### Driver Training Possible Cure

## Traffic Solutions Advanced

Mandatory driving education for all drivers in Michigan was one of the solutions to the traffic problem advanced at the Municipal Judges Conference Jan. 21-22 at MSU.

Speaking on a panel discussing "Corrective Penalties" at the Kellogg Center seminar, were State Police Commissioner Judge Cyril Childs, Municipal Judge O. Donald Danford of Traverse City, and Dr. William Mann of the Highway Traffic Safety Center.

Commissioner Childs pointed out the gravity of the situation, and the necessity for positive action.

Each year, more persons are killed in traffic than by all forms of homicide," he said. "More persons are maimed than in all forms of assault cases, and the financial loss due to accidents is greater than the total sum of all law-enforcing, collecting and other traffic.

In the light of this serious problem, the penalties should be levied and fair not only to the individual but to the people whose lives are in jeopardy. The penalty should prevent any driver from violating again.

Using even tougher, Dr. Mann advocated a compulsory driver education program for all drivers in an attempt to stop accidents before they happen.

This program, he suggested, could be put into effect over a three-year period by requiring motorists to take the driver safety education course when they renew their licenses.

One of the greatest causes of violations and accidents, Mann declared, was simply a lack of knowledge and driving skill. Most drivers do not know how to drive.

Judge Danford supported Mann's conclusions. A survey of driving records in Traverse City over a five-year period, he noted, disclosed that there were twice as many violations and accidents in the 10-15 age group as there were among the teen-agers who had taken driver education in school.



### Vets' Programs Balance Shown in Budget Request

The Veterans Administration budget request for fiscal year 1961 reflects a relative balance between expanding and including Veterans Benefit Programs.

This was reported last week by Summer Whittier, Administrator of Veterans Affairs, in response to questions resulting from the presentation of the President's Annual Budget Message to Congress.

The total VA Budget request for the new fiscal year is \$3,487,000,000. This request presented for consideration by Congress and the House and Senate Appropriations Committees, includes an increase of \$120,000,000 over the \$3,367,000,000 appropriated in fiscal year 1960.

At the beginning of the fiscal year, 1960, the VA had 2,200,000 veterans and dependents in the pension rolls, including some 277,000 widows and children expected to become eligible under provisions of a new pension bill enacted into law last August.

On the other hand, Whittier said, the estimated total requirements in the field of readjustment benefits, GI Loans, GI Training, etc. will be \$175 million dollars less than the current year.

Because of a declining workshop forecast which current trends indicate to be realistic, Chief among these is an estimated decrease of about 100,000 in the number of Korean Conflict Veterans in Exceptional Rehabilitation and Education Programs.

The readjustment benefits requests in the New Budget are \$440 million, compared with \$885 million a year ago. General Operating Expenses have been reduced more than \$12 million as a result of reduced workloads, and management economy, including the application of automatic data processing equipment in VA GI Insurance Program.

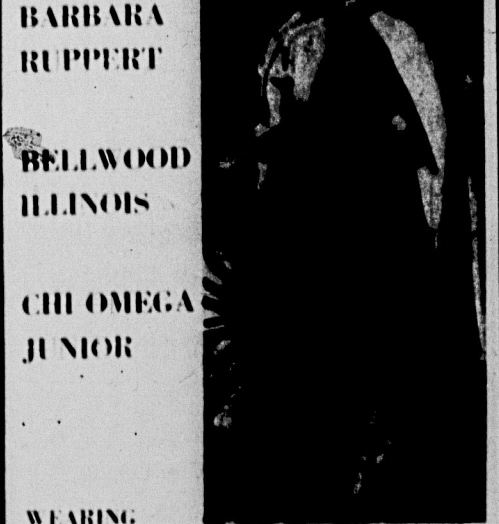
### Grants to Qualified Students Available
