### Revised Course

## Students Okay Comm Skills

THE PROPOSAL to change the date of spring term commencement and subsequent shortening of spring term will be voted upon Monday at the academic senate meet ing. The proposal, suggested by Mortar Board, Excalibur and Senior Council, was tayorably recommended by academic counat its January meeting.

Under the terms of the proposal, com-mencement would be held after final exams, Sunday, June 12, instead of June 5, as now scheduled. This would necessitate a revision of spring term finals; they would begin Monday, June 6, and conclude Saturday. June 11. Spring term, in other words, would

he shortened one week.

The revamping of spring term provides a olution to the well-known and often-voiced complaint that commencement, coming before final exams, loses much of its meaning. There is little time for traditional graduation revelry when a student knows he must cram commencement ceremonies into a day immediately proceeding final exams. For who wants to hit the books the minute after he is granted the feeling of being free? And if a student should be unfortun ate enough to fail a subject he would have gone through the ceremonies for naught.

BY HAVING commencement after finals the ceremonies would assume an additional meaning for graduates; they would have the campus to themselves for "their" day, as they rightly should. Commencement would again be for the graduates, their friends and families, with few undergraduates "hanging around."

It is true, that by shortening spring term valuable class hours would be sacrificed. held by the stude However, we feel students could make up—State University.

wasted and instructors could easily utilize these days for additional lectures.

Eventually, if the proposal is adopted, and we strongly urge academic senate to do so Monday, a basic calendar change will be necessary. Several suggestions have been recommended, including one to begin fall term earlier in September and end the term before Thanksgiving, and begin winter term in December.

Provost Paul Miller, chairman of the fac-ulty committee which drafted the proposal, has arged passage of the bill and foresees no opposition to it. The State News feels the proposal is an excellent solution to the spring term dilemma. The few obstacles it presents can be easily overcome by faculty and student cooperation.

# Asks Open Mind on ROTC

ON MONDAY some months' controversy over compulsory ROTC will undergo an important step toward final resolution when the academic senate votes on the issue

Now that the cooling effect of time has intervened in the hot discussions that filled the campus air last spring, I think it is fit ting to take another look at the basic issues involved.

While I remain overwhelmingly in favor of the voluntary system I am not fanatical about it adoption. The important thing at this time is that the senate, and later the Board of Trustees, examine the alterna tives calmly, with an open mind. Possibly there is a third or more alternative that would be better in the interests of the uni-

THE DECISION that is finally rendered about the future of ROTC is not really important. The factor of primary importance has already been demonstrated. That such an issue can be raised and freely discussed is basic to the spirit of freedom and democ racy on which a modern university is built

So long as such discussion and action is possible, we need have no serious concern about the continued growth and improvement of the university. To those in opposi-tion of change I hold no malice or ill-feeling

whatsoever. I know they are sincere in their beliefs, and I affirm their rights to such beliefs. I disagree with them and will attack their arguments in support of their position, but not their right to differ or to attack my arguments in the same manner wherever they find the opportunity.

WHATEVER the fate of compulsory ROTC, the important issue has been decided by the very fact that ROTC has been subjected to careful scrutiny by the highest echelons of the university faculty and administration, I trust in their decision as honest, responsible men, and know whatever they do will be the best course for the

university as they see it.

If I am somewhat short of words this morning, that is probably all to the good. I generally fill my comments with a surfeit supererogatory hootnanny, non sequi-

At any rate, I feel that everything worth saying about compulsory ROTC has already said. Reiteration will serve only to beat fruitlessly upon eardrums which are sorely pressed.

I stand in favor of the voluntary system, and urge its judges only to be thorough and painstaking in their examination of its merits and disadvantages in light of pres-






