits; Revamped Lineup Used With Captain Gibbs at Third.

WITH THE HOPE COLLEGE GAME SAFELY IN THE BAG, the Michigan State baseball team meets Central State of Mt. Pleasant Saturday afternoon at 3:30 o'clock in the second engagement of the week. Coach John H. Kohs is expected to start Berwyn Pemberton, a sophomore left-hander, on the mound against the Teachers Saturday. "Berwyn pitched one game on the southern training trip and turned back Xavier university handily."

Jerry McCaslin, another sophomore, started his first game as pitcher against Hope Thursday afternoon and got by in good shape. He allowed only two hits in seven innings. He was relieved by Pemberton, who let the Wooden Shoes down without a safety in the last two frames. McCaslin's forte is a smoke ball, but he appeared to have developed a good change of pace and an effective curve.

Only a handful of fans braved the chilly blasts to see the Spartans score their expected victory over the Dutchmen to the tune of 10 to 2. Two big innings, with five runs scored in each frame, was all State needed to swamp Hope. The Spartans pounced on Poppink, visiting hurler, for 17 hits during the game.

Coach Kohs had a good opportunity to experiment with his lineup Thursday. Capt. Eddie Gibbs was covering third base and did a satisfactory job, although he showed in experience on some occasions. Five Spartan substitutes were used and State played the last two innings with an entire lineup of second-year men, with the exception of Captain Gibbs who remained at the hot corner to gain fielding experience. He was a star outfielder last season and took over some pitching duties the early part of this season. It now appears likely that he may solve the third base problem this year and strengthen the infield. He is fast on his feet and has a splendid throwing arm.

Spart in Second

The Spartans found their hitting eyes against Poppink. Captain Gibbs led the hitting attack with four hits in five trips to the plate including a home run, the first of the home season. Johnny Gartner, sophomore outfielder, whose punch double won the game with V. P. M. Normal last week, got three safeties, including a triple in four times at bat and John Madona, shortstop, matched this performance.

The first inning was scoreless, although State threatened seriously. Bligher and L. Japina fanned out and Spoelstra fanned for Hope. Cuthbertson and Madona opened the Spartan bottom order by going out in order. Captain Gibbs beat out an infield roller for a safety. Abe Elowitz drew base on balls, but "Jabber" Barnard fanned out to end the inning and leave two State players on base.

State went on a spree of five runs in the second inning. McCaslin struck out Nordin, the first Dutchman to face him this frame. Poppink fled out to Alton Kircher, in right field. Freeman held his arm in front of one of McCaslin's slow balls and was sent to first base. Van Hartama fanned. Gartner opened for State with a resounding triple to center field. Green fanned, but Kircher scored Gartner with a single to left field. McCaslin struck out. "Chum" Cuthbertson connected for a "Texas leaguer" to center field and Kircher scampered home after stealing second. Madona singled to center field, scoring Cuthbertson, who stole second. Captain Gibbs smashed out a home run far over the center fielder's head and Madona came home ahead of him. Elowitz beat out a roller to Poppink, but was left stranded when Barnard grounded out to Freeman.

The third inning was scoreless. The Wooden Shoes were retired in order. Gartner drove out a single for State, but Green, Kircher and McCaslin went out.

Two safeties, the only hits of the game, and a boot by McCaslin ended Hope to push across two runs in the fourth. L. Japina rolled out. Spoelstra dropped a short fly just over Elowitz' head and went to third on Nordin's single to right field over first base. Poppink grounded to McCaslin, but the State pitcher threw wild to first and Spoelstra scored. Freeman was safe on Gibbs' fielder's choice of his grounder. Nordin scored when Gibbs threw Van Hartama out at first. Kruizenga grounded out to halt the Hope rally.

Repeat in Fourth
